# ABOUT UNHAS

Hasanuddin University, commonly known as Unhas, is named after a national hero of the Republic of Indonesia from South Sulawesi. Sultan Hasanuddin was a famous leader of the Islamic Sultanate of Gowa-Tallo. Born with the name Muhammad Bakir I Mallombasi Daeng Mattawang Karaeng Bonto Mangape, as Sultan of Gowa he earned the nickname "Rooster from the East" due to his bravery in resisting Dutch colonialism.

His philosophy of life is in line with the maritime vision of Hasanuddin University. His famous motto was *"Takunjunga' bangung turu', nakugunciri' gulingku, kualleangnga tallanga natoalia!"* (My sails are set and filled, my rudder is affixed, I'd rather sink than retreat!).

The philosophy of life, teachings and spirit of Sultan Hasanuddin are also enshrined in various university statutes and marks of the identity of Hasanuddin University. They have inspired names, vision statements and values, the flag, hymn, marches, and uniform (alma mater) blazer. Sultan Hasanuddin has also influenced core Unhas values and principles, in particular integrity, innovation, striving to serve as a catalyst and to seek wisdom.

Unhas is one of the few leading state universities in Indonesia with an autonomous legal entity (PTN-BH) status. Founded in 1956 and located in Makassar, the capital city of South Sulawesi Province, Unhas currently has 17 faculties offering various undergraduate and postgraduate programs. Unhas also offers international class programs in all faculties.

# WHAT TO PREPARE BEFORE COMING TO UNHAS

To make your journey smooth and comfortable as well as convenient, please read the following information:

## **Immigration**

Before your departure to Makassar in Indonesia, please make sure of your immigration status (<https://www.imigrasi.go.id/en/>).

## **Travel Arrangement**

1. According to the Immigration Office, international students wishing to continue his/her study in Indonesia must apply for one of the following visa types:

- Student Visa: VITAS 316 for students staying 2-6 months or more in Indonesia. For further information please visit: <https://studyinindonesia.kemdikbud.go.id/en/web/page/read/obtaining-student-visa>
- Social Visa: VKSB 211A for students staying less than 6 months. For further information please visit: <https://www.imigrasi.go.id/en/visa-kunjungan-satu-kali-perjalanan-b211a/>

## **Passport and Visa and Other Important Documents**

Make sure your passport and visa and other important documents are ready in plenty of time. Make sure these are on your top priority list.

## **Your Flight and Transit**

Your flight and transit. Please be aware of your flight to Indonesia including your transits and domestic flight to Makassar. Your flight might have transits in several airports. Be aware of the flight schedule, including the times in the local time at each airport. Please do not book/confirm your ticket until you have been notified by the International Office to do so.

## **Make Sure Your Arrival Time in Makassar is During The Office Hours.**

This is so that the International Office will be able to arrange to pick you up from the airport and take you to the campus. If you arrive outside office hours, you will have to arrange your travel from the airport to the campus yourself.

## **Some Amount of Money for the First Month**

For your first month in Makassar, please make sure you have a sufficient amount of money. It is recommended to bring around 3 times the average monthly living allowance for students in Makassar which is about IDR 2,500,000-3,500,000.-

## **Suitable Clothes**

Please bring clothes suitable for the tropical climate in Makassar. In addition, to respect local culture, please bring “modest” clothing as you will need to wear this type of clothing in most environments both on and off campus. For example, singlets, sleeveless tops/dresses, short skirts/pants, etc. and any see-through clothes are not appropriate or may even be forbidden in most places outside your room. If in doubt, consult the Unhas International office. In addition, please bring your national dress/traditional clothes if you have any as you may need these for events arranged by the Unhas International Office (IO).

# 1st WEEK AT UNHAS

## ***1st day***

Before your departure to Unhas, you are required to inform the International Office (IO) of your travel plans. If your arrival is within office hours, IO representatives will pick you up at the airport and escort you to your accommodation where you can leave your belongings. You will then need to go to the IO to report your arrival and to the Unhas Academic Department to complete some necessary academic administrative procedures. After this, you can take some rest after your long flight.

## ***2nd day***

We hope that you will have a good rest before starting your 2nd day. You have 2 main items on your agenda on this 2nd day. Firstly, you may need to change some currency to Indonesian Rupiah (IDR). There are several money changers around Unhas. The closest money changer to the campus is BMC Money Changer at Jl. Perintis Kemerdekaan No. KM 9. The next item on your list will be setting up your telecommunications device. You are required to register your mobile phone with a valid identification (IMEI). The IO will facilitate you with this process, and you may need to go to the telecommunication providers office in person with the IO representative. You can choose various services from different operators (Telkomsel, Indosat, XL, 3 and Smartfren). You can get a temporary SIM card now. To get a refillable Sim Card, you will need to bring your passport and your stay permit (once you have it). You will need your passport and money for purchasing the temporary SIM card and quota.





## ***3rd day***

On the 3rd day, you will need to give your passport to the IO officer to get your ITAS (stay permit). The IO will help you to fill in the forms and then they will send your application to the Immigration Office. Issuance will take around 2 weeks. During this time, you will be asked to come to the Immigration office to be photographed and have your finger prints taken. Around three days later, you will get your passport back and your electronic stay permit (ITAS) will be sent to your email.

## ***4th day***

On the 4th day you will go to your faculty and meet with the dean, lecturers, and staff. Your faculty will assist you to prepare your study plan and obtain your student ID.

## ***5th day***

On the 5th day, you will open your Indonesian bank account with the assistance of the IO. Please prepare the necessary documents, including your ID card, passport and visa and student ID. Unhas recommends BNI (Bank Negara Indonesia) for your bank account. The nearest BNI building is on the Tamalanrea campus, inside the University Hospital.

## ***6th day***

Student orientation is held at the beginning of the first semester. This is mandatory for all new students. Before attending the orientation, please read this student handbook beforehand. During the student orientation you will join various programs including an introduction to Unhas, the academic rules and ethics codes for students, immigration rules and regulations, an introduction to Bahasa Indonesia and some do's and don'ts for international students.

Please also make friends during your 1st week at Unhas!

# ACADEMIC RULES

## Here are some academic rules you need to know:

- The active academic period is divided into 2 (two) semesters each year, according to the Academic Calendar.
- Academic activities may include lectures, seminars, research, and thesis examinations.
- Each student is required to pay tuition fees before filling out a Semester Study Plan (Kartu Rencana Studi) online for the semester the student is going to participate in.
- Payment of tuition fees can be done through Automated Teller Machines (ATMs) or over the counter at designated banks.
- Students who do not re-register for one semester and intend to continue their studies in the following semester are required to pay arrears and/or tuition fees for the semester they did not participate in.
- Students who do not pay tuition fees for two consecutive semesters are declared as drop-outs.
- The curriculum for the Undergraduate Program must have a minimum of 144 credits and a maximum of 150 credits, with a maximum study period of 14 (fourteen) semesters.
- The number of credits that can be taken in one semester is a minimum of 12 credits and a maximum of 24 credits.
- Students are allowed to take less than 12 credits in one semester if all academic courses have been completed, and they only need to complete special courses such as Community Services (Kuliah Kerja Nyata), Field Practice, Research, Seminars, and/or Thesis.
- Students who do not register for courses are declared inactive in the related semester.
- Courses that can be undertaken by students are those offered during the current semester.
- The scheduled study period for the Undergraduate Program is 8 (eight) semesters and the program can be completed in a minimum of 6 (six) semesters and a maximum of 14 (fourteen) semesters.
- Undergraduate Program students who cannot complete their studies by the end of the 14th semester are declared drop-outs.
- Students can cancel one or more courses or exchange them for other courses that have been planned according to the schedule in the Academic Calendar.

# ACADEMIC RULES

- Requests for cancellation or exchange of one or more courses require the approval of the Academic Advisor, Head of Study Program, and Dean.
- Academic leave for 1 (one) semester is only given to students a maximum of two times during the study period, and is not allowed for two consecutive semesters and has never withdrawn from all courses during one semester.
- Academic leave as referred to in point 16 cannot be taken consecutively with withdrawal from all courses in the same semester as academic leave is not permitted in the first and second semesters.
- Students who are Unhas Scholarship recipients are not allowed to take academic leave.
- During academic leave, students are not allowed to participate in any academic activities in any form.
- The academic leave period is not included in the calculation of the study period.

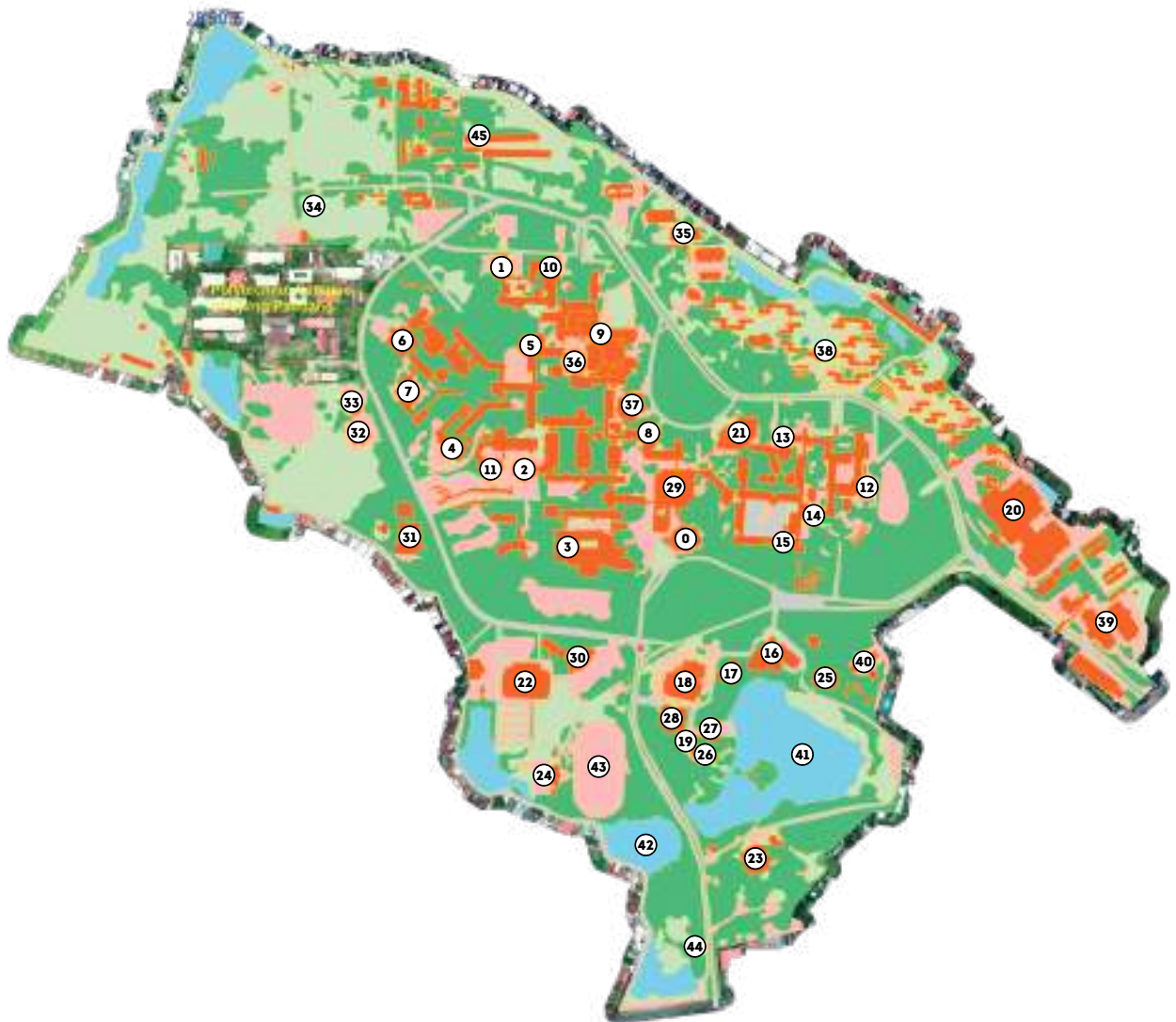

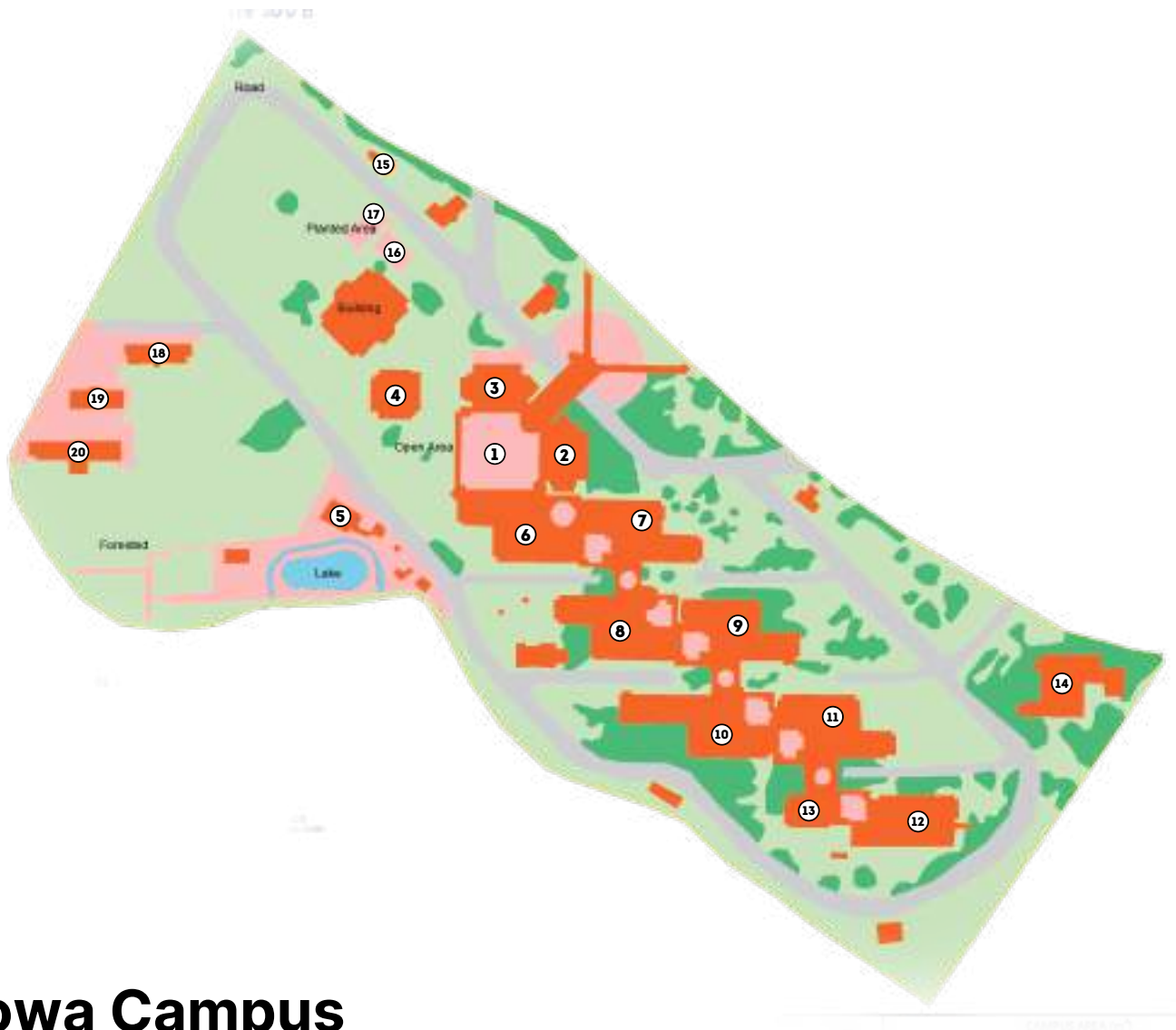

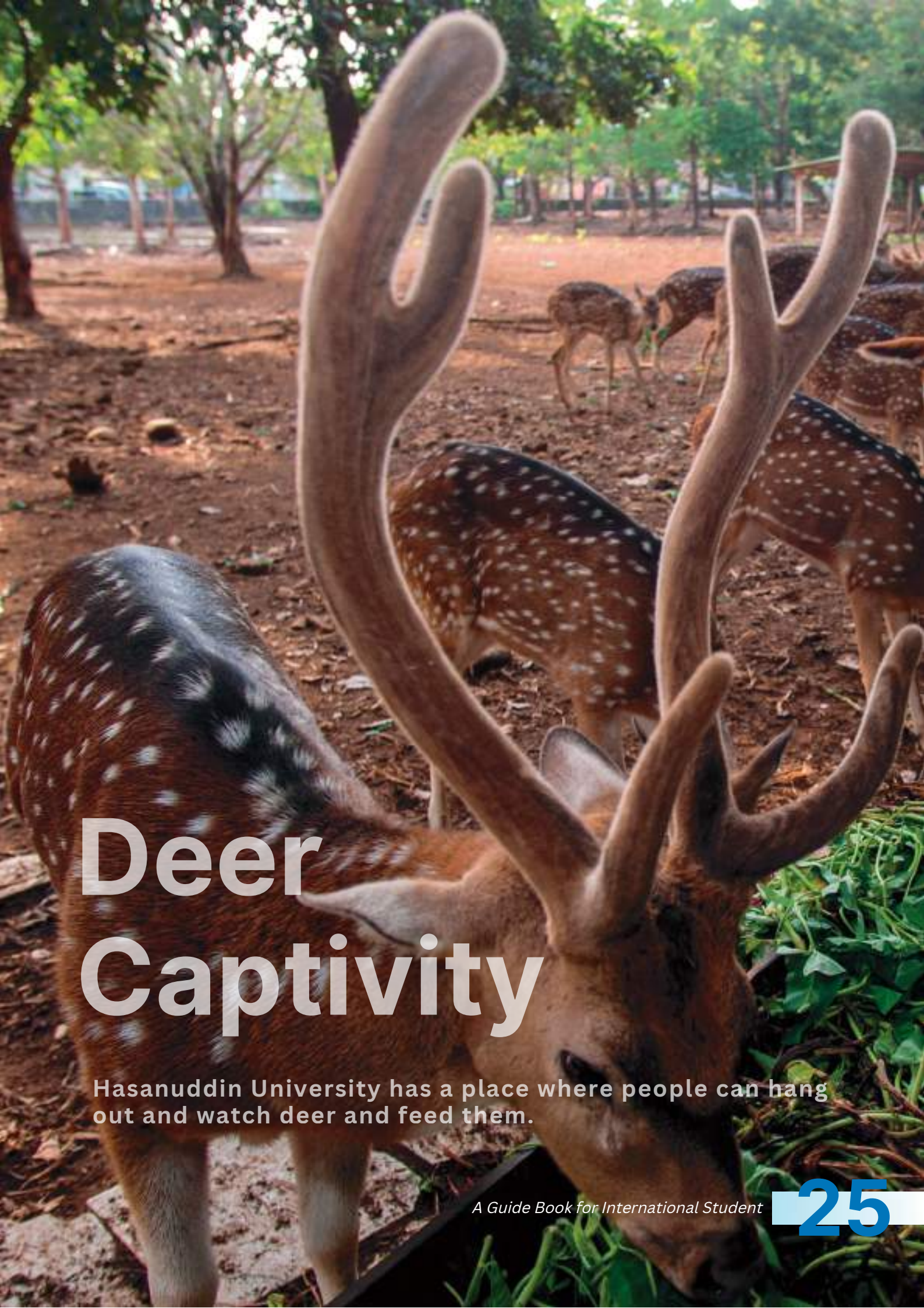
# Sport Center and Recreation

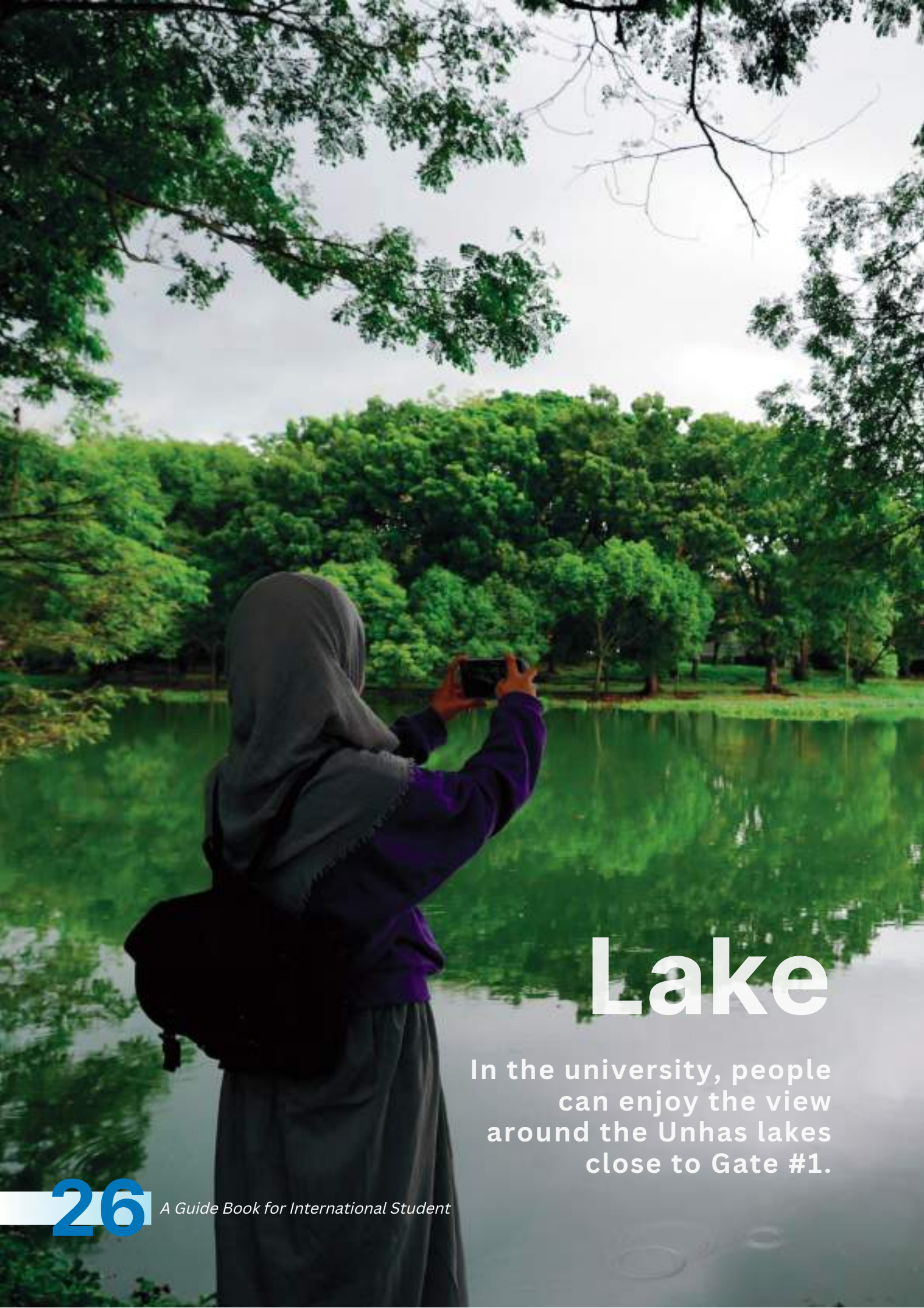
The Student Union building hosts an array of student clubs based on sports, art, and cultural interests. Sports venues include:

## RAMSIS

Campus Student Dormitories (Asrama Mahasiswa, commonly known as Ramsis) are located in front of the Faculty of Economics and Business and Faculty of Law. For international students, Unhas provides 2 blocks, block D and E. Two room types are available: single rooms or twin rooms with bunk beds. Each room has a bed or beds, a wardrobe, table, chair(s) and toilet. The rent fee is IDR 700.000,-. It is convenient to live in Ramsis with many food vendors nearby. There is also a dormitory available on the Gowa Campus.

## RUSUNAWA

The Student Apartments (Rumah Susun Sewa, commonly known as Rusunawa) are located in two areas: 1) in front of the Medical Faculty, and 2) behind the Dentistry Teaching Hospital, on the Tamalanrea Campus. This is a higher-grade housing option for Unhas students and guests. The monthly rent range is IDR 1.200.000-1.700.000. In the Rusunawa rooms, facilities provided include bed(s), a table and chair(s), a wardrobe, a bathroom and, in some units, an air-conditioning unit and/or a small balcony.

## WISMA

Unhas Tamalanrea Wisma (homestay) stands in a strategic location inside the Unhas Tamalanrea campus. The Tamalanrea Wisma provides two types of rooms, namely Standard Room and VIP Room. Each room has facilities such as air-conditioning or a fan, single or double bed, and a private bathroom. This facility is used mostly for Unhas guests.





## **UNHAS HOTEL AND CONVENTION CENTER**

Unhas Hotel and Convention Centre is a newly-built facility located in the heart of Unhas Tamalanrea. The hotel offers truly convenient rooms for guests to stay and enjoy nature. The hotel also provides meeting rooms for business meetings and ballrooms for seminars, conferences, and other large events.

## **OTHER ACCOMODATIONS**

Tamalanrea and Gowa campus are surrounded by residential areas where a range of private student housing is available off-site. Many students find convenient housing options that meet their needs and budget.

## BUS (TEMAN BUS)

Teman Bus is a Rapid Transit Bus (BRT) that operates in Makassar and some nearby areas (<https://temanbus.com/makassar/>). It is a good way to move around Makassar for just IDR 4,600 on all routes, including the routes to the Unhas Gowa campus. You can get on Teman Bus at any of the 28 designated bus stops, and you can track the bus schedule using its mobile phone application also called Teman Bus. You can also use this application in other cities where Teman Bus operates, like Yogyakarta, Solo, Bali, Medan, and Palembang.

## PETE-PETE (MINIBUS)

The Pete-pete or mikrolet minibus is the most common form of public transport in Makassar. There are various pete-pete routes serving Makassar City. The codes for pete-pete routes that serve Unhas Tamalanrea Campus are 02, 05, and 07.

It is easy to get on board a pete-pete. Generally, if you wave at the pete-pete, the driver will stop in front of you unless it is full, or the driver is not currently working. If you are standing on the side of the road, the driver often thinks you are going to take the pete-pete. If you do not want to take it, you can ignore it, then the driver will drive away, or you can shake your head to indicate you do not want to ride in it now.

If you decide to take a pete-pete, when you get close to or reach your destination, you just have to say "kiri" (to the left in English) to the driver. Make sure they can hear your signal because sometimes the pete-pete is noisy due to the music played by the driver and/or the traffic. You can also tell the driver where you are going, so he will stop and let you off at the right place. The current price is IDR 9,000.



## ONLINE TRANSPORT

In this digital era, it is often easier to move around campus and Makassar using online transport services. You can access these through mobile applications on your smartphone. Online transport can be by car or motorcycle. Students and the public often use motorcycles to move around since traffic in Makassar can be bad, especially during the morning and the late afternoon rush hours. There are several operators that provide online transport services in Makassar, in particular Gojek, Grab and Maxim.

## BECAK AND BENTOR

A becak is a three-wheeled man powered vehicle that is still often used in Makassar for transportation over short distances. There is also a hybrid version of a becak with a motorcycle called a bentor (becak-motor) that is increasingly common in Makassar. The bentor has the advantage of being faster and able to travel for longer distances.



## TAXIS

Metered taxis are not as easy to find as before since there are many online modes of transport nowadays. Taking a metered taxi could be as reliable as using a personal car, with the meter (argo in Indonesia) usually starting around IDR 15,000,-. There are also taxi operators that use mobile phone applications to run their services.

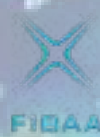

# MAKASSAR CITY

Indonesia is an archipelagic state consisting of 17,000 islands. Indonesia is strategically located between Asia and Australia, and between India and the Pacific Ocean. Indonesia is a diverse country with around 700 ethnic groups. Indonesia is ranked as the fourth most densely populated nation globally.
