



RECTOR OF UNHAS WAS RE-ELECTED AS AUSTRALIAN ALUMNI ASSOCIATION IN MAKASSAR (IKAMA)

Prof. Jamaluddin Jompa, the Rector of Hasanuddin University, was elected by acclamation as the Head of Australian Student Alumni Association (Ikatan Alumni Mahasiswa Australia/IKAMA) South Sulawesi in a General Conference at UNHAS Hotel & Convention on Friday, 17 February 2023. Prof. Jamaluddin Jompa, known as Prof JJ, has been serving as the head of IKAMA from 2016-2021. During his service, he has shown a great performance by developing partnerships with parties in Australia.

The General Conference was carried out in a hybrid mode (offline and online), approximately 50 people on the spot and 70 people via zoom meeting application. The conference should have been held in 2021, however, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the event had to be postponed until 2023.

IKAMA South Sulawesi assists relations with the Australian Consulate-General in Makassar, both in general and specifically with the Australian Government. For example, IKAMA is helping with scholarship events, building a network among fellow alumni, and doing community service. "We are also active in several community service activities, and research related to scientific fields from alumni, including the boat school in Pangkep regency was funded by the Australian Government," Ilham concluded.

Rector of Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), Prof. Dr. Ir. Jamaluddin Jompa, M.Sc., as known as Prof. JJ welcomed an official visit from Niigata University of Health and Welfare, Japan, led by Prof. Masayoshi Kubo, Ph.D. The Niigata University of Health and Welfare visited on Monday, 20 Feb 2023. The Vice Rector for Academic and Student Affairs, Prof. drg. Muhammad Ruslin, M.Kes., Ph.D., Sp.BM (K), the Dean of the Faculty of Nursing UNHAS, Dr. Ariyanti Saleh, S.Kep., M.Si, the Deputy Dean for Academic and Student Affairs, Syahrul Said, S.Kep., Ns., M.Kes., Ph.D. and the Head of the UNHAS International Affairs Office, Andi Masyitha Irwan, S.Kep., Ns., Ph.D. also attended the welcoming ceremony. Niigata University of Health and Welfare, Japan's entourage included Mayumi Sato, Ph.D. (Senior Lecturer, Pediatric Nursing Department Niigata University of Health and Welfare), and six students.

On this occasion, Prof. JJ welcomed the visit of the Niigata University delegation. They discussed a lot about the development of Tri Dharma (Education, Research, and Community Services), especially the research conducted by UNHAS. Prof. JJ also discussed partnership opportunities that both parties could develop. What is more, Prof. Masayoshi Kubo was delighted with the warm hospitality of UNHAS. He said Niigata University is very supportive of building partnerships with UNHAS. In the meeting, they also discussed their campus's achievements and academic activities.

Niigata University of Health and Welfare is one of the national universities in Japan, established in 1949. The university offers bachelor, master, and doctoral programs with ten faculties and five graduate schools in various disciplines, including humanities, medicine, health sciences, economics, and science. In general, the visit of Niigata University accompanied by the Dean of the Faculty of Nursing to discuss several academic activities that the Niigata delegation will carry out, such as observations in clinical environments such as hospitals and nursing/rehabilitation in the community.

They were also welcomed by the Head of Library, Dr. Fierenziana Getruida Junus, the Director of Japanese Corner Meta Sekar Puji, MA., Ph.D. and several librarians. At that time, Meta Sekar Puji, Ph.D. explained the various artifacts and accessories displayed at the Japanese Corner including a collection of books written in Kanji, Hiragana, and Japanese Katakana. The Japanese Corner itself was inaugurated in the mid-2019 by the Deputy Rector for Research and Cooperation, Prof. dr. Muhammad Nasrum Massi, Ph.D. which was witnessed by the Japanese Ambassador to Indonesia and the Governor of South Sulawesi.

When talking with the visiting students, Dr. Fierenziana explained several types of services provided by the UNHAS Central Library to students including the circulation services, special collection, reference collections services and also introduced several reading corners in the UNHAS library such as UNHASiana Corner, Germany Corner, Korean Corner, France Corner, and Chinese Corner.







FACULTY OF NURSING, HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY CONDUCTS A GUEST LECTURE WITH A SPEAKER FROM NIIGATA UNIVERSITY OF HEALTH AND WELFARE

The Physiotherapy Study Program of the Faculty of Nursing, Hasanuddin University (FKEP UNHAS), held a guest lecture featuring an international speaker from Niigata University, Prof. Masayoshi Kubo, Ph.D (Department of Physical Therapy Niigata University of Health and Welfare, Niigata, Japan). The guest lecture with the theme "Motion and Gait Analysis" took place at the Science and Technology (IPTEKS) Building on Tuesday (21/2) and was attended by 150 participants, consisting of lecturers and students of the Physiotherapy Study Program.

The event was officially opened by Syahrul Said, S.Kep., Ns., M.Kes., Ph.D. the Deputy Dean for Academic and Student Affairs. He expressed his gratitude for the attendance of the speakers and the team at UNHAS to meet with the academic community of the Faculty of Nursing and share his knowledge and experience in his expertise in Physical Therapy.

In his presentation, Prof. Masayoshi Kubo, Ph.D., generally provides an overview and explanation related to "Kinematic Analysis Simplified," which is explained in the material application of 2D motion analysis systems and 3D motion analysis systems used to analyze coordination patterns of human body motion functions, such as muscle bones when performing specific movements while walking. He also explained the utilization of the Al-based OpenCap cloud server (Artificial Intelligence), which uses algorithms to automatically calculate skeletal movements and musculoskeletal forces. In its application, Kinematic analysis functions in analyzing the motion of the human body in detail, as in the movement of bones and muscles as a whole from toe to head when a particular activity is made.







SECRETARY OF LPMPP JOINS THE US-ASEAN UNIVERSITY CONNECTION INITIATIVE IN WASHINGTON DC

Dr. Rini Rachmawaty, the Secretary of the Quality Assurance and Educational Development Unit (LPMPP) of Hasanuddin University and Associate Professor in Nursing Management of the Faculty of Nursing, Hasanuddin University, has been selected to participate as a Fellow in the U.S.-ASEAN University Connections Initiative (UCI), a White House Initiative announced in the U.S.-ASEAN Special Summit in May 2022. The U.S.-ASEAN UCI Program is conducted in the JW Marriott Hotel, Washington D.C., USA from February 17-24, 2023.

The initiative is administered through the U.S. Department of State's Increase and Diversify Education Abroad for U.S. Students (IDEAS) Program, which builds U.S. colleges and universities' capacity to engage in global partnerships and study abroad programming aligned with U.S. foreign policy goals. It brought together 50 leaders from diverse colleges and universities in the United States and eight ASEAN member countries—Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Philippines, Singapore, and Vietnam—for a series of virtual and in-person trainings designed to foster sustainable international academic partnerships and the two-way exchange of students, scholars, and researchers between U.S. and Southeast Asian higher education institutions.

"The U.S. Department is committed to fostering partnerships between U.S. and Southeast Asian colleges and universities and increasing academic collaboration to find solutions on topics of global importance, such as combating climate change and promoting economic development," said Ethan Rosenzweig, the State Department's Deputy Assistant Secretary for Academic Programs.

There were two virtual trainings under the initiative that took place in late 2022/early 2023 and explored academic partnership models. These events were open to the public, and registration was open on the IDEAS Program website. The IDEAS Program is a program of the U.S. Department of State with funding provided by the U.S. Government and supported in its implementation by World Learning. The University Connections Initiative is being implemented in partnership with the Association of International Education Administrators.









DEPARTMENT OF PLANT PESTS AND DISEASES, FACULTY OF AGRICULTURE PRESENTS A PLANT PROTECTION **EXPERT FROM THE UNITED STATES**

Regarding the role of insects as vectors of plant diseases, the Department of Pest and Plant Diseases (Hama dan Penyakit Tanaman/HPT) under the command of the Head of the Department, Prof. Dr. Ir. Tutik Kuswinanti, M.Sc held a public lecture on the topic of insect vectors and plant diseases. This public lecture presented a speaker, Dr. Anwar Syed H. Rizvi from the Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service, USA. and the moderator was Dr. Sri Nur Aminah Ngatimin, SP., M.Si., Secretary of the Department of HPT. The material of the public lecture presented by Dr. Rizvi was entitled: The Importance of Insects in The Transmission of Plant Diseases.

The event was held on Tuesday, February 14, 2023, attended by the Dean of the Faculty of Agriculture, Vice Deans, lecturers and students of the Faculty of Agriculture. In the public lecture, Dr. Rizvi explained the various types of insects that become vectors of plant diseases in agricultural land, namely: ticks, leafhoppers and several other types of insect pests. Insect vectors of plant diseases are very destructive because of their ability to damage plants as pests while transmitting diseases originating from diseased plants to healthy plants. The role and activities of insect vectors in agricultural land are very important to study in order to achieve good quality, healthy and safe crops for public consumption.



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INTERNATIONAL OFFICE OF UNHAS HOLDS A SHARING SESSION WITH INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM (IDP) EDUCATION AUSTRALIA

The International Office of UNHAS held a sharing session from IDP Education Australia of Makassar Branch Office on Friday, February 24, 2023 at Room A 4th Floor Rectorate Building. The session was attended by around fifty students and faculty members. The session moderator was Rafika Ramli, LLM, an Australian graduate now working as Faculty of Law's academic staff. In addition, IDP Education team that attended the session were Zulfahmi Bakhtiar (Office Manager IDP Education Makassar), Andi Fitryana (Counsellor Australia/New Zealand), Darna Harus (Counsellor Australia/New Zealand) and Rahmat Kurniawan, M.Sc (Alumni IDP dari University of Melbourne).

The session began with the welcome remark by the Secretary of International Office of UNHAS that was delivered by Muhammad Ridwan, M.A. In his remarks, Ridwan emphasized that the event or session should be continously held in the future to provide better information about Australian education among UNHAS students and faculty members. The session continued with the presentation from IDP Education Makassar focusing on the history of IDP and its branch offices around Indonesia. The presentation also covers important aspects of applying for any university and college in Australia. After the presentation, one of the Australian alumni named Rahmat Kurniawan also had a chance to share his experience and tips as well as getting assisted by IDP in the registration process. Rahmat graduated from the University of Melbourne. Prior to the end of the session, the question and answer session appeared to be one of the most interesting parts of the presentation. Even though the sessions ended, many students remained in the room approaching the IDP for further question and requests.
