**FACULTY OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND SDGS CENTER OF HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY
INVITE A GUEST LECTURER FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF LEEDS**



The Faculty of Public Health (FKM), in collaboration with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) Center UNHAS, successfully held a guest lecture on the topics of "Global Health Policies and Systems and the Global Health System: UK and US Examples" on Tuesday, December 27, 2022. The activity was held in the Senate Room on the 2nd Floor of the Hasanuddin University Rectorate Building and began with remarks from the Dean of the FKM, Prof. Sukri Palutturi, SKM MKes MSPH, Ph.D. Then, the Vice-Rector officially opened the guest lecture event for Partnership, Innovation, Entrepreneurship, and Business (VR4), Prof. Dr. Eng. Ir. Adi Maulana, ST MPhil. He expressed his pride that FKM is very productive in hosting international guest lecturers.

The guest lecturer was an associate professor from the University of Leeds, Dr. Mayeh Omar. He is an expert on management consulting in public health and health systems, especially in education management and health system development. Around 127 participants from lecturers and students from some faculties, especially the faculties of public health, medicine, dentistry, pharmacy, and nursing, attended the event. This guest lecture is expected to begin future collaborative educational, research, and community service activities with the Nuffield Center for International Health and Development (NCIHD), University of Leeds.

The meeting began with a presentation from the Vice-Rector for Partnership, Innovation, Entrepreneurship, and Business (VR4). His presentation outlined an introduction to Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), the number of faculties, partnerships, consortiums, international students, campuses, and facilities. Prof Adi Maulana emphasized UNHAS Consortiums to build the collaboration between UNHAS and the University of Leeds, as UNHAS currently becomes one of the members of UK-Indonesia for Interdisciplinary Sciences (UKICIS). Moreover, as the University of Leeds, through the Nuffield Center for International Health and Development (NCIHD), has been collaborating with the Faculty of Public Health (FKM) UNHAS, Prof Adi also emphasized that in the future, this collaboration will be transformed from faculty level to university level.



After the VR4 presentation, Dr. Mayeh Omar explained his research interests, including health policy and systems, antimicrobial resistance, urban health, planetary health, improving healthcare, and capacity building. He also said that NCIHD offers services of consultancies around the globe, such as in Kenya, Kazakhstan, and review of planning in WHO EMRO (Eastern Mediterranean Regional Office). In another slide of his presentation, Dr. Omar explained the intense focus of University of Leeds in an international partnership which benefits recruitment, profile and reputation, research, students and staff opportunity, curriculum enrichment, and more comprehensive internationalization benefits.

This meeting was conducted in the VR4 meeting room and attended by the Head of the UNHAS International Office, Director of Partnership, Vice Dean for Partnership, Research, and Innovation of the FKM, and academic staff.

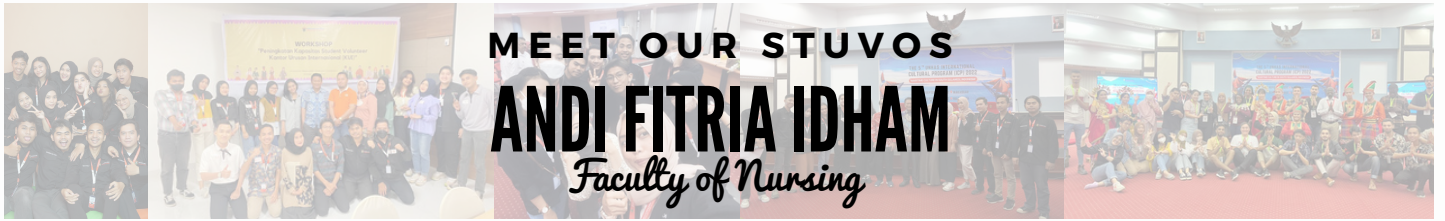

At the meeting, SeungHwan Lee, M.D., Ph.D., and Sang Chun Ji Ph.D., were the representative of Seoul National University Hospital, while from the UNHAS side, Prof. Adi Maulana (VR4), Ansariadi, SKM., M.Sc.PH., Ph.D., (Director of Partnership), and Dr. Isra Wahid (Faculty of Medicine).

During the visit, Prof. Adi Maulana conveyed the meeting of the two parties in order to discuss the plan of cooperation agreement between the two parties through the signing of the MoU. He also hopes that the collaboration between UNHAS and Seoul National University Hospital can cover many things to encourage the contribution and involvement of both parties in Tridharma, three pillars for higher education, including education, research, and community service. As a university, UNHAS continues to optimize and expand partnerships with various parties. This is also a strategic move to help improve the quality of human resources through different programs that can be done in collaboration.

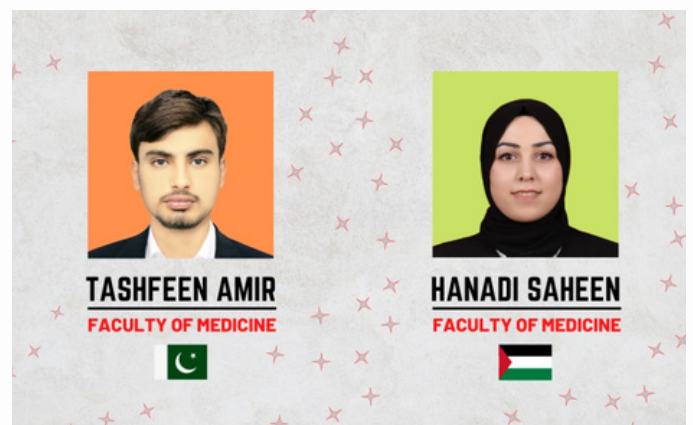


RECRUITMENT OF STUDENT VOLUNTEERS FOR UNHAS INTERNATIONAL OFFICE
