

IN THE 64TH ANNIVERSARY OF UNIVERSITAS HASANUDDIN, DEPARTMENT OF OCCUPATIONAL & HEALTH SAFETY HELD INTERNATIONAL WEBINAR

Department of Occupational Health and Safety (OHS), Faculty of Public Health, Universitas Hasanuddin (UNHAS) held an international webinar on "The best practices in Occupational Health and safety at the workplace in the time of Covid-19 pandemic". The webinar was conducted on Wednesday, 8 July 2020, and attended by around 800 participants.

The International Webinar was officially opened by the Rector of UNHAS, Prof. Dr. Dwia Aries Tina Pulubuhu, MA. In her remarks, Prof. Dwia gave an appreciation for the Faculty of Public Health as the organizing committee for the celebration of the 64th anniversary of Universitas Hasanuddin for organizing the webinar on the strategic topic in dealing with the new normal phase, specifically for workers who have to prioritize the OHS in the workplace during the pandemic crisis. Prof. Dwia said that the pandemic has provided

momentum to reorganize all work behaviors, patterns, and interaction models. This has become an important event to provide information to the public regarding work safety in the new normal". The Dean of Faculty of Public Health, Dr. Aminuddin Syam, SKM, M. Kes, in his welcome remarks stated: "it is the duty of Department of Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) to provide an understanding of the safety protocols for workers in carrying out productive

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activities during the pandemic. This is crucial to be understood".

The webinar presented three speakers: Drg. Kartini Rustandi, M. Kes (Director of Occupational Health and sports, Ministry of Health of Indonesia), TS. Dr. Ismaniza Ismail (Malaysian Industrial Hygiene Association and senior lecturer in The faculty of Gunaan Science, JARA University of Technology, Malaysia) and Dr. Furqaan Naiem, M. Sc., Ph.D. (Lecturer in the Department of OHS, Faculty of Public Health, Universitas Hasanuddin.

Dr. Ismaniza Ismail shared the best practice from experiences in Covid-19 prevention in the workplace

in Malaysia and Drg. Kartini Rustandi, M. Kes presented the Health protocols as the basis for adaptation in the new normal.

Dr. Furqan Naim pointed out the role of OHS practitioners and experts in cutting the spread of Covid-19 at the workplace. The Webinar was led by Yahya

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RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT CENTRE FOR DISASTER STUDY OF UNIVERSITAS HASANUDDIN TAKES PART IN INTERNATIONAL COLLABORATIVE RESEARCH



Research and Development Centre for Disaster Study of UNHAS is one of the research centers in the Institute for Research and Community Service (LP2M) consisting of 6 working groups (Pokja) namely the Infrastructure and Spatial Working Group, Geo-Working Group research and Database, Training and Publication, External Relations, Health and Post-Disaster Recovery, Pre-Disaster Social and Economic Working Group. Through this Disaster Research Center, Unhas is involved in the collaborative research program Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) - Indonesia Research Alliance (MIRA) which researchers from Indonesia will partner with professors and researchers from MIT in developing some strategic research in the fields of energy, biotechnology, economics, health, and transportation. The MIT-Indonesia Seed Fund amounting to a maximum of 100,000 USD is given to a research group consisting of one MIT researcher who partners with one or more Indonesian researchers who will be used for a collaborative trip, initial expandable, visiting student/research, and for initial preparation of proposals research. To be involved in this program, every State University with Legal Entity (PTN-BH) in Indonesia sends researchers and their

research results to the Ministry of Research, Technology, and Higher Education, for selection.


The Head of Research and Development Centre for Disaster Study Universitas Hasanuddin, Prof. Dr. Eng. Ir. Adi Maulana, ST., M. Phil. becomes one of the Unhas delegates for this program. Prof. Adi collaborate with Prof. Oliver Jagoutz (Lead PI MIT - USA) in conducting research related to the environment and climate with the title "What Controls Earths Long-Term Climate?". Through this research, Prof. Adi wants to explain what controls the Earth's long-term climate.

The MIRA program designed by the Ministry of Research and Technology aims to build long-term research collaboration in improving research quality, as well as providing a significant impact on the progress of Higher Education research. In the process, Indonesian researchers conduct direct communication with MIT professors at the MIT campus of the United States so that the objectives and stages of research implementation can be coordinated well.

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INTERNATIONAL WEBINAR HELD BY FACULTY OF PHARMACY UNIVERSITAS HASANUDDIN DISCUSSED THE PHARMACOGENOMIC CHALLENGES AND OPPORTUNITIES



Faculty of Pharmacy of Universitas Hasanuddin conducted the fourth webinar with the theme "Pharmacogenomics in Obstetrics Pharmacy: Challenges and Opportunities". This webinar invited Nur Aizati Athira Daud, Ph.D. (Lecturer in Clinical Pharmacy, University of Science Malaysia). Followed by approximately 200 participants, the webinar took place at 10:00 pm virtually through the zoom meeting application and live streaming on the Faculty of Pharmacy YouTube Channel, Friday (03/07).

On this occasion, Nur Aizati Athira Daud, Ph.D explained about pharmacogenomic opportunities and challenges. Starting her explanation, she explained the difference between pharmacogenomics and pharmacogenetics which are often considered uninterchangeable. Nur said that pharmacogenetics is a study of variations in the characteristics of DNA and RNA in relation to the drug responses to users. Along with the development of the human genome program

or the Human Genome Project and genetic analysis technology to identify a gene that can cause disease has made genetic science a new era in the medical scope.

Merging genes and pharmacology creates new studies called pharmacogenomics. This science aims to develop rational ways by optimizing the use of drugs adapted to the patient's genotype. This is managed to ensure efficiency and minimize the side effects of the drugs used.

As a new science, the use of pharmacogenomics in medicine will facilitate the discovery and development of new drugs properly so that it will have an impact to reduce patient treatment costs. However, this still needs to be tested and evaluated to determine its convenience.

The event was hosted on July 9, 2020, by the Collaborative Australia-Indonesia Program on Sustainable Development and Climate Change (CAIPSDCC), a collaboration between the University of Indonesia and Griffith University, Australia.


The invited speakers in the event included Prof. Brendan Mackey, Director, Griffith Climate Change Response Program (GCRP), Griffith University; Prof. Jan Sopaheluwakan, Coordinator, Research Center for Earth Sciences and Disaster, Institute for Sustainable Earth and Resources (I-SER), Universitas Indonesia; Prof. Jamaluddin Jompa, the Dean of the Graduate School of Hasanuddin University, and Advisor on Marine Ecology to the Minister of Marine Affairs and Fisheries of Indonesia.

Prof. Jamaluddin Jompa in his speech explained that Indonesia is the center of three important ecosystems in the world: coral reefs, mangroves, and seagrass. Indonesia has the richest marine biodiversity in the world. However, it is common to see the area that is rich in biodiversity has a poor population. This is happening in small island communities in the Eastern part of Indonesia too. "We need to not only protect biodiversity but also the people in a way that supports their well-being. When people are not protected, we can't ensure the protection of our ecosystems. We can use good science, technology, and database to provide information and innovation for policymakers and other stakeholders in making decisions that benefit both the biodiversity and the people", said Prof. Jompa.


