THE WUR RANKING PLACES UNHAS IN THE 6TH NATIONAL RANK



Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) has once again risen in the national ranking of universities. According to Prof. Sumbangan Baja, the University's Secretary, UNHAS currently stands at 6th place in Indonesia when it comes to the country's higher education institutions. This is three places higher than it was in 2022, when it was ranked ninth.

This good achievement, continued Prof. Sumbangan, is due to the hard work of all parties at all levels of the university who continue to strive to advance UNHAS. "Of course we thank all parties, especially the Unhas academic community, for their achievements, which are the main indicators in Times Higher Education (THE) World University Ranking (WUR)," said Prof. Sumbangan.

The university's impressive rise in the national ranking is attributed to the continuous efforts of its various stakeholders. In addition to the academic community, the university's secretary also thanked the other parties for their contributions to the institution's success.

Aside from the WUR, the secretary noted that another impressive achievement was the release of the Impact Rankings, which had placed UNHAS in the 9th spot, which is two places higher than its position from the previous year. Commenting on the achievement, Professor Sumbangan said that UNHAS' continuous improvement has been acknowledged by the public.

Furthermore, he said that the five main factors that influence the ranking of UNHAS are the learning environment, research, international outlook, knowledge transfer, and the influence of research. The university has been able to develop the 13 performance indicators that were included in the WUR by looking at its potential. These indicators will be improved over time.





FACULTY OF DENTISTRY INTERNATIONAL CLASS HOLDS SIT-IN PROGRAM IN TAIWAN



Faculty of Dentistry (FKG) of Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) conducts sit-in activities all around the world. This year, it's being held in Malaysia, Taiwan, and Japan. Sixteen students and four instructors participated in the activities at different universities.

One of the destination countries for this activity is Taiwan. Sit-in acceptance activities at Taipei Medical University (TMU), Taiwan, were held in the Meeting Room of the College of Oral Medicine (3/7/2023). 



TWO UNHAS STUDENTS PARTICIPATE IN THE 2023 SOCIOVATION PROGRAM IN SINGAPORE





MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN DEPARTMENT OF ARCHEOLOGY, FACULTY OF CULTURAL SCIENCES, UNHAS AND DEPARTMENT OF ARCHEOLOGY, GRIFFITH UNIVERSITY, AUSTRALIA



A Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) between the Department of Archaeology, Griffith University (GU), and the Department of Archaeology, UNHAS, was officially signed on Monday, July 10, 2023, at the Dean's Office of the Faculty of Cultural Sciences (FIB). Prof. Adam Brumm and David Paul Mc.Gahan represented GU. From the FIB, besides the Dean, Prof. Akin Duli, M.A., other parties that also attended, namely the Head of FIB Archaeology Study Program, Dr. Rosmawati, M.Hum., Dr.Supriadi, M.A., Dr. Muh Nur, M.A., Dr. Yadi Mulyadi, M.A., and Dr. Khadijah Thahir, M.Hum and staff from the department. Other parties who attended were from Badan Riset dan Inovasi Nasional (BRIN) or National Research and Innovation Agency of Makassar, Drs. Budianto Hakim (he is a Practitioner lecturer from Archaeology), and Basran Burhan, S.S.

The Dean of FIB, Prof. Akin Duli, M.A., stated that the two institutions would cooperate in education, research, and community service combined. Implementing the programs would be held in Leang Leang and Paningnge, Maros Regency, which would last two months, involving lecturers from the Department of Archeology, UNHAS, and undergraduate and postgraduate students. The Australian team consists of three lecturers, and later, masters students would join the team as well.

FACULTY OF CULTURAL SCIENCES' LECTURER DELIVERS A GUEST LECTURE IN UNIVERSITI KEBANGSAAN MALAYSIA



The Institut Kajian Etnik or Institute for Ethnic Studies, the University Kebangsaan Malaysia (KITA-UKM) held the SIRI WACANA KITA Bil.4/2023 on 5 July 2023 at the KITA Mesyuarat Room, Universitas Kebangsaan Malaysia, Bangi, Selangor, Malaysia with the theme Ethnography and Semiotics of Bugis Culture. The visiting lecturer as the sole speaker in this activity was Dr. Firman Saleh, S.S., S.Pd., M. Hum., lecturer in the Department of Buginese and Makassarese Language at the Faculty of Cultural Sciences (FIB) UNHAS. This activity was attended by lecturers and students, both undergraduate and postgraduate students, which were carried out in a hybrid where some attended directly in the room and some attended online via the Zoom meeting.

Apart from being attended by KITA UKM Malaysia lecturers and students, this activity was also attended by Andrew Carruthers, Assistant Professor of Anthropology, University of Pennsylvania. The Distinguished International Professor, UKM, Prof. Dr. James T. Collins, also participated in this activity. The material presented at the SIRI WACANA KITA UKM activity described the concept of life and death of indigenous peoples that became a convention that was understood, trusted, and believed to be a symbol of custom that was carried out by the community and passed down from generation to generation.

The concept of life and death of the To Lotang indigenous people is symbolized in their homes; the conventionalism built since then has colored the culture of the Bugis people in Sidrap Regency, South Sulawesi. The symbolization of doors and windows in the *To Lotang* indigenous people's homes becomes conventionalism in life and death. Meanwhile, the concept of life and death of the Kajang indigenous people is symbolized in the clothes they wear every day, which becomes their conventionalism or understandings that were conventionalized by the community, the principle of life which is represented in black and white clothes.

Adi Maulana, S.T., M.Phil, and the Secretary of the Institute for Quality Assurance and Educational Development (LPPM), Rini Rachmawaty, S.Kep., Ns., MN, PhD, participated in the Higher Education Partnership Initiative (HEPI) University Partnership Forum sponsored by USAID and implemented by Arizona State University (ASU) held at the Grand Sahid Hotel, Jakarta.

The aim of this forum was to share the implementation of the USAID HEPI program conducted in the three hub universities: UNHAS, BINUS, and ITB to the new affiliate universities. On the first day, Prof. Adi shared about the best practices for leveraging potential partnerships to develop academic program partnerships and pathways with US STEM Universities. Around 36 participants from nine new affiliate universities also participated in this international forum. Through this forum, UNHAS and HEPI have agreed to some mutual benefits in order to achieve the five-year work plans of partnerships.

The scope of cooperation that would be carried out includes student and lecturer exchanges, research, and research training. The activity took place smoothly and continued with discussions on implementing future collaborations.



The Faculty of Cultural Sciences (FIB) UNHAS, in collaboration with the Australian Consul General in Makassar, Ikatan Alumni Australia (IKAMA) - Australian Alumni Association of South Sulawesi, the Australian National University, and the Australia-Indonesia Center, held a public lecture with the theme "Makassar as the Central City? Revealing the position of Makassar City as a Site Center from Century to Century". This public lecture presented Prof. Emeritus Campbell Macknight (Australian National University, Canberra), who is a cultural anthropologist. The event took place at 10am Central Indonesia Time (CIT) in the Prof. Mattulada Hall, FIB UNHAS, Tamalanrea, Makassar, on Thursday, 20 July 2023. Present at the event were the Australian Consul General in Makassar (Todd Dias), the University Secretary (Prof. Ir. Sumbangan Baja, M.Phil., Ph.D.), the deanship of the FIB, and several relevant service heads.

Starting the activity, Vice Dean for Academic and Student Affairs Dr. Mardi Adi Armin, M.Hum., representing the Dean, expressed his gratitude for the speaker's willingness to share his knowledge and experience at UNHAS. He said that activities like this exist as a medium for discussion and to increase the information and knowledge of the participants, especially students. According to him, the theme of the debate is fascinating and in line with the large amount of historical evidence found in South Sulawesi. "Thank you to the committee who had prepared this event, especially Prof. Campbell, who was always openly involved in various academic activities".

"He immediately said yes when we asked him to share his knowledge with UNHAS students. For that, we hope the participants can participate well in the activity," explained Dr. Mardi. SEAWEED FORUM STRENGTHENS BILATERAL COLLABORATION IN INDONESIA - AUSTRALIA SEAWEED INDUSTRY



On Friday, 21 July 2023, in collaboration with the Australia-Indonesia Center (AIC), UNHAS successfully conducted a key Seaweed Forum aimed at fostering cooperation and innovation in the seaweed industry between Australia and Indonesia. The event, held in Meeting Room A on the 4th floor of the Rectorate Building at UNHAS, elicited enthusiastic participation from key stakeholders, experts, and government officials from both countries.

The forum, led by Dr. Hasanawati Saleh (AIC), began with a warm welcome from Dr. Asmi Citra Malina, the UNHAS Director for Innovation, who expressed her delight at the growing partnership between Indonesia and Australia in addressing climate change challenges through seaweed research and development.

A highlight of the event was the enlightening presentation on "The Use of Asparagopsis as a Livestock Feed Ingredient to Curb Climate Change" by Tony Eyres and James Stewart from CSIRO-Future Feed, Australia. Their research showcased the potential of seaweed as a viable solution to mitigate greenhouse gas emissions from livestock, a crucial step in combating climate change.

Dr. Kasmiati from the Seaweed Research Centre (PUI-P2RL) briefly introduced the center's work, shedding light on the Centre's ongoing research and initiatives in the seaweed sector. This was followed by a presentation from Dr. Jamaluddin Fitrah Alam on the DFAT-funded PAIR (Partnership for Australia-Indonesia Research) entitled "Unleashing the seaweed industry's trade potential between Indonesia and Australia."

A lively discussion and Q&A session ensued, allowing attendees to delve deeper into the topics presented, exchange ideas, and explore potential avenues for collaboration. The participation of key figures from both countries added immense value to the forum, including Mr. Todd Dias, the Consul General of Australia in Makassar, and representatives from Future Feed Australia, Trade and Investment Queensland (TIQ), and the South Sulawesi Marine and Fisheries Service (DKP Sulsel).

The closing remarks reiterated the significance of bilateral collaboration in the seaweed industry. Dr. Muh Ilyas, the Head of DKP Sulsel, expressed his appreciation for the joint efforts and stressed the importance of sustainable seaweed practices. Mr. Todd Dias, the Consul General of Australia in Makassar, emphasized the commitment of both nations to support and strengthen the seaweed industry for a greener future.

The event also witnessed the participation of various institutions and organizations, including researchers from PUI-P2RL, as well as representatives from prominent seaweed businesses in Makassar, such as PT. Jaringan Sumber Daya (JASUDA), PT Bantimurung Indah, and seaweed associations like ARLI, ASPERLI, and ASTRULI. Their presence further emphasized the importance of the forum in fostering a thriving seaweed industry.

Following the forum, a field trip was organized to Kabupaten Takalar, the center of seaweed production in South Sulawesi. Representatives from Future Feed and the AIC, accompanied by UNHAS researchers, were given a firsthand experience of the seaweed cultivation process, witnessing the practices employed by local farmers and gaining valuable insights into the challenges faced by the industry.

The Seaweed Forum organized by UNHAS and the AIC proved pivotal in fostering cooperation and innovation in the sustainable seaweed industry. With joint efforts, both countries aim to lead the way in harnessing the potential of seaweed as a vital resource in combating climate change and promoting economic growth.







COLLABORATIVE RESEARCH ON BLUE SWIMMER CRAB RESTOCKING BY FIKP UNHAS, SERC, AND UMCES



On Friday, 21 July 2023, a momentous collaboration was set in motion at the Faculty of Marine Science and Fisheries, Hasanuddin University (FIKP UNHAS). The Dean of FIKP Unhas welcomed researchers from the Smithsonian Environmental Research Center (SERC) and the Center for Environmental Science, University of Maryland: Robert Aguilar, Henry Legett, and Oded Zmora. The purpose of their visit was to initiate collaborative research with the theme: "Stock Enhancement: Strategic Approach for the Blue Swimming Crab (Portunus pelagicus) in Indonesia."

This collaborative research brings together the expertise of 8 USA researchers and 9 UNHAS researchers. The research will be conducted over three years and will focus on Parepare Bay, a critical location for studying the blue swimming crab in Indonesia.

The background behind this research stems from the alarming decline in blue swimmer crab populations worldwide. The decreasing number and size of crabs caught indicate over-exploitation, posing a significant threat to the sustainability of this valuable natural resource and the associated industry. In response to this challenge, Rob and Henry from the visiting team will share their experiences with responsible re-stocking efforts that have successfully restored blue crab (*Callinectes sapidus*) populations in Chesapeake Bay.

Prof. Yushinta Fujaya, a researcher from UNHAS, will be the principal investigator for this study. The research aims to explore and implement strategic approaches to enhance the stock of blue swimming crabs, thereby contributing to the conservation of this species and the livelihoods of those dependent on the fishery.

This collaborative endeavor is not limited to the researchers themselves; it will also involve the active participation of at least 20 undergraduate and graduate students. These students will be engaged in the research as part of their final projects, providing them with valuable hands-on experience in marine conservation and management.

The joint efforts of the Smithsonian Environmental Research Center, University of Maryland Center for Environmental Science, and FIKP UNHAS are expected to yield significant insights into blue swimming crab stock enhancement and conservation strategies. This research endeavor marks a crucial step in safeguarding marine biodiversity and supporting sustainable fisheries practices in Indonesia and beyond.

FACULTY OF NURSING HOLDS BASIC TRAINING FOR COMMUNITY HEALTH CADRES IN COLLABORATION WITH THE INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATION FOR MIGRATION



The Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) Faculty of Nursing (FKep) held the Basic Training for Community Health Cadres from 18-28 July 2023 as part of the program officially opened by UNHAS Secretary Prof. Sumbangan Baja on 27 June 2023. This training was conducted under a collaboration between FKep UNHAS and the International Organization for Migration (IOM). The participants were 30 refugees and asylum seekers. The program aimed to train them to serve as first aid providers in the refugee and asylum seeking communities.

On the first day, 18 July 2023, participants were given a pre-test to measure their initial knowledge. The results were later compared with their post-test scores on the last day of the program to determine the effectiveness of this training.








On Monday, 17 July 2023, the Dean of the UNHAS Faculty of Medicine (FK), Prof. Dr. Dr. Haerani Rasyid, Sp.PD-KGH, Sp.GK, FINASIM, accompanied by the Head of the Center for Publications, Community Service and International Affairs, Dr. Dr.Rina Masadah, M.Phil, Sp.PA(K), signed a Memorandum of Agreement with Prof. Toshiyuki Someya, MD, PhD, the Dean of the Faculty of Medicine, Niigata University, Japan.

The initial collaboration was a student exchange to be carried out in July and August 2023 where 2 Niigata students would come to FK (inbound students) and five outbound FK UNHAS students would go to Niigata to join the *Kuliah Kerja Nyata* (KKN) or international student community service program. Prof. Toshiyuki Someya also gave a guest lecture at the Department of Psychiatry for faculty and resident staff of the Psychiatry Study Program, conducted discussions on psychiatric cases, and explored research collaboration in the field of Mental Health Sciences.



SCIENTIST FROM HARVARD MEDICAL SCHOOL DELIVERS PUBLIC LECTURE TO UNHAS PHARMACY STUDENTS AND ACADEMICS



As one endeavour to update knowledge in the field of pharmaceutical sciences, the Faculty of Pharmacy at Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) held a public lecture online on 18 July 2023, inviting a lecturer from one of the most prestigious universities in the world. Dr. Novalia Pishesha Tjandrasaputra presented her work on immune engineering and its relation to the precision antigen presentation pathway. Dr. Novalia Tjandrasaputra is a Junior Fellow, Society of Fellows, Harvard University, an Instructor in the Hidde L. Ploegh Laboratory at the Boston Children's Hospital (BCH), and is now an associate professor at Harvard Medical School.

The lecture was guided by our moderator, Nurhasni Hasan, Ph.D. The speaker began by giving an overview of the immune system and how antigen-presenting cells work. From this concept, Dr. Novalia Tjandrasaputra went on to explain how specific cells can be programmed so that we can control the mechanisms by which antigens are recognized. During the discussion session, several questions were asked by the audience. In particular, some were related to the audience's interest in exploring in greater depth the use of certain medications (e.g. dexamethasone) for altering the immune response of cells, as mentioned during the talk. The enthusiastic reactions of the audience reflected how encouraging the talk given by Dr. Novalia Tjandrasaputra was to the academics and students attending the lecture.

The online lecture was intended for academics and students from Hasanuddin University. However, the moderator reported that the audience came from UNHAS as well as students and lecturers from neighboring universities. Therefore, the Vice Rector of Partnership, Innovation, Entrepreneurship, and Business, Prof. Adi Maulana, took this opportunity to express a massive appreciation to Dr. Novalia Tjandrasaputra for being a speaker in this online public lecture. The Dean of the Faculty of Pharmacy, Prof Dr. rer. nat. Marianti A Manggau, Apt., also recognized the significant contribution of Dr. Novalia Tjandrasaputra in presenting her work to our academic community. This type of educational environment is expected to continue to expand in the near future.

The breakthrough "Global Visit" of the Unhas Faculty of Economics Alumni Association (IKAFE) in Kazakhstan and Uzbekistan, 12-19 July 2023, generated a great result. "Achievements, network expansion, trade missions, education, culture, and religion far exceeded expectations when this program was formulated," said Hendra Noor Saleh, General Chairperson of IKAFE UNHAS, and Secretary General Moh. Suaib Mappasila, who are both doctoral students at the Faculty of Economics and Business (FEB) UNHAS, while at Magic Park in Tashkent, the capital of Uzbekistan, which was the last item on the agenda before returning to Indonesia.

The unique atmosphere was immediately felt upon landing at Nursultan Nazarbayev Airport, Astana, Kazakhstan. Indonesian Ambassadors to Kazakhstan and Tajikistan, Dr. Mochammad Fadjroel Rachman, Mrs. Poppy Rachman, and embassy staff warmly welcomed the IKAFE UNHAS team. "If you follow the protocol, ambassadors only pick up guests at the airport; they must be of ministerial grade and above. But for IKAFE Unhas and the rest of the team, the Ambassador made an exception," said Andi Zulkarnaen, secretary of the Indonesian Ambassador to Kazakhstan and Tajikistan.

The main agenda of IKAFE UNHAS was to actively participate in the inaugural "Indonesia Summer Festival and Mini Expo" at the Cultural House of the Indonesian Embassy in Astana, 14-16 July 2023. The opening of the event was lively and proud. Several officials attended, including the Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs of Kazakhstan Kanat Tumysh, Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs Kanat Tumush, Deputy Chairman of *Majelis Ulama Indonesia* (MUI) or Indonesian Council of Ulamas of Kazakhstan Kenzhegale Merzabaev and hundreds of VIP guests from Kazakhstan as well as an Indonesian delegation of more than 50 people. Apart from IKAFE UNHAS, delegates from the Regional Government of East Kalimantan, the *Institut Seni Indonesia* (ISI) or Indonesian Arts Institute from Yogya campus, Yogyakarta State University, Forum *HMI*-wati (Forhati) or Female Islamic Students AlumniAssociation, Hanida, several national people in business, [M1] and other Very Important Persons (VIPs). The initiative for this event was motivated by the spirit of celebrating 30 years of diplomatic relations between Indonesia and Kazakhstan, as well as 25 years of the City of Astana, and being grateful for the Sister City of the Archipelago Capital and Astana which was signed on 3 July 2023,[M2] said Fadjroel Rachman.

Ambassador Fadjroel also outlined the benefits of holding the Indonesia Summer Festival and Mini Expo. "In the context of cultural diplomacy, this activity was a cultural dialogue between two friendly countries, Indonesia and Kazakhstan. By signing the MoU, this activity also strengthens the diplomacy of education, arts, culture, and sports, especially Pencak Silat (a traditional Indonesian self-defense sport)."

One after another, Kazakh guests came to get information. Even the SME products on display sold out in a matter of hours. "Wow, the potential is huge. VISIT OF JAPANESE SCIENCES AND TECHNOLOGY RESEARCH PARTNERSHIP FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM COORDINATOR TO UNHAS



The visit of the Program Coordinator of the Japanese Sciences and Technology Research Partnership for Sustainable Development (SATREPS) was related to the Collaboration Project that won the SATREPS grant. SATREPS was represented by the Program Coordinator, Prof. Dr. Sosaku Ichikawa, and Senior Program Advisor, Prof. Mitsutoshi Nakajima. The main purpose of the visit to Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) on 29 and 30 July 2023 was to observe one of the program activity sites in Takalar Regency. In addition, the Project Design Matrix (PDM) and Tentative Plan of Operation (PO) were discussed with the UNHAS Coordinator, Senior Advisor, and team involved in this research collaboration (Prof. Dr. Eng. Adi Maulana, S.T., M.Phil.; Prof. dr. Muh. Nasrum Massi, Ph.D., Sp. MK.; Prof. Dr. Ir. Ambo Tuwo, DEA; Prof. Dr. Ir. Joeharnani Tresnati, DEA., and Dr. Inayah Yasir, M.Sc.). The results of this meeting will be discussed further by the funders of this collaborative project, namely the Japanese Science and Technology Agency (JST), the Japanese Agency for Medical Research and Development (AMED), and the Japanese International Cooperation Agency (JICA) in Tokyo, Japan.

The Rector of UNHAS, Prof. Dr. Ir. Jamaluddin Jompa, M.Sc., expressed his full support. Long before the visit of the SATREPS, the Rector had provided support in building and renovating research facilities that would be used to implement this research collaboration.

The research collaboration project that won the SATREPS grant for these five years (2024-2029) is entitled "The Project for Development of Sustainable Seaweed-Based Functional Foods for Achieving Blue Economic Goals." This project proposal was prepared collaboratively by three educational and research institutions: the University of Tsukuba (UT), UNHAS, and the *Badan Riset dan Inovasi Nasional* (BRIN) or National Research and Innovation Agency. In this project, four areas of study will be developed. The first field is surveying seaweed resources, creating databases, studying cultivation methods, and producing quality seaweed seeds and seedlings. The second field is the analysis of chemical components, identification and analysis of functional elements, research and evaluation of seaweed functionality, and survey of seaweed applications as ingredients in functional foods, cosmetics, and medicines. The third field is the study of post-harvest processing techniques and preservation, extraction of active ingredients from Seaweed, their commercialization and characterization, and the fourth field is the development and evaluation of social implementation scenarios in the seaweed industry from upstream to downstream.

At the end of the visit, to commemorate the meeting with the SATREPS Program Coordinator and Senior Advisor at the UNHAS Hotel, the Rector launched the "Seaweed Initiative" - "No Day Without Seaweed" on the food menu at the UNHAS Hotel. By consuming seaweed, we have contributed to these five things. The two-day meeting was facilitated by the Rector's Strategic Planning advisor, the Head of the UNHAS Center for Climate Change, Dr. Rijal Idrus, M.Sc.





FACULTY OF DENTISTRY STUDENT REPRESENTS UNHAS IN THE BIOFARMA X MASSACHUSETTS INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY HACKING MEDICINE COMPETITION



Bio Farma Group will hold Bio Farma x MIT Hacking Medicine in Bali on August 24 – 27 2023. INTERNATIONAL OFFICE HOLDS A 3-DAY VOTING FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS ASSOCIATION



In a historic initiative, the International Office (IO) of Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) facilitated the formation of the first-ever International Students Association (ISA) at UNHAS. Recognizing the importance of fostering a sense of community and representation among the diverse international student body, the IO UNHAS took the lead in establishing the ISA. The association aims to provide a platform for international students to voice their concerns, share experiences, and promote cultural exchange within the university.

Recognizing the importance of democratic representation, the IO organized a three-day voting period, from 17th to 19th July 2023, for the election of the ISA President. Voters were required to cast their ballots using designated emails, ensuring a transparent and fair voting process. The IO remained committed to upholding the principles of democracy and inclusivity throughout the election, hoping to empower the newly elected ISA President to lead the association and cater to the diverse needs of international students at UNHAS. The Head of IO, Dr. Andi Masyitha Irwan, explained that voting aimed to elect the candidate to be the President of the ISA. The existence of ISA plays a vital role in organizing international students' activities, aiming to build cohesion and strengthen relationships among students from various countries and cultures. She also emphasized that ISA allows students to exercise their leadership skills, which will benefit their future professional careers.

After three days of voting, the results placed Kanchul Louis in the first position with the most votes. He and the other three candidates will form the leadership team for this organization. Kancul would have to discuss the work plan for a year of service with the other three candidates. The IO congratulated Kanchul Louis and wished him the best in his favor.

In addition, the candidate must present a letter of recommendation from their Academic Advisor or Head of Department. The final aspect of the requirement is the ability to work in a team.

Looking back to the volunteer batch 1, the IO recruited 14 local students from various faculties, including 2 international students from the Faculty of Medicine (FK). During their service time, the volunteers were exposed to global events, such as being a committee member for guest lectures, public lectures, international meetings, etc. In addition, they also went through a workshop called Building Capacity of Student Volunteers where they received great sessions from practitioners and professionals, in areas such as hospitality and volunteering for university students.

The IO also sent volunteers abroad to build their capacity, such as the sociovation event held in Singapore in June 2023. Several volunteers were also sent to the student camp held by the Nationwide University Network Indonesia (NUNI), where students from various member universities carried out activities based on the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).
