

AUSTRALIA

A team from UNHAS which was represented by the Vice Rector of Partnership, Innovation, Entrepreneurship, and Business, Director of Partnership, Head of International Office, and

Director of Business Development and Asset Utilization had a business trip to several universities in Australia, including Australia-Indonesia Center (AIC), Monash University, Melbourne University, La Trobe University in Victoria, the University of Sydney, the University of Newcastle, and Australia National University. Besides visiting the universities, the team also visited the Indonesian Ambassador and Education and Cultural Attaché. The tour started from December 9th - 18th, 2022.













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UNHAS had a meeting with AIC Director Dr. Eugene Sabastian and his team at Monash University's AIC office on December 12, 2022. They discussed the establishment of PAIR LAB as a research consortium that will be led by UNHAS in collaboration with Monash University.



On December 13, 2022, the MONASH team had a meeting with Monash University's Vice Monash University's Chancellor for Partnerships,

Prof. Rebekah Brown, at the Monash University, Clayton Campus. During the meeting, they discussed the extension of the MOU, which will end next year, and several ongoing projects, such as RISE. They also talked about the results of innovations that have been carried out by UNHAS. Furthermore, UNHAS submitted a request for an adjunct professor and a visiting researcher to collaborate with UNHAS. The UNHAS team managed to meet both the Vice Chancellor for Partnership and the Pro Vice Chancellor for Education. In this meeting, they discussed the Colombo Plan, where Monash students can do exchange or mobility at UNHAS, the possibility of a double degree or split master's, and also English language development program for staff and students.







The next university in Victoria visited by the team was the University of Melbourne

(UniMelb) on December 13, 2022. The UNHAS team met with the Vice Chancellor for Partnership in Asia and Dr. Sherah Kurnia as a representative of the UniMelb. During the meeting, the UNHAS team discussed the MOU with UniMelb. Besides them, there were also several research colleagues from UniMelb attending the meeting. In this collaboration, it is expected that good programs can be developed, for example in the fields of research and student exchange. Furthermore, a double degree program in public policy and sociology can also be developed. As a result of this meeting, the MOU will be followed up in January 2023.



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After visiting UniMelb the UNHAS team moved to La Trobe University, which is also in the city of Melbourne (December 13, 2022). They met with campus leaders and fellow faculty members. This meeting aimed to discuss the MoU that had previously been signed by

UNHAS. In addition, UNHAS also submitted a request to collaborate in the form of Adjunct Professor and visiting researcher to UNHAS.







The UNHAS paid a visit to the University of Sydney on December 14, 2022. The UNHAS team met up with the Center for SouthEast Asian Studies and the Director for Global Health. UNHAS and Sydney University discussed future potential collaborations on the exchange student program and joint

research. Accordingly, UNHAS and Sydney University would create an MoU at the university level. Coupled with that, the UNHAS team also met up with Imam Arundana, a lecturer from UNHAS who is currently taking his doctoral program at Sydney University.







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After having a meeting with the University of Sydney, the UNHAS team also had a discussion with the University of Newcastle on the same day (December 14, 2022). At the University of Newcastle, both parties were ready to sign an MoU. The future agreement will focus on student mobility, dual degrees, and research collaboration.







The UNHAS team visited the Australian National University (ANU) Canberra on December 16, 2022. Meetings at ANU were held in two places, which are the Fenner School of Environment and Society, and Crawford School of Public Policy. The meeting addressed the extension of the MOU which expired in August 2022. Both schools at ANU would work together to follow up the

MOU extension plan for the University level. Moreover, they talked about the follow-up of the Future Research Talent (FRT) program, where 5 UNHAS students and 5 UNHAS lecturers will be selected at ANU to participate in research activities under the guidance of researchers from ANU. They also discussed the possibility of UNHAS doing the same program where lecturers from ANU as visiting research at UNHAS.







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On December 16, 2022, the UNHAS team visited the Indonesian Ambassador at the official residence in Australia, Canberra. The UNHAS team discussed the UNHAS/Sulawesi day plan in Australia in 2023, and the Ambassador expressed appreciation for this plan and tried to provide support. Sulawesi Day will contain activities including arts, culture, education, research, and business. The plan is that UNHAS will include the provincial or city government in South Sulawesi to take part in the arts and culture activities.



Furthermore, UNHAS plan to conduct a conference for education and research in Sulawesi. In the conference. UNHAS will invite all university research collaborators in Australia, which are divided into 4 clusters (Health, Agriculture, Science, and Engineering, and Art and Humanities). In the business sector, UNHAS will invite companies that are likely to invest in Sulawesi. There are companies that work in the field of renewable energy and agricultural products such as cacao, seaweed, etc.



Hasanuddin University and NIPPON KOEI Japan Agree to Cooperate in the Development of Tridharma of Higher Education

Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), through the Faculty of Agriculture, agreed to cooperate with the Japanese company NIPPON KOEI Co., Ltd. to develop the tridharma of higher education. Prof. Dr. Ir. Salengke, M.Sc., Dean of the Faculty of Agriculture at UNHAS and Tomonori Sakashita, Head of NIPPON KOEI Indonesia Representative signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) witnessed by Prof. Dr. Eng. Ir. Adi Maulana, ST., M.Phil., Vice Rector for Partnership, Research, Entrepreneurship, and Business. This event was located in the Meeting Room A, 4th Floor of the Rectorate Building of UNHAS, Makassar, on Wednesday, December 21, 2022.









English Language Study of Hasanuddin University holds "The 7th Annual Seminar on English language Studies (ASELS)"


