SOCIETY OF RENEWABLE ENERGY OF UNHAS & PT ASTRA INTERNATIONAL AGREE TO COLLABORATE ON NEW RENEWABLE ENERGY INNOVATION PROJECT

Society of Renewable Energy (SRE) Hasanuddin University and PT. Astra International, Tbk. collaborate on innovation projects for communities that utilize New Renewable Energy (NRE). This innovation project is part of a series of Astra Energy Student Innovation (AGEnSI) activities that focus on developing existing technology and innovations in New and Renewable Energy technology within the scope of university students and high school/vocational/MA equivalent students throughout Indonesia.

This activity consists of several stages, starting with team selection on August 30, 2021, followed by the Idea Generation Stage on September 17 – October 13, and ending with the implementation stage on December 17 – 25 2021.

Dhea Izumi the head of the Astra Energy Student Innovation Research Team for SRE Hasanuddin University explained that AGEnSI is a platform for students throughout Indonesia to innovate to support the achievement of EBT targets. In addition, this activity is intended to increase public awareness and understanding of the use of NRE in daily life.

More about this source textSource text required for additional translation information “Based on the target for NRE (23% in 2025) in Indonesia, PT Astra International has taken the initiative to establish a program for Indonesian Youth who can participate directly in accelerating the target,” said Dhea Izumi The team from SRE of Universitas Hasanuddin has developed an innovative technology called Solar Powered Water Purifier located in Pramuka Island, Kepulauan Seribu, Jakarta. The installation took place in December 2021.

“The technology is portable. It also applies an appropriate technology and uses solar energy sources to meet drinking water needs. The people here find it very helpful and accommodating,” said Bang Komar, a resident of Pramuka Island.

"even though this activity is conducted online, it still provides a lot of experience and knowledge to the participants. We hope that you can visit Yokohama to experience firsthand the learning atmosphere created here and hopefully, we can also visit Unhas," said Yuka Kanoya.

On the same occasion, the Dean of the Faculty of Nursing Unhas, Dr. Ariyanti Saleh, S.Kep., M.Kes., in her speech said that the program was conducted because of the

collaboration between the Faculty of Nursing Unhas and Yokohama City University. Dr. Ariyanti said that there were many things that the participants could learn and also this activity can build networks between Unhas and Yokohama lecturers and students.

The Sakura Science program is a forum for sharing knowledge, research, and nursing experiences between the two universities. In addition, it also introduces the culture of the two countries. Students could attain experience following international level programs, interacting with lecturers and students at their respective destined places, and gaining new knowledge.

Back in January 2021, the Nursing Faculty had conducted a similar program which was then reconducted this year as part of the commitment and collaboration of the two universities.

Southeast Asia Lecture Hall is a program that is presented the concept of world-class lectures. This activity takes place every 3 weeks, initiated by FPCI.

The purpose of the guest lecture is to develop closer relations among the academic community from 11 countries in the Southeast Asia region through intellectual exchange among students and academics.

In this 8th series, FPCI presented Cesar Purisima (Secretary of Finance of the Republic of the Philippines) as the speaker. The guest lecture was moderated by Dr. M.L Pinitbhand Paritbatra (Associate Dean, Faculty of Political Science, Thammasat University).

Cesar Purisima has experience in the field of public accounting both in the Philippines and abroad. He is the recipient of numerous awards and honors, including Finance Minister of the Year four times in five years and Chevalier de l'Ordre National du Merite by the Republic of France in 2001.

Currently, Cesar Purisima is an Asia Fellow at the 'Milken Institute', and also a Founding Partner at the 'ASEAN private equity fund Ikhlas Capital' along with Nazir Razak, Kenny Kim, and Gita Wirjawan. He has also served as Director of several Philippine multinational publicly traded companies.

On that occasion, Cesar Purisima brought a topic related to "Business in Southeast Asia". He provides an understanding of the business review in Southeast Asia which is developing into a region driving the world's economic growth.

FIB UNHAS HOLDS PUBLIC LECTURE ON LANGUAGE DOCUMENTATION METHOD PRESENTS SPEAKERS FROM ITALY



The Faculty of Cultural Sciences (FIB) of Hasanuddin University held a public lecture with the theme “Method of Documentation of Oral Language and Traditions”. The activity, which presented Antonia Soriente, Ph.D., (Orientale Napoli University, Italy) as a resource person, took place at 10.30 WITA offline at the Matuladda Hall, FIB Unhas and connected virtually through the Zoom meeting application, Wednesday (19/01).

The activity was officially opened by the Vice Dean for Academic, Research and Innovation FIB Unhas, Dr. Mardi Adi Armin, M. Hum. In his remarks, he thanked the speakers for the information and experiences that will be shared with the Unhas academic community, especially FIB. He also gave an appreciation related to the theme of the public lecture which was very interesting and important.

“Language is a field of science that becomes a basket of knowledge to find out various problems of the past. Language is an important oral tradition to learn. Therefore, it is very interesting to observe. Moreover, the experience of the resource persons is very broad on this matter,” explained Dr. Mardi.

On this occasion, Antonia gave an overview of several issues related to the oral tradition of the global community, the application of technology as a language documentation

tool, to the documentation of oral traditions and Indonesian language, especially in Kalimantan and Sulawesi.

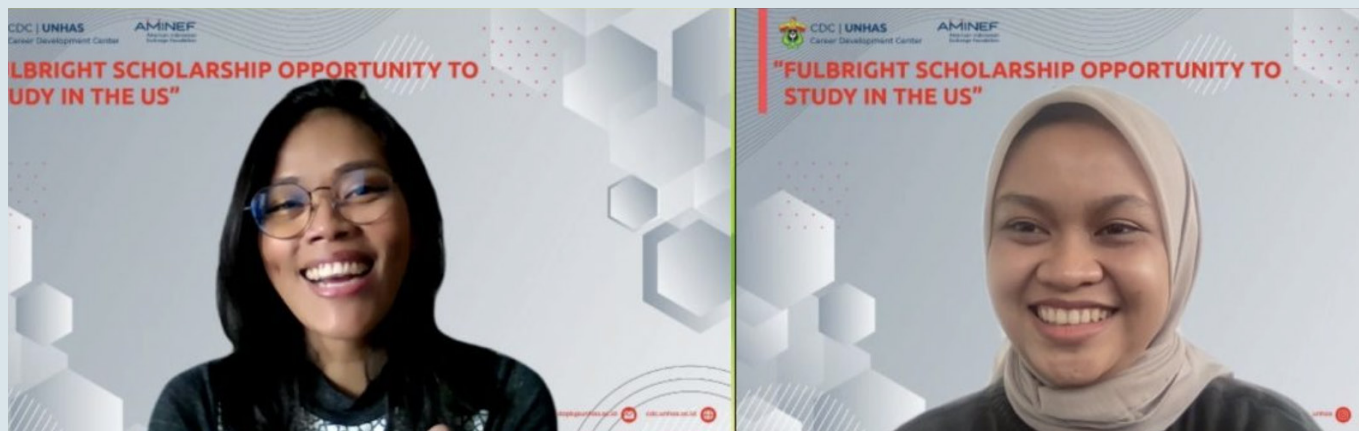
Antonia said documentation of language and oral traditions is a collection of languages and traditions of the community that are used as one data and aims to develop knowledge and efforts to revitalize the language. Language Documentation becomes part of a wider interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary project.

He also gave case examples based on research results related to the Indonesian shipbuilding tradition in South Sulawesi, where a team of archaeologists, ethnographers and linguists worked together to produce documentation that was useful for the scientific community and made available to the public at large.

“Language documentation is a methodology for collecting data both from direct recordings and observations. This data is then periodically archived into a single document for knowledge sources. It needs to be emphasized to collect a lot of data, to provide clear information to the public,” explained Antonia.

Starting her presentation, Miftahul Mardiyah explained in general about the program facilities offered by the Fulbright Scholarship for students during the process in Indonesia, as well as programs in The U.S.

"The Fulbright program has supported more than 3,000 Indonesians and 1,300 Americans to continue their studies,

conduct research, or teach in various disciplines, as well as closer the relationship between America and Indonesia," explained Miftahul.

The Fulbright Scholarship Program is aimed to continue studies or research in various fields except in the fields of Medicine and Patient Management, Dentistry, Clinical Psychology, and Nursing.

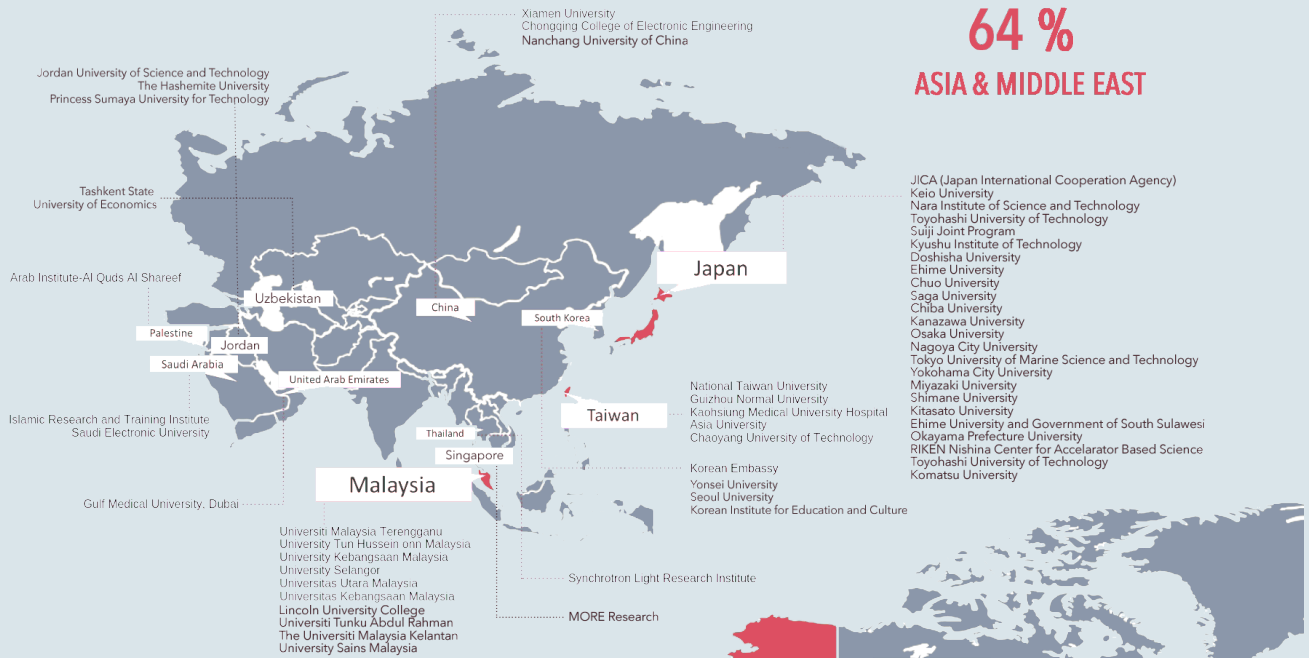
