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THE FACULTY OF PUBLIC HEALTH, HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY ORGANIZES A GUEST LECTURE SERIES IN EPIDEMIOLOGY



The Faculty of Public Health (FKM), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) held a Guest Lecture series in Epidemiology on October 24, 2023. This was a part of events in celebrating the 41st Anniversary of FKM UNHAS. The guest lecture theme was "Cardiovascular Prediction Models can help to prevent cardiovascular events effectively." The activity was held hybridly at the Prof. Nur Nasry Noor Hall, 2nd floor, FKM building.

The distinguisehed guest speaker for this event was Steven H.J. Hageman, MD, Ph.D. an Associate-Professor in The Department of Vascular Medicine University Medical Center Utrecht, the Netherlands. The event commenced with an official opening remarks from Prof. Sukri Palutturi, SKM, M.Kes, M.Sc.PH, Ph. (Dean of FKM). In his remarks, Prof. Sukri expressed his appreciation to Dr. Hageman for sharing invaluable insights regarding cardiovascular disease (CVD) prevention with the participants, especially in efforts to predict and prevent future risk for cardiovascular events.

The program proceeded with a presentation by Dr. Steven H.J. Hageman, MD, Ph.D., wherein he provided a comprehensive overview of cardiovascular disease. Additionally, Dr. Hageman elaborated on the risk prediction model that had been developed to identify individuals who stand to benefit the most from early detection and prevention measures, and he explained the parameters used in this model. Towards the end of the session, he underscored the necessity of recalibrating the model to enhance its effectiveness in the local target population.

The event continued with a discussion led by a faculty member from the Department of Epidemiology at FKM UNHAS, Dian Sidik Arsyad. During this session, participants demonstrated great enthusiasm by actively engaging in a thought-provoking question-and-answer session. As a concluding remark, Dian Sidik Arsyad emphasized the paramount importance of high-quality data derived from robust research and cohorts to support the success of evidence-based cardiovascular prevention strategies.

This October, six student volunteers (Stuvo) from the International Office (IO), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) were selected as Liaison Officer (LO) and Supporting Staff (SS) in the ASEAN High-Level Forum on Disability-Inclusive Development and Partnership Beyond 2023. The Ministry of Social Affairs of the Republic of Indonesia organized the event as a series of ASEAN Chairmanship 2023 by Indonesia for three days at the Four Points Hotel by Sheraton, Makassar, Indonesia. Additionally, the event was attended by 300 delegates of the ASEAN Ministerial Meeting for Social Welfare and Development (AMMSWD) and Senior Officials Meeting on Social Welfare and Development (SOMSWD) from all ASEAN Countries alongside the United States of America, United Kingdom, and Australia.

The successfully selected Stuvo were Ibnu Alif Daffa Gymnastiar as an LO for Singapore delegation, Fiorella Lie as an LO for the Philippines Delegation, Gilang Nurjihad as an LO for Timor Leste Delegation, Nurul Fathanah as an LO for ASEAN Disability Forum Delegation, Muhammad Farid as Person in Charge (PIC) in Exhibition, and Muhammad Indra as PIC US-ASEAN High-Level Dialogue, they were chosen after a rigorous selection process through essays and interviews.

The output of this event was the Makassar recommendation, which serves as a reference for foreign and domestic policies for ASEAN countries to collaborate and commit to improving the inclusiveness of aspects of life, especially for people with disabilities.
