RECTOR OF HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY WELCOMES THE PRESIDENT OF MANAGEMENT AND SCIENCES UNIVERSITY, MALAYSIA



The Rector of Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), Prof. Jamaluddin Jompa, M.Sc., or Prof. JJ, welcomed the President of Management and Sciences University (MSU), Prof. Tan Sri Dato' Wira Dr. Mohd Shukri Ab. Yajid, along with the entourage on Wednesday, 2 August 2023, on the 8th floor of the Rectorate Building. Prior to this visit, the President of MSU met the Dean of the Faculty of Medicine (FK), Prof. Dr. Haerani Rasyid, M.Kes., Sp.PD-KGH., Sp.GK, FINASIM, to establish academic collaboration. Another official attending this reception was the Vice Rector for Partnership, Innovation, Entrepreneurship, and Business, Prof. Adi Maulana, M.Phil.

Prof. Tan said: "My visit this time was a return visit by the Rector of UNHAS previously to Malaysia. Apart from that, my visit was also the signing of a collaboration with the *Assosiasi Institusi Pendidikan Kedokteran Indonesia* (AIPKI) or Indonesian Medical Education Institutions Region VI in order to build educational and mobility collaborations." Meanwhile, Prof. Haerani said, "FK felt proud of hosting the visit from MSU to develop future collaborations in a variety of different areas, such as education, research, and others. Furthermore, apart from FK UNHAS, we also have AIPKI, consisting of 14 faculties from various universities in Eastern Indonesia, especially in Sulawesi, Papua, and Maluku".

The Vice Rector IV, Prof. Adi Maulana, said: "UNHAS is in accordance with its motto; the first is collaboration, and we welcome this collaboration with MSU. The second is that internationalization will intensify with this collaboration, so that in the future, it is hoped that the relationship between UNHAS and MSU in particular will strengthen the relationship between Indonesia and Malaysia, so that these two allied nations can advance together on the global stage."





TWO JAPANESE DEPARTMENT STUDENTS OF UNHAS PASS THE MONBUKAGAKUSHO JAPANESE STUDIES PROGRAM SCHOLARSHIP FOR 2023



Two students from the Japanese Literature Department, Faculty of Cultural Sciences (FIB) at Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), Sendy Bagus Pangestu and Hanna Kanaya, have successfully passed the selection for the Monbukagakusho Scholarship for Japanese Studies 2023 program. They and seven students from other universities in Indonesia will have the opportunity to study for one year at universities in Japan starting on October 1, 2023. Sendy will study at Doshisha University in Kyoto, while Hanna will study at Osaka University in Osaka.

This scholarship program in Japanese language, literature, and culture is very prestigious for undergraduate students worldwide, so the selection process is rigorous, especially regarding Japanese language skills. Apart from Sendy and Hanna, the Japanese Department has successfully sent four other students in previous years. Their accomplishments are achievements to be proud of.











INITIAL RESTOCKING OF BLUE SWIMMER CRAB COMMENCES IN PARE-PARE BAY THROUGH COLLABORATION OF FACULTY OF MARINE AND FISHERIES SCIENCES UNHAS, SERC, AND UMCES



Following the inaugural meeting held to discuss the implementation of collaborative research with the theme "Stock Enhancement: Strategic Approach for the Blue Swimmer Crab (*Portunus pelagicus*) in Indonesia," the Faculty of Marine and Fisheries Sciences (FIKP) at Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), the Smithsonian Environmental Research Centre (SERC), and the Centre for Environmental Science at the University of Maryland (UMCES) officially launched their partnership. The collaborative activities commenced in Parepare Bay, Suppa Subdistrict, Pinrang Regency, South Sulawesi Province.

The event was marked by releasing around 300 juvenile blue swimmer crabs into Parepare Bay on August 3, 2023. Notable attendees included the Vice Dean II of FIKP UNHAS, Prof. Abd. Haris, the Secretary of Pinrang Regency, the Head of the Department of Marine and Fisheries of Pinrang Regency, local government officials from Suppa Subdistrict and Watang Suppa Village, fisheries extension officers from Parepare City and Pinrang Regency, faculty members and researchers from FIKP UNHAS, SERC, UMCES, Dr. Muhammad Kurnia, the head of the UNHAS Community Service Programme (P2KKN), students, and local fishermen.

Each of the 300 crabs released was carefully tagged before their release. This would enable the research team, Dr. Faisal Amir, Muhammad Tauhid Umar (FIKP UNHAS), Dr. Robert Aguilar, and Dr. Henry Legett (SERC), to meticulously monitor their distribution and survival over the next two weeks. These released juvenile crabs' success rate and distribution patterns will be crucial in shaping the feasibility of a larger-scale restocking effort slated for October.

Following the initial release trial, a focused group discussion (FGD) was convened at the Watang Suppa Village office with the three key speakers: the Vice Dean II of FIKP UNHAS, Prof. Abd. Haris, Secretary of Pinrang Regency, Ir. Budaya and Prof. Yushinta Fujaya, head of the research team from FIKP UNHAS, SERC, and UMCES, engaged in an enlightening discussion.

Attended by approximately 50 participants, predominantly crab fishermen from the region, the FGD yielded a promising recommendation: establishing a "Crab Bank." This innovative approach aims to conserve breeding-age crabs, allowing them to spawn and bolster the local crab population. The blue swimmer crab restocking initiative in Parepare Bay not only signifies a pivotal stride towards safeguarding the marine ecosystem but also holds the promise of revitalising the livelihoods of local fishermen and promoting the sustainable management of crab resources.







TASHFEEN AMIR: MY MEMORABLE JOURNEY IN EXPLORING INDONESIAN CULTURE THROUGH BORNEO YOUTH LEADERSHIP CAMP 2023

We also had so much fun with the leadership games, the field trips, visiting museums, ploughing, and planting rice, learning the traditional dances, singing the music of East Kalimantan, and exploring art and culture in Tenggarong Dayak Tribes and Pampang Village. Being chosen as the leader of the Berau Group, one of the most hard-working groups, was a great honour for me, and with solid harmony and teamwork, we managed to win the title of Best Group Video.

How does this International KKN, or Student Community Services, make you feel?

"Honestly, I was excited and glad to be a part of this international program, and the program had a lot of activities that served the community, which made us feel proud. On the other hand, it was an unforgettable experience to have the opportunity to be an exchange student and to have the honour to be presented for both UNHAS and my nation, Sudan. No words can express our appreciation, but I'm delighted and fulfilled by my experiences during the program."

What have you learned during your involvement in the International KKN?

"During the program, we learned a lot of things, starting with exploring a new culture and meeting nice new individuals who were quite helpful in both general life and academics. Aside from that, the program included various activities, such as observing final-year students in the clinic at UKM University and the hospital. However, we have gained experience dealing with various instances and learning new therapy techniques. Furthermore, we have a community service program geared towards assisting youngsters. That program taught us to serve and assist the community. Finally, we were extremely fortunate to have the opportunity to learn new talents and gain new knowledge."

What benefits have you gained that can be developed at FKG, particularly, or at UNHAS generally?

"All the international programs can help the students enhance their knowledge; new abilities and skills differ from what they were taught, such as the education system, medical procedures, and other similar activities. In addition, one of the main benefits of our exchange program was that it assisted us and helped us become aware of clinical life work, and we knew more about the updates in the medical field. We also hope that UNHAS will create more programs like our international exchange program, whether within Indonesian universities or outside, to improve the academic and practical level, particularly in our beloved FKG.

WALLACEA SCIENCE SYMPOSIUM TO HONOUR THE 200TH ANNIVERSARY OF ALFRED RUSSEL WALLACE'S BIRTH



Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), in collaboration with the *Akademi Ilmu Pengetahuan Indonesia* or Indonesian Academy of Sciences (AIPI), held the Wallacea Science Symposium at UNHAS Hotel and Convention on August 13-15, 2023. The Symposium was conducted to commemorate the 200 years of Wallace in Indonesia as well as his contribution to biodiversity. This three-day event was attended by scientists, historians, artists, researchers, students, and the public.

On the first day, 13, the participants visited the historical site where Alfred Russell Wallace used to live in Maros, South Sulawesi. The Symposium on the second and third days included plenary and parallel sessions. One exciting thing about this event was the exhibition. The photos of biodiversity and the history of Wallacea were displayed. Riza Marlon, a prominent photographer from National Geographic Indonesia, attended the Symposium and talked about his experience photographing nature and wildlife.

On this occasion, Prof. Daniel, The Head of *Akademi Ilmu Pengetahuan Indonesia* (AIPI) or Indonesian Academy of Sciences, started the conversation by congratulating Prof. Jamaluddin Jompa and UNHAS for the very memorable opening of the event. "With the support of the local government and the private sector, UNHAS was able to organize this event, something much better than before," said Prof. Daniel. Furthermore, Prof. Daniel also expressed his appreciation to the *Dana Ilmu Pengetahuan Indonesia* or Indonesian Science Fund (DIPI), the *Akademi Ilmuwan Muda Indonesia*, or the Indonesian Academy of Young Scientists (ALMI) for attending the event.

He also believes that the collaboration between DIPI, ALMI, and AIPI can help young talents throughout the archipelago. "If we find unique and interesting young talents, then it's time for us to support their abilities fully," added the President of AIPI. Prof. Daniel said that the inspirational story of Wallace, whose name still exists today, proves how important science is for everyone. The Mayor of Makassar hosted a dinner party to welcome all the distinguished guests to Makassar and show his support for advancing science.




The Vice Rector for Partnership, Innovation, Entrepreneurship, and Business of Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), Prof. Dr. Eng. Adi Maulana, ST., M.Phil. sent off 13 students to participate in the Self Learning Program (SLP) by the Six University Indonesia-Japan Initiative (SUIJI). The send-off ceremony occurred on August 11, 2023. The Coordinator of the SUJI Promotion Office, Prof Dr. Ir. D. Agnes Rampisela, M.Sc, also attended the ceremony. These 13 students will be studying at Ehime University, Kochi University, and Kadawa University in Japan.

In his remarks, Prof. Adi emphasized four critical points to the UNHAS-SUIJI delegates. The first point was about learning about academic culture found during their participation in their host university and maximizing learning experiences that would benefit the students as individuals. Secondly, in building academic and non-academic networks, the participants should be aware of building networks with the people they meet in the program. Thirdly, the importance of the students developing their self-confidence, as participating in such a program requires courage and bravery. Finally, through the performance of the participants during the post-program in UNHAS, other prospective students might be attracted.



HYBRID INTERNATIONAL WORKSHOP ON DIGITAL KNOWLEDGE AND TOOLS FOR PRECISION FARMING



The Faculty of Agriculture Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), in cooperation with the Taiwan International Cooperation and Development Fund (Taiwan ICDF), the Consortium of International Agricultural Research Center (CGIAR), and the International Rice Research Institute (IRRI), organised a hybrid international workshop on digital knowledge and tools for precision farming. The workshop was conducted on 31 July – 3 August 2023, with an audience drawn from the ISCDF rice seed project coordinators, the academic community of UNHAS and other universities, the South Sulawesi Center for Meteorology, the South Sulawesi Department of Plantations, and the Indonesian Cereals Research Institute. Around 50 participants attended the workshop.

Participants learned about the use of digital knowledge and tools for precision farming. The course exposed how digital technologies create efficiencies in the agriculture value chain. By examining the different components in the value chain, inefficiencies can be identified, and this becomes the starting point for applying digital knowledge and precision farming tools.

The workshop aimed to provide an overview of available digital knowledge and tools for precision farming concerning the rice value chain, its advantages, and the potential for maximizing benefits for researchers, rice farmers, producers, and consumers.

Key modules consisted of overview of digital agriculture; available technologies and their application in the rice value chain (e.g. WeRise, ORYZA, RCM, RiceDoctor, RKB, etc.); data collection and data processing; use of digital agriculture tools in collecting farmer and field information for decisionmaking (big data and analytics); integrating digital knowledge and precision farming tools and scaling technology; and way forward: possible partnerships, collaborations, engagements (action plan) and integration.





FACULTY OF PUBLIC HEALTH INVITES WORLD HEALTHY CITIES EXPERT FROM SOUTH KOREA



The Postgraduate Program, Faculty of Public Health (FKM), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), held an Introduction to Campus Life for New Postgraduate Program Students on 18 August 2023 at the UNHAS Graduate School. This was part of the student orientation, usually called *Pengenalan Kehidupan Kampus bagi Mahasiswa Baru* (PKKMB) or Introduction to Campus Life for New Students in the faculty.

This year's PKKMB activities carry a different concept; besides introducing faculties and study programs, it is also integrated with Guest Lecture. The lecture was presented in person by a world expert on Healthy Cities from South Korea, Prof. Eun Woo Nam, MPH, Ph.D. Prof Nam also serves as Dean of the Graduate School of Health Sciences at Yonsei University. Prof. Nam explained the "Healthy Aging in Korea: Social Prescribing Model" material. He explained that increasing life expectancy could be done by developing the concept of a healthy city through a social prescribing approach, as was done in South Korea. The Social Prescribing Approach implemented in South Korea includes, among others, social activities for the elders, such as gardening, listening to music, storytelling, etc. In South Korea, life expectancy has increased to 85 for women and 80 for men.

The new students enthusiastically attended the Guest Lecture session, as seen from the many questions asked in the discussion session moderated by Ruslan, SKM., MPH. The Dean of FKM UNHAS, Prof. Sukri, also responded regarding the topic of the guest lecture given by Prof. Nam. "The topic of healthy aging is one of the issues in global health that must be anticipated in the context of the health care system for the elderly in Indonesia, considering the population group of elderly in Indonesia in the next 2-3 decades predicts that the composition of our population will be larger (the population pyramid is upside down) as life expectancy increases."





INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS PARTICIPATE IN THE 78TH INDONESIA'S INDEPENDENCE DAY CEREMONY



Celebrating the 78th Indonesia's Independence Day on August 17, 2023, Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) held the flag hoisting ceremony at the basketball court Center of Students Activity, UNHAS Campus Tamalanrea. The ceremony was attended by UNHAS academic community; lecturers, staff, and students. The ceremony started at 7.30 a.m. Central Indonesia Time (CIT).



PRESENTATIONS AND PERFORMANCES

In addition to the booths, the IO gave international students the opportunity to present and perform on stage. It was very eye-catching, especially the fans in white and red. The Korean Corner booth provided several traditional games from Korea. The visitors to their booth tried to play by holding a stick and throwing it into the bucket.



The final part of the festival was a photo session with the International Office crew, student volunteers, presenters, performers, and all international students. See you at ISF 2024!






FACULTY OF DENTISTRY UNHAS HOLDS GUEST LECTURE, PRESENTING ORAL SURGEONS FROM JAPAN

The IA was signed for eleven specialist study programs: Surgery Specialist, Pediatric Surgery Specialist, Obstetrics and Gynecology Specialist, Clinical Pathology Specialist, Anesthesiology Specialist and Subspecialist, Skin and Venereology Specialist, ENT-KL Specialist, Radiology Specialist, Orthopedic Specialist and Traumatologist, and Pulmonary Specialist.

The officials present during the visit were the Vice Dean for Partnership, Research, and Innovation, Dr. dr. Andi Alfian Zainuddin, M.KM, the Head of Center for Publications, Community Service and International Affairs, Dr. dr. Rina Maasadah, M.Phil, Sp.PA(K), the Head of Specialist Doctor Education Center Dr. dr. Andi Takdir Musbah, Sp.An-KMN, and many others.

FACULTY OF MEDICINE, UNHAS AND NIIGATA UNIVERSITY STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM SUCCEEDS



The Faculty of Medicine (FK), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), and Niigata University successfully implemented a student exchange program attended by two 7th-semester undergraduate medical students from Niigata University. This activity took place from 16 to 24 August 2023. In this inbound program, the two students from Niigata University were able to conduct observations and field studies at several medical facilities in the Makassar area. They visited the UNHAS Hospital Center for Medical Action and Research (RSPTN), Dr. Wahidin Sudirohusodo Hospital, Daya Hospital, and the Maradekaya Health Center. In addition, they also participated in activities at FK UNHAS, including lectures and visits to the Animal Lab. The Vice Dean for Publications, Services, and International Affairs of FK UNHAS, Dr. dr. Rina Maasadah, Sp, PA(K), M. Phil, DFM, coordinated this program. The implementation of this program also involved faculty staff and FK UNHAS students who were involved in the entire series of activities. "This program is beneficial for both parties in increasing knowledge and skills. It is hoped that this collaboration will continue in the coming years," said Dr. dr. Rina Maasadah.

She also added that collaborations like this had great potential for broadening academic insights and deepening understanding of the world of medicine globally. Through this program, FK UNHAS and Niigata University have proven that cross-country collaboration can benefit medical science and educational development significantly.

The success of this inbound exchange program brought hope that more opportunities for similar collaborations would continue to be forged to support the exchange of knowledge and experience between the two institutions.







FACULTY OF PUBLIC HEALTH, UNHAS HELD A SEMINAR SERIES WITH THE THEME AN OVERVIEW ON CAUSES AND RISKS OF STUNTING



The Faculty of Public Health (FKM), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), held a seminar series on Wednesday, 23 August 2023, in the Nur Nasry Noor room, 2nd floor, FKM building. This seminar series was part of an FKM program bringing speakers from abroad. This time, the FKM UNHAS invited the Country Director of the U.S. CDC, Rebecca D. Merril, Ph.D., MHS, and the seminar theme was "An Overview on Causes and Risks of Stunting."

Ulfah Najamuddin, S.Si, M.Kes, a Lecturer in the Department of Nutrition Science, moderated the seminar. The event was officially opened by the Dean of the FKM, represented by the Vice Dean for Partnership, Research, and Innovation, Prof. Anwar Mallongi, Ph.D, accompanied by Ansariadi, Ph.D, a lecturer in the Epidemiology Department, who is also the UNHAS Director for Partnership. "Stunting is still a big problem in Indonesia. This seminar can benefit students, and we hope that FKM UNHAS and Johns Hopkins University can collaborate in the future," said Prof. Anwar. Rebecca attended this seminar to present her research during seven years in Bangladesh while still at John Hopkins University, called the Jivita Maternal and Child Health and Nutrition Research Project. Rebecca shared about malnutrition: the lack of macro and micronutrients over time. She continued to explain that there were three leading indicators of a child being malnourished: stunting, wasting, and being overweight. The Jivita project ran from 2001-2014.

The project was conducted to determine the effect of vitamin A, beta-carotene, and supportive foods in reducing infant mortality. Volunteers visit homes in Bangladesh every five weeks to collect data on pregnant women's diet, morbidity, and anthropometry. Due to the dense population in Bangladesh, there were about 6,000 forms to manage every week, which was a significant challenge in this project. The results of this research proved that there was a change in the duration of pregnancy, which was longer and increased the baby's length at birth.

Follow-up data on the baby continues to be collected every few months. Rebecca concluded that malnutrition in early development could have a lasting impact and that nutrition research could provide tangible evidence to improve regional policy and practise. Approximately 50 students of FKM UNHAS participated in this seminar. They showed enthusiasm and responded to the presented material by putting forward ideas and asking questions.



The Guest Lecture was presented by Masami Yokogawa, Ph.D., RPT from the Department of Physical Therapy, Faculty of Health Sciences, Institute of Medical, Pharmaceutical and Health Sciences. The Vice Dean officially opened the lecture for Academic and Student Affairs, Syahrul Said, S.Kep., Ns.,M.Kes., Ph.D., and attended by lecturers and students from the UNHAS Department of Physiotherapy.

The speaker, Masami Yokogawa, Ph., D said that Kanazawa University received international students as clinical first-year students, and this year, some of their students went to foreign countries to visit and observe. This collaboration showcases both institutions' commitment to advancing knowledge and technology and highlights their dedication to fostering positive regional change and growth. This partnership is poised to make meaningful contributions to academic and practical domains through joint efforts and shared expertise, setting an example for future collaborations between the two institutions.

In contrast, Ghina Ulfiani Anugrah showed "Preventing Vector-borne Diseases Caused by Breeding Site Mismanagement" by the SUDP group. Both groups were selected, as one of the top 3 groups from their respective programs, to present their ideas in front of Hidefumi Imura, Yokohama City University's Senior Advisor, Global Cooperation Institute for Sustainable Cities, and the United Nations Human Settlements Programme (UN-HABITAT) representatives, Clinton Moore and Tam Hoang.
