FACULTY OF DENTISTRY OF UNHAS HOSTED A GUEST LECTURE PRESENTING EXPERT WITNESS IN FORENSICS FROM AUSTRALIA



Obligations of a Forensic Expert: The good, the bad and the ugly.

The Faculty of Dentistry of Universitas Hasanuddin (FKG Unhas) held a Visiting Lecture program on the topic "Forensic Expert Obligation: The Good, The Bad and The Ugly". FKG Unhas invited an Expert Witness in Forensics, Dr. Meiya Sutisno, BSc. (Hons), Ph.D. (Med) from Sydney, Australia.

The activity was carried out virtually using the Zoom meeting application starting at 09.00 on Monday (11/4). The activity was officially opened by the Dean, drg. Muh. Ruslin, M.Kes., Ph.D., Sp.BM(K).

In his speech, Prof. Ruslin expressed his gratitude and appreciation for the presence of expert resource persons who shared information, knowledge, and experience in their field

Starting the activity, Peter Sahelangi, drg., Sp.OF (K), DFM Senior Supt (Ret), (Sub-Department of Forensics and Medicine, Faculty of Medicine & Dentistry, Universitas Hasanuddin) gave an explanation regarding facial reconstruction procedures and Superimposition Identification with the method identification which is an investigative tool to generate potential identities for victims of mass disasters.

In each case, it requires routine methods of primary identification such as fingerprinting, DNA analysis, and comparison of dental records.

"The Indonesian National Police has formed a Disaster Victim Investigation (DVI) team that uses Craniofacial



reconstruction and superimposition to investigate and identify living and dead victims. Like in several suicide bombing cases in Indonesia," explained Peter.

In identifying victims, it is very necessary to have good coordination between the DVI team and the investigative officers, starting from the scene of the incident. The main needs of the DVI Indonesia team are doctors and dentists trained in the Interpol DVI SOP.

Dr. Meiya Sutisno, BSc. (Hons), Ph.D. (Med)., further explained the evidence of the Ancient Egyptian mummification process related to changes in body position by identifying through morphological analysis in forensic investigations. Identification is carried out on the face in detail from the shape of the facial skeleton to the shape of the ears.

Furthermore, Dr. Meiya Sutisno, also explained the role of expert witnesses in each trial testimony procedure. "The job of an expert witness is to provide evidence that is relevant and impartial in his area of expertise while remaining free from bias or conflict of interest," Meiya said.

After the presentation of the presenters, it was followed by a discussion and question and answer session which was attended by around 300 participants, including those from the Faculty of Dentistry, Unhas.

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FIVE STUDY PROGRAMS OF THE FACULTY OF ENGINEERING RECEIVE ASIIN INTERNATIONAL **ACCREDITATION**

Five Study Programs at the Faculty of Engineering, Universitas Hasanuddin have once again received international accreditation from ASIIN (Akkreditierungsagentur für Studiengänge der Ingenieurwissenschaften, der Informatik, der Naturwissenschaften und der Mathematik).

The announcement was directly issued by the ASIIN Secretariat in Germany on Thursday (07/04).

The aforementioned study programs are all undergraduate study programs (S1) as listed below:

- S1 Informatics Engineering Study Program,
- S1 Urban and Regional Planning Study Program,
- S1 Marine Engineering Study Program,
- SI Mining Engineering Study Program, and
- S1 Industrial Engineering Study Program.

Dr. Ir. Prastawa Budi, M.Sc., as the Head of the Institute for Quality Assurance and Educational Development (LPMPP), explained in an interview that the achievements of the five study programs are all due to the good preparation and experience of Unhas in preparing those study programs for international accreditation.

Actually, there were 18 study programs involved in the ASIIN accreditation assessment process. However, only five of them were given the assess-

Each study program involved in ASIIN accreditation has met curriculum standards and has a good track record, such as obtaining an accreditation issued by BAN-PT or LAM-PTKes.

"All study programs proposed in the visitation process have met the standards, one of which is that the curriculum applied is directed to the

Successfully obtaining this achievement is part of a harmonious and synergistic collaboration between the university team and study programs in preparing the Self-Assessment Report (SAR)

Sharing knowledge between team members is very effective which was conducted through FGDs at the early stage of the preparation to share opinions regarding the SAR preparation

Dr. Prastawa hopes that the five study programs that have succeeded in gaining international accreditation can maintain and improve the quality of education services. It is also necessary to expand global networks, one of which is by opening international classes or double degree programs with other university partners.

Dr. Prastawa said that LPMPP has regularly and in-depth prepared training for lecturers to assist in the process of planning, implementing, and evaluating classroom learning. Quality lecturers certainly have an impact on quality outcomes as

"Being able to fulfill the ASIIN criteria means that the study program is considered to have met ASIIN and ESG standards or the European Standard Guideline, which further means the learning process applied has been in accordance with the quality standards of European universities. Thus, there is a great opportunity to establish partnerships with various European universities," added Dr. Prastawa.

ASIIN is an international accrediting agency originating from Germany for the disciplines of engineering, mathematics, science, agriculture, and biology. ASIIN international accreditation is an Outcome-Based Accreditation.

FACULTY OF NURSING UNIVERSITAS HASANUDDIN HOLDS GUEST LECTURE, PRESENTING SPEAKERS FROM MANCHESTER

Dr Tony Long, BSc (hons), MA, PhD, SRN, RSCN, RNT, Fl Professor of Child & Family Health





Tony works with colleagues to develop novel means of engagement and research with children and young people, especially with a mobile research laboratory. Tony's research is in improving quality of life outcomes for children, young people, and their families.

He works with NHS consultants in fields such as childhood brain tumour, neonatal care, sudden unexpected death in childhood, and emergency medicine, as well as supporting research in young people's mental health. He reviews research grant applications for 21 national funding bodies; has acquired £2.5 million in 43 externally-funded research grants; supervised 21 doctoral students to completion; examined 39 doctoral studies; and published 134 books, chapters, peer-reviewed articles, and research reports.

The Faculty of Nursing (FKep) of Universitas Hasanuddin held a 'Visiting Lecture Series' program inviting guest lecturers from the University of Salford, Manchester, England. The activity took place at 16.00 WITA virtually through the zoom meeting application on Friday (22/04). The Visiting Lecture Series is an effort by the Faculty of Nursing Unhas to reach out to the World Class University.

Unhas opens opportunities for each faculty and study program to increase the number of inbound students and inbound lecturers, as well as to enlarge the number of international partnerships with foreign universities in the field of education and research.

The guest lecturers presented in this visiting lecturer series are listed as follows:

1. Tony Long, Professor of Child & Family, delivering a lecture on Improving outcomes rather than settling for process in research: Being brutally honest with ourselves about what counts as an outcome for children's care 2. Alison Brettle, Professor in Health Information and Evidence-Based Practice; and Director Centre for Social and Health Research. He lectured on the topic of Using digital to help patients manage their own health: potential impacts and challenges.

The Vise Dean for Academics, Research and Innovation, Syahrul Said, S.Kep., Ns., M.Kes., PhD., expressed his appreciation to the Nursing Faculty for holding the event. He hopes that it can encourage more collaborations in the future

"This is a very great opportunity to share knowledge and experiences that will be very beneficial for the participants.

The materials that will be presented later must become a new insight and be very useful for the development of Health Sciences at FKep Unhas," Syahrul said. In his presentation, Prof. Tony Long reminded all researchers, especially those concerned on child and family health, to really acknowledge the direct impact of research that will be carried out in the future.

"The research funding is quite large and the fact showed that many kinds of research previously conducted on this topic were not based on the needs of families and communities," Prof Tony explained.

Meanwhile, Prof. Alison Brettle through the material presented explained that digitalization has entered the health sector; however, it does not mean that digitized services can fully replace the existing health services. "However, the research emerging digitalization is expected to be able to strengthen the provision of primary health services and help facilitate the understanding of patients and families in order to obtain the currently available services," Prof. Alison said.

The public lecture was attended by roughly 250 participants from lecturers, students, health practitioners, nurses, physiotherapists, and various national health institutions. Also, lecturers, students, and clinical supervisors from the University of Salford. Manchester was present at the lecture.

The event guided by Andi Fajrin Permana, S.Kep., Ns., MSc., as moderator ran well until 17.30 WITA.

UNHAS CONDUCT SOCIALIZATION OF INTERNATIONAL COLLABORATIVE RESEARCH FUND RISPRO-UKICIS





Universitas Hasanuddin through the Directorate of Research, Innovation and Partnerships held a socialization of the International Collaborative Research Fund RISPRO UKICIS. The activity took place starting at 10.00 Wita online through the Zoom meeting application, Tuesday (12/04).

The main speakers were Dr. Berry Juliandi, S.Si., M.Sc., (Head of the Expert Panel and RISPRO-UKICIS Technical Team), Prof. Dr. Ir. jamaluddin Jompa, M.Sc., (Dean of the Unhas Postaraduate School).

The activity was officially opened by Prof. dr. Moh. Nasrum Massi, Ph.D., Sp.MK., as the Vice Chancellor for Research, Innovation and Partnerships. Prof. Nasrum explained that the socialization was aimed at providing information to Unhas researchers regarding the RISPRO-UKICIS international collaborative research fund scheme. It is hoped that Unhas researchers can be more active in building collaborations and publications by utilizing this research fund.

"This year, the target is approximately 2,500 articles that must be submitted to reputable journals. Meanwhile, Unhas' internal funding is limited. With this socialization, we hope that many Unhas researchers can get grants and foster collaboration to produce quality of research proposals that have an impact on academic reputation," explained Prof. Nasrum.

After the official opening, it was continued with the presentation of the material from two speakers. The initial material was explained by Dr. Berry related to "Innovative, Productive Research Funding Program with the UK Themed Mandatory – Indonesia Consortium for Interdisciplinary Sciences". He explained that

RISPRO-UKICIS is a funding scheme for Indonesian researchers who want to conduct research collaborations with the best universities in the UK.

Researchers received funding of IDR 44 billion (USD 3 million) which was used to strengthen national research in five fields namely Green Economy, Blue Economy, Digital Technology, Health, and Tourism for four years. RISPRO UKICIS can be accessed by universities in Indonesia, whether affiliated with UKICIS or not.

"This funding scheme is expected to produce scientific articles with international reputation indexed by Scopus with Schimago journal rank Q1. There are also relevant products in relation to research.

The presence of RISPRO UKICIS as a form of government commitment can support the intensification of research collaboration," explained Dr. Berries.


