The Head of the International Office of Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), Dr. Andi Masyitha Irwan, cordially welcomed the Education Attaché of the Embassy of Japan in Indonesia, Ms. Kawakubo Yuriko. Ms. Kawakubo would like to understand more about UNHAS as UNHAS and Japan have a long bilateral relationship. During her visit, Ms. Kawakubo also gave a Japanese government scholarship information session moderated by Dr. Jamaluddin Fitrah Alam, a Marine Science and Fishery Faculty lecturer who graduated from Hiroshima University.

Not only students but also lecturers enthusiastically attended the scholarship session. Japan is one of the most notable countries to pursue post-graduate studies, as can be seen from the many UNHAS alumni continuing their studies in Japan. Interestingly, many participants asked questions in Japanese. Ms. Kawakubo was happy to see the excitement of the participants.

After the visit to the main campus, the guests continued their agenda of visiting the UNHAS Gowa Campus. The purpose of the visit was to know more about the Engineering Faculty which was established in collaboration with Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA). The Vice Dean of Partnership, Research, and Innovation, Dr. Rustan Tarakka, and the Engineering Faculty lecturers were thrilled to talk with Ms. Kawakubo. The Vice Dean also showed and took Ms. Kawakubo and her team to see academic rooms and laboratories at the Engineering Faculty.



FOCUS GROUP DISCUSSION (FGD) ON QS WORLD UNIVERSITY RANKING (WUR) STATISTICS OF 2023



This FGD was held on Saturday and Sunday 4-5 February 2023 at the Innovate Room, Unhas Hotel and Convention Centre. The FGD was officially opened by the Head of International Reputation Improvement, Prof. Rohani Ambo-Rappe. and was attended by Dr. Mahatma as a resource person; the Director of Alumni Network and Endowment Fund, Dr. Muhammad Akhmar; the Secretary of International Office, Muhammad Ridwan, M.A.; members of the World Class University Task Force Rafika Ramli, Achmad Firdaus, and many others. This FGD focused on employer reputation, alumni networks and numbers of inbound and outbound students. Data collected from this FGD will be uploaded to the WUR website so that Unhas can proceed to the assessment for world university ranking.

Ms Mandy Mok, a former Chief Executive Officer (CEO) and Founder of the QS Asia Quacquarelli Symonds, Singapore, was also an invited speaker at this FGD. She is currently working as CEO and Founder of AppliedHE, Singapore. In her presentation, she emphasized the 3 Musketeers (3M) approach, which adopts the slogan "one for all and all for one" of the well-known book and movie. The 3M approach consists of three different applications: JOB Ready Rating, ALUMNI Ready and FUTURE Ready Micro-Credentials (Critical Thinking Assessment Test). With this 3M, Unhas may be able to figure out its ranking position in terms of alumni employability, alumni network mobilization etc. It was planned that Ms Mok would meet the Rector of Hasanuddin University on Monday 6 February 2023 for further discussions on 3M and other WUR-related matters.

ARTICLE WRITING WORKSHOP BY VRIJE UNIVERSITY



The Faculty of Law of Hasanuddin University (FH UNHAS) invited Prof. Dr. Prosper S. Magachu, LL.M from Vrije University (VU), to deliver a workshop at the Faculty of Law of UNHAS. This collaboration is part of implementing the MoU between the Faculty of Law of UNHAS and VU. Prof. Magachu arrived on Saturday 5 Feb 2023. Prof. Magachu was enthusiastic about discussing the topic, and the participants were also actively involved. The workshop was one of a series of activities that will take place over the next few days in cooperation with Vrije Universiteit.



PUBLIC LECTURE BY INDIAN AMBASSADOR TO INDONESIA

Indian Ambassador to Indonesia and Timor Leste, His Excellency Mr Manoj Kumar Bharti, was a guest speaker at a Public Lecture held by Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) Makassar, South Sulawesi in the Senate Room, 2nd Floor of the Rectorate Building, Tamalanrea Campus, Makassar on Monday, February 6, 2023.

H.E. Manoj gave a general overview of the bilateral relations between Indonesia and India. According to His Excellency, Indonesia and India have similarities in various aspects, one of which is in the management of the education system. Indonesia and India both have large populations. India has a vast and growing number of young people with an enthusiasm for education, and they are considered to play an important role in contributing to the progress and development of the country's economy.

The Rector of Unhas Prof. Jamaluddin Jompa, nick-named Prof. JJ, said that Unhas and India have become partners that synergize with each other in achieving goals in the world of education. One of these is to provide opportunities for students to gain access to educational facilities and infrastructure through a scholarship program. This public lecture, with the topic India and Indonesia at the G-20, was enthusiastically attended by approximately 200 participants.





STRENGTHENING PARTNERSHIP : UNIVERSITY SECRETARY VISITS THE NETHERLANDS



The Secretary of Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), Prof. Ir. Sumbangan Baja, M.Phil, Ph.D., visited Wageningen University and Utrecht University to discuss research collaboration opportunities. Prof. Sumbangan met Dr. Giulia Bongiorno, Coordinator of the Soil Science Cluster, Wageningen University and Research (WUR) with Dr. Stephen Mantel and William Dragt from the World Soil Museum to discuss potential research collaboration on soils.

Prof. Sumbangan talked about an interdisciplinary workshop that could involve UNHAS and WUR with Prof. Ioannis N. Athanasiadis, a professor of artificial intelligence and data science at WUR. Finally, on the third visit, Prof. Sumbangan held discussions with Associate Professor Irina van Aalst, an urban geographer at Utrecht University.

Prof. Sumbangan not only visited well-known universities in the Netherlands but also had a meeting with Prof. Agus Setiabudi, Education and Cultural Attaché of the Indonesia Embassy in the Netherlands. The meeting was to talk about the Indonesian Higher Education Meeting with WUR which will be held on 7-10 March 2023. UNHAS is one of the higher education institutions that will join the meeting with scientists from WUR, focusing on faculty and scientist leaders in Indonesia.

Moreover, there will also be a meeting of Indonesian higher education leaders with the leaders of WUR to discuss future research collaboration. As the last agenda, Prof. Sumbangan attended the Conference on Agricultural and Biological Science in Den Haag.



YOKOHAMA CITY UNIVERSITY, JAPAN VISITS UNHAS FACULTY OF NURSING



Yokohama City University (YCU) and the Faculty of Nursing, Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), have a research collaboration entitled "Investigation of health behavior of nursing students in Japan and Indonesia regarding non-communicable diseases and its related factors." Following up on this collaboration, on Feb 7-9, 2023, Ryota Ochiai, R.N., Ph.D. Associate Professor, Adult Nursing, Department of Nursing, School of Medicine and Yayoi Shoji, R.N., Ph.D., Assistant Professor of Public Health Unit at Global Cooperation Institute for Sustainable Cities, YCU visited the Faculty of Nursing, UNHAS. The YCU delegation's visit aimed to perform data analysis for the joint research.

This study involves more than 500 nursing students from YCU and UNHAS. The research team from UNHAS consists of Andi Masyitha Irwan, PhD., Syahrul, PhD., Dr. Ariyanti Saleh, Dr. Erfina, and Andi Muhammad Fiqri, MN. In addition, Dr. Ochiai and Dr. Shoji wanted to observe clinical and community settings used for internships for nursing students at UNHAS as consideration to initiate inbound activities of YCU students at UNHAS.

Unhas is a member of a consortium led by YCU, the International Academic Consortium for Sustainable Cities (IACSC). The consortium has been established since 2009, as stated on the website is to "develop cooperation, to foster dialogues and discussions, to encourage sharing of ideas and resources and to increase research and collaborative activities among academic and research institutions as well as to strengthen relationships among universities and cities to contribute to a sustainable society." Members of IACSC are YCU, UNHAS, University of the Philippines, Vietnam National University, Thammasat University, and University Sains Malaysia.

IISMA ROADSHOW 2023



The International Office in collaboration with the Academic and Student Affairs of Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) held a sharing session on the Independent Learning Campus Program (Merdeka Belajar-Kampus Merdeka, MBKM in short) Indonesian International Student Mobility Awards (IISMA) 2023. This activity took place in the Senate Room, Floor 2 Rectorate Building, Tamalanrea Campus, Makassar on Monday 6 February 2023.

The activity was officially opened by the Vice-Rector for Academic and Student Affairs Prof. drg. Muhammad Ruslin, M.Kes., Ph.D., Sp.BM(K). Prof. Ruslin remarked that the socialization was carried out early on with the hope that UNHAS students could obtain information on and gain a good understanding of the IISMA program, which is a part of MBKM.

The official opening was followed by a session of presentations from various speakers. On this occasion, the Head of the IISMA Program, Dr. Rachmat Sriwijaya explained that IISMA is an MBKM program with a scholarship scheme to finance Indonesian students to take part in a one-semester mobility program at leading universities and industries abroad. Through two schemes for undergraduate and vocational program students, the IISMA program can increase Indonesian students' understanding of international academic and cultural diversity. The IISMA program provides the benefits of studying at the world's best universities, recognition of up to 20 credits, studying subjects of interest, learning and experiencing new cultures, and developing international networks.

"We want more and more Unhas students to pass [the selection process], from the start we have prepared several strategic efforts to encourage an increase in the number of Unhas students who can be accepted into the IISMA program including the socialization that is currently being carried out," Prof. M. Ruslin.





THE INDONESIAN EDUCATION ATTACHÉ TO AUSTRALIA VISITS HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY

Indonesian Education Attaché for Australia, Prof. Dr. Mukhamad Najib, S.TP., MM visited Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) in order to examine a doctoral dissertation in the field of agricultural sciences on Thursday 9 February 2023. On the sidelines of examining the dissertation, the Education Attaché met the Rector of Hasanuddin University, Prof. Jamaluddin Jompa, better known as Prof. JJ.

In this meeting, Prof JJ and Prof Najib discussed the preparation for Sulawesi Day which will be held in Australia. and the possibility of involving other stakeholders such as the South Sulawesi Provincial Government or the City of Makassar. In principle, the Indonesian Embassy in Australia is very supportive and ready to assist with this activity. Several plans for cooperation between UNHAS and the Indonesian Embassy in Australia were also discussed further, especially the issue of sending Indonesian language teachers to schools in Australia to teach Bahasa Indonesia untuk Penutur Asing (BIPA) or Indonesian for Foreign Speakers.

Given the strategic role of UNHAS which has a long history of collaboration with educational institutions in Australia, the Education Attaché really hopes for full support from UNHAS in every event or collaboration program, not only in the education sector but also in other fields. Prof. JJ really appreciated the visit from the Attaché and was very pleased with the efforts of the Education Attaché with respect to collaboration involving UNHAS in relation to building relations with Australia. This meeting was also a return visit from the Indonesian Education Attaché in Australia after visit to Canberra from UNHAS in mid-December, represented by the Vice-Rector for Partnership, Innovation, Entrepreneurship, and Business, Prof. Adi Maulana and his team. The meeting was concluded with lunch together on the 8th Floor Lounge, UNHAS Rectorate.

**HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY HOSTS THE
7TH INTERNATIONAL SYMPOSIUM OF
THE ASSOCIATION OF JAPAN-INDONESIA
VETERINARY EDUCATION (AJIVE) 2023**



Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) hosted the "7th International Symposium of The Association of Japan-Indonesia Veterinary Education (AJIVE) 2023". This annual scientific symposium is organized by The Association of Japan-Indonesia Veterinary Education (AJIVE) which discusses global veterinary issues, particularly in Indonesia and Japan. This year's AJIVE International Symposium, with the theme "Strengthening International Collaboration between Indonesia and Japan in Veterinary Education and Research", was held on 11 February 2023 at the UNHAS Hotel and Convention Centre and online via Zoom meeting.

The conference activities consisted of keynote sessions, oral presentations and posters. There were three specific topics discussed in sessions: Animal Disease and Veterinary Public Health; Veterinary Clinic, Reproduction and Pathology; Veterinary Anatomy, Physiology, and Pharmacology.

The symposium was opened by the Rector of UNHAS, Prof. Dr. Ir. Jamaluddin Jompa, M.Sc., and attended by a member of AJIVE (Japan: Joint Graduate School of Veterinary Medicine, Yamaguchi University and Joint Department of Veterinary Science, Tottori University) and ten delegates from Veterinary Faculties and Study Programs in Indonesia. AJIVE 2023 presented two keynote speakers: Assoc Prof. Takashi Shimizu (Yamaguchi University) with the title "Elucidation of the Virulence Acquisition Mechanism of Francisella tularensis" and Assoc. Prof. Channarong Rodkhum (Chulalongkorn University) with the title "Fish Vaccination".

The AJIVE member's meeting was also held on the same day and produced several commitments including the Implementation of an Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between Yamaguchi University and Tottori University and universities in Indonesia which did not yet have cooperation with universities in Japan; lecturers and student staff to visit Japan for short course activities or internships, especially at Yamaguchi University and Tottori University with the recommendation of the Association of Indonesian Faculty of Veterinary Medicine (AFKHI); guest lectures from AJIVE member lecturers in Japan to AJIVE member universities in Indonesia; and research collaboration between AJIVE member universities and AFKHI members.

This event, which was attended by 80 participants both offline and online, is expected to result in important collaboration and improve the quality of veterinary research and education to face global demands and dynamics. Furthermore, it is hoped that there will be an expansion of the collaboration program for veterinary education standards in Asia based on the international education system, and to improve the quality of veterinary research based on the international veterinary education system.

USAID-HEPI ASU: COLLABORATION BETWEEN HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY AND ARIZONA STATE UNIVERSITY ON HIGHER EDUCATION



Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) and Arizona State University (ASU) agreed to work together to improve the quality of education on an international scale through the United States Agency International Development - Higher Education Partnership Initiative (USAID-HEPI) collaboration program. As a result, the Vice-Rector for Partnership, Innovation, Entrepreneurship and Business, Prof. Dr. Eng. Adi Maulana, M.Phil and ASU Associate Provost of Southeast Asia, Jeffrey Goss, signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU), which was witnessed by the Rector of UNHAS Prof. Dr. Ir. Jamaluddin Jompa, M.Sc., widely known as Prof. JJ, on Tuesday 14 Feb 2023.

The ceremony was also attended by Katy Wigal (Director for Global Operations of ASU), Abdul Rahman (HEPI Country Director), Farhad Ghaussy (Director of Economic Growth and Education, USAID Indonesia), and Jalu Cahyanto (USAID Indonesia). UNHAS representatives included Prof. Sumbangan Baja (University Secretary), Prof. Musrizal Muin (Head of Quality Assurance and Education Development), Ansariadi, Ph.D. (Director of Partnerships), and several other UNHAS leaders.

The HEPI Project is an ongoing partnership program between the United States, Indonesian higher education institutions, and the private sector to enhance students' skills and competencies through internationally recognized, high-quality degrees and industry credentials. Alignments have been made with the Indonesian government's strategic priority programs, focusing on accreditation as an ongoing organizing and motivating framework.

Representing USAID HEPI, Abdul Rahman expressed his pleasure at Unhas' involvement in the program. According to him, UNHAS is a tertiary institution with many proud achievements. He said the UNHAS collaboration would produce a long-term cooperation model to encourage a generation of young innovators and entrepreneurs. The ceremony ended and continued with campus tour.





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Various strategic steps continue to be maximized so that the academic activities carried out provide benefits by producing globally competitive graduates. UNHAS is very pleased to welcome this collaboration to optimize the quality and quality of education which of course has an impact on the quality of competitive graduates.

The following agenda of United States Agency International Development - Higher Education Partnership Initiative (USAID-HEPI) Arizona State University (ASU) after the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) signing was to visit the Science Building and Teaching Industry. The Science Building is located in the Faculty of Sciences and Mathematics. The USAID-HEPI ASU Team was welcomed by all the Vice-Deans, Quality Assurance Officer, and colleagues. The Science Building's second floor is used for several laboratories, including the newest one, the Laboratory for Halal Food. Almost all of these laboratories have been nationally accredited. The USAID-HEPI ASU Team was impressed with these laboratories.

The second visit was to the Teaching Industry. The Director, Prof. Dr. Ir. Abu Bakar Tawali, welcomed the Team and allowed them to observe the chocolate-making process. During the visit, the Team spoke with several apprentice students from the Agricultural Polytechnic. The Teaching Industry is one of the divisions under the Vice Rector for Partnership, Innovation, Entrepreneurship, and Business coordination. The office works a lot to promote teaching based on the research. These two visits were accompanied by Muhammad Ridwan, M.A. (Secretary of International Office), who acted as interpreter.

FACULTY OF VOCATIONAL STUDIES, HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY AND JAPAN AGRICULTURE HOKKAIDO COOPERATE IN HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT



The Faculty of Vocational Studies of Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) agreed to cooperate with Japan Agriculture (JA) Hokkaido in the field of human resource development. The agreement was sealed by the signing of a Letter of Intent (LoI) between the Dean of the Faculty of Vocational Studies of UNHAS, Prof. Dr. Ir. Muh. Restu, M.P and Hokkaido Prefectural Union of Japan Agricultural Cooperatives Takeshi Matsushima. The signing ceremony, in the Main Building 5th Floor of the Ministry of Trade Jakarta, was witnessed by Minister of Trade Dr. (H.C.) Zulkifli Hasan, S.E., M.M. and Director General of International Trade Negotiations Djatmiko Bris Witjaksono, S.E., MSIE.

The purpose of this collaboration is to increase human resources for internships at companies in Japan for students and lecturers of the Faculty of Vocational Studies. Hopefully, these internships will improve competence and skills in agricultural technology, livestock, and fisheries which can be developed in Indonesia. The Dean of the Faculty of Vocational Studies welcomed the collaboration between J.A. Hokkaido and the Faculty of Vocational Studies UNHAS. This collaboration will expand the benefits of UNHAS through the development of human resources that can be utilized in improving Indonesia's human resources.

J.A. Hokkaido representatives expressed their gratitude for the openness of UNHAS in establishing cooperation. According to him, UNHAS is one of the partners that has potential due to its quality resources. Therefore, Takeshi states that it is critical to work with UNHAS to encourage the improvement of Indonesian resources.

HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY AND GRIFFITH UNIVERSITY AUSTRALIA WILL DEVELOP TOURISM POTENTIAL IN SULAWESI



The Faculty of Vocational Studies of Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) welcomed the visit of the Director of the Institute for Tourism, Griffith University, Australia, Prof. Sarah Gardiner. The event aimed to explore the collaboration between the two institutions. The meeting was attended by the Dean of the Faculty of Vocational Studies UNHAS, Prof. Dr. Ir. Muh. Restu, MP., the Vice Dean of the Faculty of Vocational Studies, Dr. Ida Leida M, SKM., MKM., M.ScPH., the GPM Chairperson, Prof. Dr. Ir. H. Zainuddin, M.Si., the Tourism Destination Study Program Head, Dr. Yadi Mulyadi, S.S., MA, and lecturers from the Tourism Destination Study Program.

The Dean of the Faculty of Vocational Studies welcomed the arrival of Prof. Sarah Gardiner to discuss cooperation related to improving the Tourism Destination Study Program. Prof. Restu hopes that this collaboration can develop the economic and tourism potential in South Sulawesi, especially in the Selayar Islands, and other areas with tourism potential in Indonesia.

Director of the Institute for Tourism Griffith University Australia, Prof. Sarah Gardiner, welcomed the exploration of this collaboration. She explained about the Institute for Tourism, Griffith University, and the potential programs that can be built, such as matching classes, student exchanges, degree programs, as well as training events, seminars and publications.

The Vice Dean of the Faculty of Vocational Studies, also an alumna of Griffith University, explained that UNHAS and Griffith University have long worked together, e.g. on student exchanges, double degree programs, and other three-pillars of Tri Dharma (Education, Research, and Community Services) programs. This time the Faculty of Vocational Studies will develop tourism-related issues in the Tourism Destination Study Program. The faculty of vocational studies also plans to send lecturers in the doctoral program to take short courses and internship programs for vocational studies students in the tourism industry in Australia and conduct joint research and publications at international conferences.



HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY'S FACULTY OF AGRICULTURE ORGANIZES THE IC-FSSAT INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON SMART AGRICULTURE FOR FOOD SECURITY



Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), through the Faculty of Agriculture, organized an international conference entitled "The 4th International Conference on Food Security and Sustainable Agriculture in the Topics (IC-FSSAT)" with the theme "Smallholder-Scale Smart Agriculture: A Solution Towards Global Efforts to Reduce Environmental Footprint and Create Resilient Food Security". Approximately 300 participants from several countries attended the event for two days, February 15–16, 2023.

The distinguished speakers for the conference were Dr. Tony Liwang (Palm Oil Plantation Fund Management Agency (BPDP-KS), Indonesia), Prof. Siti Kusujarti (Warren Wilson College, USA), Prof. Bunyamin Tar'an (University of Saskatchewan, Canada), Dr. Thong Nguyen-Huy (The University of Southern Queensland, Australia) and Dr. Anwar Syed H. Rizvi (Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service, USA).

The Rector of UNHAS, Prof. Dr. Ir. Jamaluddin Jompa, M.Sc., nicknamed Prof. JJ, officially opened the conference, expressing his appreciation regarding this international conference. He said that nowadays, food security is one of the most urgent and crucial issues confronting the world. The COVID-19 pandemic and the tragedy of the Ukraine war have exposed the fragility of the food system and the need for resilience and adaptability. In addition, population growth and climate change factors that create significant risks to food production, availability, and access are also things that must be considered together. According to Prof. JJ, rapid action is needed to build a more resilient and sustainable food system.

RECTOR OF UNHAS RE-ELECTED BY THE AUSTRALIAN ALUMNI ASSOCIATION IN MAKASSAR (IKAMA)

When talking with the visiting students, Dr. Fierenziana explained several types of services provided by the UNHAS Central Library to students including the circulation services, special collection, reference collections services and also introduced several reading corners in the UNHAS library such as UNHASiana Corner, Germany Corner, Korean Corner, France Corner, and Chinese Corner.



FACULTY OF NURSING, HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY CONDUCTS A GUEST LECTURE WITH A SPEAKER FROM NIIGATA UNIVERSITY OF HEALTH AND WELFARE

The Physiotherapy Study Program of the Faculty of Nursing, Hasanuddin University (FKEP UNHAS), held a guest lecture featuring an international speaker from Niigata University, Prof. Masayoshi Kubo, Ph.D. (Department of Physical Therapy Niigata University of Health and Welfare, Niigata, Japan). The guest lecture with the theme "Motion and Gait Analysis" took place at the Science and Technology (IPTEKS) Building on Tuesday (21/2) and was attended by 150 participants, comprising lecturers and students of the Physiotherapy Study Program.

The event was officially opened by Syahrul Said, S.Kep., Ns., M.Kes., Ph.D. the Vice Dean for Academic and Student Affairs. He expressed his gratitude for the attendance of the speakers and the team at UNHAS for this opportunity to meet with the academic community of the Faculty of Nursing and share his knowledge and experience in his expertise of Physical Therapy.

In his presentation, Prof. Masayoshi Kubo, Ph.D. provided an overview and explanation related to "Kinematic Analysis Simplified," which is explained by the material application of 2D motion analysis systems and 3D motion analysis systems used to analyze coordination patterns of human body motion functions, such as muscle bones when performing specific movements while walking.

He also explained the utilization of the AI-based OpenCap cloud server (Artificial Intelligence), which uses algorithms to automatically calculate skeletal movements and musculoskeletal forces. Kinematic analysis functions can be applied in analyzing the motion of the human body in detail, as in the movement of bones and muscles as a whole from toe to head when a particular activity is made.



SECRETARY OF LPMPP JOINS THE US-ASEAN UNIVERSITY CONNECTION INITIATIVE IN WASHINGTON DC



Dr. Rini Rachmawaty, the Secretary of the Quality Assurance and Educational Development Unit (LPMPP) of Hasanuddin University and Associate Professor in Nursing Management at the Faculty of Nursing, Hasanuddin University, has been selected to participate as a Fellow in the U.S.-ASEAN University Connections Initiative (UCI), a White House Initiative announced in the U.S.-ASEAN Special Summit in May 2022. The U.S.-ASEAN UCI Program is conducted in the JW Marriott Hotel, Washington D.C., USA from February 17-24, 2023.

The initiative is administered through the U.S. Department of State's Increase and Diversify Education Abroad for U.S. Students (IDEAS) Program, which builds U.S. colleges and universities' capacity to engage in global partnerships and study abroad programs aligned with U.S. foreign policy goals. It brought together 50 leaders from diverse colleges and universities in the United States and eight ASEAN member countries—Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Philippines, Singapore, and Vietnam—for a series of virtual and in-person trainings designed to foster sustainable international academic partnerships and the two-way exchange of students, scholars, and researchers between U.S. and Southeast Asian higher education institutions.

“The U.S. Department is committed to fostering partnerships between U.S. and Southeast Asian colleges and universities and increasing academic collaboration to find solutions on topics of global importance, such as combating climate change and promoting economic development,” said Ethan Rosenzweig, the State Department’s Deputy Assistant Secretary for Academic Programs.

Two virtual trainings held under the initiative that took place in late 2022/early 2023 explored academic partnership models. These events were open to the public, and registration was open on the IDEAS Program website. The IDEAS Program is a program of the U.S. Department of State with funding provided by the U.S. Government, and its implementation is supported by World Learning. The University Connections Initiative is being implemented in partnership with the Association of International Education Administrators.





DEPARTMENT OF PLANT PESTS AND DISEASES, FACULTY OF AGRICULTURE HOSTS A PLANT PROTECTION EXPERT FROM THE UNITED STATES

Regarding the role of insects as vectors of plant diseases, the Department of Pest and Plant Diseases (Hama dan Penyakit Tanaman/HPT), under the leadership of the Head of the Department, Prof. Dr. Ir. Tutik Kuswinanti, M.Sc., held a public lecture on the topic of insect vectors and plant diseases. The speaker was Dr. Anwar Syed H. Rizvi from the USA Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service, and the moderator was Dr. Sri Nur Aminah Ngatimin, SP., M.Si., Secretary of the Department of HPT. The title of the presentation by Dr. Rizvi was: The Importance of Insects in The Transmission of Plant Diseases.

The event was held on Tuesday 14 February 2023, and was attended by the Dean and Vice Deans, lecturers and students of the Faculty of Agriculture. During his lecture, Dr. Rizvi explained the various types of insects that can become vectors of plant diseases in agricultural land, in particular ticks, leafhoppers, and several other types of insect pests. Insect vectors of plant disease can be very destructive because of their ability to damage plants as pests while also transmitting diseases from diseased plants to healthy plants. Studying the role and activities of insect vectors in agriculture is very important in order to achieve good quality, healthy and safe crops for public consumption.

IFSA INTERIM AND DEPARTMENTS MEETING 2023

The International Forestry Students' Association (IFSA) is the largest forestry students network in the world. The vision of this organization is "A World that Appreciates Forests" which describes the dream of having all the people and societies on the earth recognize the full worth of forests and fully understand forests, grasping their implications and being grateful for their multi-fold contributions to humanity. In regards to accomplishing its vision, IFSA enriches their members' education through international events, networking and intercultural exchange. One of the ways of reaching out the mission is equal opportunity to host the IFSA events.

Departments Meeting and Interim are the meetings held in the middle of the year of the terms. This is also a chance for officials and commissioners of IFSA to meet and discuss current issue about IFSA as the organization and the issue of forestry nowadays.

This year, IFSA LC UNHAS application to be the Interim Host is being accepted. Moreover, during the meeting preparation with IFSA board members, it is decided to integrate Interim and Departments Meeting. This is the first time IFSA integrates both meetings and also the first time ever that Interim is held outside Europe. That is also given IFSA such a pride that shows how inclusive the opportunity is. From the side of IFSA LC UNHAS itself as the newest organization in forestry faculty (we established in January 2021), this is a very remarkable experience to develop our capacity on delegating our voices on the International level. There were 7 delegates, namely: Desita Dyah D A Kusumaningrum (Head of Communication Commissions: IFSA LC IPB, IPB), Eylül Umay Külâh (Head of Tree-House Subcommittee: IFSA LC Istanbul, Istanbul University-Cerrahpaşa), Jean Laurence Reyes (Social Media Commissioner: AFFS- UPLB, University of the Philippines Los Baños), Isabelle Claire (Internal Councilor: AFFS-UPLB, University of the Philippines Los Baños), Salvatore Ruiiu (Southern Europe Regional Representative: AUSF Nuoro, Università di Sassari), Volodymyr Kravets (External Councilor: IFSA LC Copenhagen, University of Copenhagen), and Wening Ila Idzatilangi (Head of Cultural Competencies Sub-Commissions: IFSA LC UNHAS, Universitas Hasanuddin).

The Departments Meeting was being conducted on 2-3 February 2023, which consisted of all of the three departments, namely Membership Department, Internal Department, and External Department. After the meetings were over, IFSA LC UNHAS referred all of the IFSA delegates to do an excursion from 8 - 14 February 2023. The excursion consist went to Campus Tour, Educational Forest of Universitas Hasanuddin, Bantimurung Bulusaraung National Park, Rammang-Rammang, Balla' Lompoa, Fort Rotterdam, Museum of Makassar, Bosowa Beach, Panakkukang Mall (Cinema Time), and Pucak Teaching Farm.

Overall, the meeting was running well. All of the participants are so happy to visit Makassar and Maros. From the perspective of a forestry student, both of the delegates and the OC learn more about ecological vegetation in the marginal area that is in Karst. We also learn about wildlife of Wallacea in the educational forest with the help of Pak Husain (one of the educational forest staff). We learn a lot about plants in the arboretum, including the production of palm sugar from the demonstration of cooking the *Arenga pinnata*. We learn about Sulawesi heritage, where we make history connections with all of the delegates' countries. We learn about delegation and see every problem through many perspectives. As the Future Professional Forester, this is a very impactful step for us to shape our mind to create sustainable decisions for our forest together.






