#### THE INTERNATIONAL OFFICE, HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY CONDUCTS BENCHMARKING TO BRAWIJAYA UNIVERSITY



The International Office (IO), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) conducted a benchmarking to the IO of Brawijaya University (UB), Malang, East Java on May 3rd, 2024. The UNHAS IO team was led by Muhammad Ridwan, M.A. (IO Secretary) and Erizal Zhafran Muyazzar Edison, S.I. Kom (IO Media). The benchmarking aimed to learn more of the strategy UB used to increase the students' acceptance as an awardee in the Indonesian International Students Mobility Award (IISMA) scholarship. This scholarship enables Indonesian students to spend their semester at any IISMA partner universities around the world.

The IO team was warmly welcomed at the International Lounge 3rd floor by Dr. Didik Hartono, SS. M.Pd., (Head of International Office of UB). The welcome reception was also joined by other IO staff including Agung Nugroho Luthfi Imam Fahrudi, S.AB., M.Bus.Sys.Pro., Ph.D. (Head of International Mobility Administration Division and IISMA Coordinator), Henny Rosalinda, S.IP., MA., Ph.D. (Head of International Academic Engagement Division) and several other respected staff. The main topic during the discussion was about IISMA management by UB. It could be said that what UB has done was slightly similar to what UNHAS did. The only thing different was that new students accepted in UB must prove their English Proficiency test score submitted with other documents. Thus, from the beginning, UB could identify those potential students for IISMA preparation. Unlike UB, UNHAS itself held a diagnostic test among 1000 students from 4th and 6th semester.

Those who met the standard score were given a chance for an English TOEFL preparation class. At the end, only around 90 students proceeded to the next level. The IO intervened with the earliest IISMA socialization. These socializations included the introduction to IISMA, choosing the right university, writing a good essay, etc. The benchmarking to UB was hoped to bring lots of benefit in increasing UNHAS students to get awarded. It ended with a token exchange and a photo session. Thank you UB for sharing its best practices in IISMA management.





### THE INTERNATIONAL OFFICE, HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY HOLDS FOCUS GROUP DISCUSSION ON UPDATING INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS HANDBOOK



The International Office (IO), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) held a Focus Group Discussion (FGD) to update the International Students Handbook. The first handbook was designed in 2022. This update aimed at integrating the latest information needed by prospective international students. The FGD was officially opened on May 7th, 2024 at Novotel Grand Shayla Hotel, Makassar. #### THE KOREAN CORNER, HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY PRESENTS KOREA'S CULINARY FESTIVAL





On Monday, May 13th, 2024, the International Office (IO), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) held a meeting to discuss the 7th International Cultural Program (ICP) preparation. This meeting aimed at determining potential participants who registered themselves and met the ICP requirements. In 2024 there were approximately 100 registrants and the available slots were only 60 participants. This would challenge the IO in determining the criteria for each participant. The meeting was attended by Andi Masyitha Irwan, Ph. D (Head of IO), Muhammad Ridwan, M.A. (Secretary of IO), including IO Task Forces Saaduddin, M.Sc., and Khaeruddin, Ph.D as well as IO Staff namely Nasrah, M.Hum, Kumara Tungga Dewa, S.S., and Erizal Zhafran Muyazzar Edison, S.I. Kom.

The main agenda of the meeting was listing the participants who met all the requirements of ICP and was followed up with sending those candidates a Letter of Acceptance (LoA). Within several days, all those candidates had to confirm their participation in the IO. The next agenda of the preparation was the venue check of the 3-day field trip to *Pusat Pendidikan Lingkungan Hidup* (PPLH) or Center of Environmental Education in Puntondo, Takalar Regency. This inspection was on Friday, May 17, 2024. This inspection was important to ensure that the Puntondo's facilities meet the IO and participants' expectations. The visit to Puntondo also would let the Center know about the last year's participants. Therefore, The Center would be aware of improving the quality here and there. The IO hopes that the 7th ICP will also be successfully implemented.



# A POSTGRADUATE STUDENT OF THE FACULTY OF CULTURAL SCIENCES ATTEND BUDDIES GLOBAL SYMPOSIUM 2024 AND VISITS PUTRA INTERNATIONAL CENTER, UNIVERSITI PUTRA MALAYSIA



As one of the internationalization efforts, the Faculty of Cultural Sciences (FIB) sent one of its masteral students, Kumara Tungga Dewa, S.S., majoring in English Language Studies (ELS) to the Buddies Global Symposium (BuGS) 2024 held by the Putra International Centre (i-Putra) Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM). Kumara, as he is called, attended the event for 5 days, on May 7th-11th 2024 at UPM.

The program consisted of various sessions, including workshops, lectures, conferences, and discussions related to Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). One of the agendas was the SDG Forum: Welcome 2023 which was a platform to discuss and generate ideas related to accelerating the achievement of the SDGs by 2030. Stakeholders from various sectors and backgrounds come together to share knowledge, experiences, and best practices in an effort to achieve these goals.

In addition, this program was a cultural exchange event entitled Cultural Forum: Cultural Convergence. This forum soughted to combine various cultural perspectives in a dialog that enriched, encouraged understanding, and broadens appreciation of cultural diversity.

On Day 4, participants embarked on a City Tour of Putrajaya, Malaysia's administrative center known for its modern architecture, green parks, and enchanting lakes. The tour took participants to visit important landmarks such as Putrajaya Tower, Seri Wawasan Bridge, and the magnificent Putra Mosque, while enjoying the beautiful panorama of the city combined with natural elements.

### THE INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS ASSOCIATION, HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY ORGANIZES A MEDICAL CHECKUP AND DENTAL CARE FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS



On Sunday, May 12th, 2024, the International Student Association (ISA) began to organize medical check-up and dental care activities at the International residence such as blood pressure, oximeter (oxygen saturation in the blood), Body Mass Index, and dental check-ups. This was the first practice. The students were very enthusiastic and happy to practice and implement the knowledge they learned. This activity was expected to be carried out regularly and hoped that all international students would participate in the future.

The purpose of this activity was a form of caring among international students and to apply the knowledge that has been learned in their classrooms. There were about 15 students who did the examination and six of them were medical students including Ali Elayyan, Ibrahim Mahdi, Osama, Deeya, Ali Sarayreh, and Aziz Alhety. These students examined their peers. During the examination, it was found some students who had high blood pressure and had worrying dental conditions, and they were immediately advised to go to the nearest hospital. ISA hopes that in the next check-up there will be more tools, so the activity can be done regularly, self examinations in particular. The ISA also hopes to bring more local people and cooperate with other parties to support this activity.



## THE INTERNATIONAL OFFICE, HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY VISITS PUSAT PENDIDIKAN LINGKUNGAN HIDUP OR CENTER FOR ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION, PUNTONDO, TAKALAR.



As to follow-up to the Monday meeting, May 13th, 2024 about the The 7th International Cultural Program (ICP) 2024 preparations, the International Office (IO), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) visited *Pusat Pendidikan Lingkungan Hidup* (PPLH) or Center for Environmental Education in Puntondo, Takalar Regency. This center will be a 3-day ICP field trip for participants. Likewise at last year's ICP, participants will spend 3 days here to further explore maritime culture including seaweed cultivation, interaction with maritime communities, *Bagang* (traditional fishing house) adventures and cooking classes using seaweed. The IO team visited including Andi Masyitha Irwan, Ph.D (Head of IO), Muhammad Ridwan, M.A. (Secretary of IO), Saaduddin, M.Sc. (IO Task Force), Khaeruddin, Ph.D (IO Task Force), the IO staff including Nasrah, M.Hum, Kumara Tungga Dewa, S.S., Andi Afifah Fayyadah, S.I.Kom and Erizal Zhafran Muyazzar Edison, S.I.Kom and one of the IO volunteers named Muhammad Jibran.

When arriving at the Center, the team began to observe the facilities that Center has. The observation began with 6 available bungalows. Each of it can accommodate 4 people. The observation then continued to 2 house buildings that can accommodate 18 people. The IO team observed the facilities carefully and ensured that participants would understand that the concept of this field trip was camping. The next visit was to the final house building. Here the IO Team could see the capacity of each room. In this place, there are 4 large rooms that can accommodate 15-17 people per room.

The visit continued to observe the auditorium in which the participants would join the lecture session and briefing on a daily basis. The interior is unique and unlike the common auditorium anywhere found. The last visit was to observe the restaurant. The design of this restaurant was also uniquely designed with lots of stairs in which participants may choose at their convenience. The visit ended and the IO team departed to Makassar in the late afternoon. The result of this visit would again be assessed and evaluated by the IO team and would notify the Center for a final decision.





# FACULTY OF LAW HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY'S TWO STUDY PROGRAMS UNDERWENT A FOUNDATION FOR INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION ACCREDITATION VISIT



Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) continuously carries out optimization processes in various fields, including improving the quality of education, one of which is by encouraging study programs to receive international accreditation." said Prof. Dr. Ir. Jamaluddin Jompa, M.Sc.(Rector of UNHAS) well known as Prof. JJ. Two study programs at the Faculty of Law (FH), UNHAS underwent a visitation process from the international accreditation agency called Foundation for International Business Administration Accreditation (FIBAA). "The two study programs that were visited were Bachelor of Law Sciences and Bachelor of Public Administration Law," according to the Dean of FH, Prof. Dr. Hamzah Halim, S.H., M.H., M.A.P.

The assessors involved included Prof Dr Daniela Heid (Federal University of Applied Administrative Science, Brunl, Germany), Prof Dr Jur Jan Friedrich Bruckermann (FOM International University of Applied Sciences of Economy and Management), Julian Rossig (Capgemini Invent, Germany), Prof Dr Tolkah (Walisongo State Islamic University), and Kira Kock (University of Munster, Germany).

As a university, he said, UNHAS continuously carries out optimization processes in various fields, including improving the quality of education, one of which is by encouraging study programs to receive international accreditation. Furthermore, the Rector of UNHAS said that optimally facilitating and empowering all study programs to gain national and international recognition through several strategic steps.

As the largest state university with various achievements not only in Eastern Indonesia, he said, UNHAS needs to collaborate well with strategic partners so that the benefits of UNHAS as a higher education institution can be felt by the entire community. "The suggestions and input that will be given will enrich UNHAS, as well as be an encouragement for UNHAS to continue to improve its quality," said Prof JJ. He hopes that the various documents that have been prepared by the task force team are appropriate and will receive a good assessment. UNHAS considers this activity is a form of effort to make UNHAS continue to maintain the quality of education provided. The event then continued with a question and answer session from FIBAA assessors. In general, the assessors asked questions related to the learning process, infrastructure, quality assurance, and UNHAS' achievements in general. After the opening, the assessment process continued with the two study programs at FH. The assessment process was scheduled from Monday to Wednesday, May 6th – 8th, 2024.





## HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY HOLDS FOCUS GROUP DISCUSSION ON DECIDING KEMITRAAN NEGERI BERKEMBANG (KNB) RECIPIENTS



Focus Group Discussion (FGD) was held on Saturday, May 18th, 2024 at Meeting Room A 7th Floor Rectorate Building by the Directorate of Academic. The FGD was about the decision of *Kemitraan Negara Berkembang* (KNB) or Partnership of Developing Countries scholarship recipients. The FGD was led by Prof. drg. Muhammad Ruslin, M.Kes., Ph.D., SpBM(K) (Vice Rector for Academic and Students Affairs) and was joined by fellow Dean and Vice Deans at Hasanuddin University (UNHAS). The International Office itself was represented by Muhamad Ridwan, M.A. (IO Secretary) and Kumara Tungga Dewa (IO Staff).

In addition, Nurul Ichsani, S.Sos., M.I.Kom (Head of Sub Directorate of Admission) explained that this year UNHAS received around 400 applicants from KNB and half of them proceeded to the interview test. Regarding the interview test, there were around 200 applicants who passed to study at UNHAS, but unfortunately, there were only 20 slots for prospective students in 2024. The details were 2 people for the doctoral program, 16 people for the master's program and 2 people for the bachelor's program. All Deans and their representatives submitted the recommended names for all degrees. The Directorate of Academic will follow up with recapitulating and wrapping to be sent to Jakarta. The FGD ended and all parties left the meeting room.



#### THE INTERNATIONAL OFFICE, HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY PRESENTS GEOGRAPHY SERIES: INTRODUCING JAPAN



The International Office (IO), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) again presented an event called the Geography Series (G-Series) featuring Japan. The student named Jumpei Kadoguchi presented his country in front of approximately 200 local students and lecturers including several international students from Afghanistan, Madagascar, Sudan, Honduras and Yemen. The G-Series was carried out on Thursday, May 16th, 2024 from 2 - 4 pm Central Indonesia Time (CIT) at Prof. La Tanro Hall, Faculty of Economics and Business (FEB). Also attending this event were all IO crew and volunteers. This G-Series was moderated by the IO student volunteer named Netalen Priscyla Adiestya.

The G-Series began with an opening remark by Andi Masyitha Irwan, Ph.D (Head of IO). In her remark, she emphasized that G-Series aimed to enable international students to introduce his/her country, language and culture to UNHAS academic community. In addition, G-Series also enables UNHAS local students to practice their English skills. After the official opening, the G-series continued with Kadoguchi's presentation.

Mr. Kadoguchi started with his country's national anthem called *Kimigayo* which is an image of the emperor's glorious reign for the Japanese people. It was an incredible presenter as Mr. Kadoguchi, a researcher majoring in Sociology, spoke in *Bahasa Indonesia* during his presentation. G-Series participants were facilitated by his *bahasa* skills. They could more easily understand the content of the presentation. Mr. Kadoguchi then presented his first encounter with Indonesia, particularly UNHAS. It was in Sinjai, South Sulawesi he met a number of UNHAS students. His impression was the students were very friendly while he himself was quite shy. His encounter continues until now as he is doing his research on Sarung Sekomandi in Mamuju, Western Sulawesi.

He continued his presentation by introducing several cities in its landmarks including Tokyo tower. Moreover, he showed several cultural artifacts and cartoon characters in those cities like Tokyo, Nagoya, Yokohama, Fukuoka and his hometown, Osaka. He also figured out types of Japanese food and drinks such as Takoyaki, Okonomiyaki and the like. He introduced some tourist destinations in his hometown including Osaka castle, Hideyoshi Toyotomi and Gulico, etc as well as Japanese Katakana and Hiragana. His presentation was more attractive by showing several videos about Japan. Prior to the end, he managed to show the railroad networks that cover the entire Japan.

The moderator then invited the participants to propose the questions. There were a number of questions by the participants and Mr. Kadoguchi answered precisely. The moderator asked Mr. Kadoguchi to present a quiz. The participants who gave a correct answer were rewarded with special merchandise from IO. The G-Series ended with a photo session and getting to know among the participants and with Mr. Kadoguchi as well. *Sayonara!* 









# LECTURER OF GEOPHYSICS DEPARTMENT PARTICIPATES IN THE 6TH ASIA PACIFIC MEETING ON NEAR SURFACE GEOSCIENCE & ENGINEERING CONFERENCE IN TSUKUBA, JAPAN



Asia Pacific Meeting on Near Surface Geoscience & Engineering (NSGE) conference is an annual conference that focuses on near surface geoscience. The conference included a variety of miniconferences, an exhibition, and instrument demonstrations. In this 6th edition, the conference, which was organized by the European Association of Geoscientists and Engineers (EAGE) and the Society of Exploration Geophysicists of Japan (SEGJ), was held in Tsukuba, Japan from May 13th - 15th, 2024 with the theme of "Smart Technologies Kind to the Planet".

The conference was a remarkable gathering that attracted nearly 200 participants representing 24 countries and 103 organizations from Australia, America, Africa as well as Asia. This event stood out with over 80 technical presentations addressing the latest trends and developments in the field of near-surface geoscience and engineering. In addition to the enriching discussions and presentations, the conference also hosted an exhibition running parallel to the sessions, providing attendees with valuable insights and networking opportunities.

Delegation from Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), represented by Andi Muhamad Pramatadie Ph.D. from Geophysics Department Faculty of Mathematics and Natural Sciences (MIPA), also participated in the conference as a poster presentation with the title of "Exploration of Shallow S-wave Velocity in Bandung Basin using Surface S-wave Velocity and H/V Method". The conference and presentation moment was utilized for networking and promoting UNHAS in an international event. Furthermore, a pre-conference workshop with the title of "Workshop on the Active and Passive Surface Wave Explorations" was participated by the delegation. This workshop covered recent development of active and passive surface wave explorations, including data acquisition (e.g., DAS), data processing (e.g., Machine Learning), and case studies (onshore and offshore). In addition, standardization of the surface wave explorations was discussed. We hope that the recent methods for surface wave exploration can be applied in the exploration, monitoring and mitigation efforts in Indonesia.

# THE FACULTY OF MEDICINE CARRIES OUT THE IMPLEMENTATION AGREEMENT WITH NIIGATA UNIVERSITY, JAPAN



Collaboration between the Faculty of Medicine (FK), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) and the Niigata University Japan Faculty of Medicine has been running since 2022, and various joint activities have been implemented. One example was that three students participating in medical education (clerkships) have been working at UNHAS Hospital and various FK UNHAS network hospitals since May 5th, 2024 for 4 weeks. This program was a student exchange (inbound) where the focus of learning was tropical diseases.

Furthermore, Prof. Akihiko Saitoh, MD, PhD (Dean of Niigata Faculty of Medicine) is a pediatrician and Prof. Fumiko Okazaki, MD, PhD (Chair of the Medical Education Center, Niigata Faculty of Medicine) also gave a public lecture on toxoplasmosis, rubella, cytomegalovirus, herpes and other agents (TORCH) disease and career development of a doctor to lecturer staff and students in the Department of Pediatrics and in the Department of Medical Education FK Unhas on May 14th, 2024. Prof. Fumiko is also a medical educator in Japan, Apart from that, Prof. Akihiko Saitoh is also involved in bedside teaching of pediatric cases at UNHAS Hospital and led clinical case discussion conferences at the Department of Child Health, FK UNHAS.



Likewise, the lecturers from FK UNHAS delivered a guest lecture at Niigata University. On May 23rd 2024 at the Brain Research Institute (BRI) Faculty of Medicine Niigata University, lecturer at the Department of Neurology and Biochemistry, FK UNHAS, dr. Gita Vita Soraya, PhD gave a guest lecture with the title "Unveiling the Genetic Basis of Familial Parkinson's Disease Using Whole Exome Sequencing: First Study In Indonesia". A guest lecture was also given by Dr. Yusran Ady Fitrah, PhD with the title "A Multidisciplinary Integrative approach to Precision Medicine". The guest lecture was attended by Prof. Takeshi Ikeuchi MD PhD (Head of Department of Molecular Genetics, Brain Research Institute, Niigata University) and Associate Prof. Akinori Miyashita PhD, as well as students and staff of Niigata University Graduate School of Medical and Dental Sciences, and also attended by online participants from Indonesia and Japan.

On this occasion, the Brain Research Institute also provided facilities and infrastructure for carrying out biomolecular analysis of samples that had been prepared, for a collaborative research project between the two institutions. Several analysis protocols have been carried out at the BRI Molecular Genetics Laboratory during a visit by researchers from the Department of Neurology, FK UNHAS. Besides, to strengthen international collaboration, the lecture was combined with a joint meeting with the Head of the Neurology Study Program, FK UNHAS, Dr. Muhammad Akbar, PhD, Sp.S(K) and dr. Cahyono Kaelan, Ph.D, DFM, Sp.S(K), Sp.PA(K) as representative of the Department of Neurology FK UNHAS regarding the ongoing collaboration with BRI in the field of Neurology and Molecular Genetics with the whole exome sequencing project for the genetic characterization of Parkinson's patients in Indonesia. During this visit, the Department of Neurology also participated in a meeting with the Chair of the Department of Pathology, Professor Akiyoshi Kakita and Prof. Rie Saito from the Department of Pathological Neurosciences, to discuss collaboration plans in the field of neuropathology.

Dr. dr. Rina Masadah, M.Phil, Sp.PA(K) as Chair of the Center for Publication, Community Service and International Affairs said that the collaboration with Niigata was very good by involving lecturers and students from both faculties. This collaboration certainly will improve UNHAS reputation at the international level.





#### THE DEPARTMENT OF HISTORY HOLDS KAHIN LECTURE IN COLLABORATION WITH EL COLEGIO DE MEXICO




The Department of History (DoH), Faculty of Cultural Sciences (FIB), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), in collaboration with the Development Study Club, held a scientific discussion entitled "Kahin Lecture" themed "Separatism in Eastern Indonesia: A Brief History", by Professor Christopher Alan Lundry (Research Professor, Center for Asian and African Studies (CEAA) El Colegio de México. The activity began with remarks from Dr. Ilham Daeng Makkelo (Head of DoH), and the event was guided by moderator Dias Pradadimara, M.A. This lecture was carried out through Zoom on Tuesday, May 21st, 2024. Participants came from various disciplinary backgrounds. Not only DoH students from UNHAS, but also students from other disciplines from various universities in Indonesia.

Kahin Lecture is a series of online public discussions regarding Indonesian studies conducted by foreign researchers. This activity was to honor George McTurnan Kahin's services in promoting Indonesia in social, political and humanities studies in the United States. Especially in historical studies, Kahin's contribution was enormous in opening up studies of political history in Indonesia. Kahin was an American historian and political scientist. He was one of the leading experts on Southeast Asia. The main focus of the discussion is the separatist movement, especially in Eastern Indonesia. Historically, this region has had various experiences related to the separatist movement. Separatism has been an important and often controversial issue in Indonesian history.

The history of separatism in Indonesia has been going on since the beginning of Indonesia's independence until today. We can mention the *Darul Islam* Movement, *Pemerintahan Revolusioner Republik Indonesia* (PRRI) or Revolutionary Government of the Republic of Indonesia / *Perjuangan Rakyat Semesta* (Permseta) or The Struggle of the Universal People, and others.

In the Eastern region of Indonesia, we know about the separatist movement in Papua, South Maluku, East Timor. How to read the separatist movements in these three regions are very important and remain contextual today. Including nationalism and separatist issues. The separatist movement cannot be seen simply as related to local residents' dissatisfaction with central government policies, but the problem is very complex, including the role of elites, poverty, religion, ethnicity, political participation, social aspects and can even be related to regional and global geopolitics. This aspect must be seen in a multidisciplinary and multidimensional manner. So this separatist aspect is not only a matter of historical experience but is also still a contemporary reality in Indonesia, for example the case of the Free Papua Movement. The issues range from demands for justice to human rights.

### HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY WELCOMES MONITORING AND EVALUATION TEAM OF KEMITRAAN NEGARA BERKEMBANG OR PARTNERSHIP OF DEVELOPING COUNTRY SCHOLARSHIP



Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) welcomed monitoring and evaluation (Monev) team consisting of Institutional Directorate, the Ministry of Education and Culture, Research and Higher Education (Kemedikbud Ristek Dikti) and Lembaga Pengelola Dana Pendidikan (LPDP) or Indonesia endowment fund for education, on Thursday, May 30th, 2024 from 1pm Central Indonesia Time (CIT). The Monev was held at Meeting Room A 7th floor, Rectorate Building. Joining the meeting were Risma Illa Maulany, Ph.D (Directorate of Academic), representing the Vice Rector 1 for Academic and Students Affairs. In addition, several Heads of Sub-Directorate under the Directorate of Academic. Meanwhile, the International Office (IO) was represented by Muhammad Ridwan, M.A. (Secretary), Dra. Harniaty (Head Foreign Cooperation Division) and Kumara Tungga Dewa, S.S. (IO Staff).

In her opening speech, Ms. Risma emphasized her joy in welcoming the team and hoped the team would enjoy their stay in Makassar. Moreover, Ms. Risma also said that the arrival of the team did not mean to investigate the malpractice in KNB management in UNHAS but more like to improve the management of this scholarship. After the opening, the speech continued to the representative of the Institutional Directorate and LPDP. The meeting continued to hear the progress report by the IO and was followed by the report by the Language Services seeing the KNB Awardees' progress in learning *Bahasa Indonesia*. After hearing the report from IO and Language Service, the team discussed things related to the report asking for clarification from both parties.

After discussing with the management, the team continued with the KNB Awardees. The session aimed at identifying *Bahasa Indonesia's* skills and issues related to their scholarship. Generally speaking, UNHAS ongoing awardees expressed their feelings and situations during their *bahasa* preparation class. One awardee said that the second term of his class was much better as the class assigned us not only in the classroom but also outside the class. The awardees had to interview at least seven local students to practice what they got inside the class, for example asking about students' hobbies, etc. The awardees also convinced the monitoring and evaluation team that they were ready for joining the classes in the coming semester with their current *bahasa* skills. The session lasted in the late afternoon and before leaving, the team and the awardees took a photo session.





#### THREE STUDY PROGRAMS UNDERGO FOUNDATION FOR INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION ACCREDITATION PROCESS



Three study programs at the Faculty of Cultural Sciences (FIB) at Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) underwent the international accreditation assessment stage by the Foundation for International Business Administration Accreditation (FIBAA). The opening was held on Monday, May 27th, 2024 from 2.30pm Makassar Time. In the Faculty Senate Room, 2nd Floor of the FIB Building, Tamalanrea Campus, Makassar, and was connected virtually via the zoom meeting application. The assessment lasted on Wednesday, May 29th, 2024. Those three study programs were Bachelor of Regional Languages, Bachelor of Indonesian Literature, and Master of Linguistics. The assessors involved were Prof. Dr. Andrea Dlaska (Middlesex University London), Dr. Soe-Tjen Marching (University of London), Prof. Dr. Edwin Wieringa (University of Cologne), Prof. Dr. Ali Formen (Semarang State University), Denisa Koch Erich Kästner (Comprehensive School Homberg), Janina Kofoet (University of Hamburg).

Prof. Dr. Ir. Jamaluddin Jompa, M.Sc., (Rector) in his speech welcomed the FIBAA assessors. Prof. JJ said, as an international university, UNHAS continues to improve its quality globally, with the hope of strengthening and increasing UNHAS role and contribution as an educational institution in various sectors. "Optimally, we facilitate and empower all study programs to gain national and international recognition through several strategic steps. "We do this on an ongoing basis, so that the benefits of UNHAS as a higher education institution can be felt by the entire community," explained Prof JJ.

Furthermore, Prof. JJ added that the suggestions and input given will provide insight and enrich Unhas, as well as provide encouragement to continue to improve quality. According to him, this activity is a form of effort to ensure that Unhas continues to maintain the quality of education provided. After the opening session from the University leadership, it was followed by a question and answer session from FIBAA assessors. In general, the assessors asked questions related to the learning process, infrastructure, quality assurance, and UNHAS' achievements in general.

On the second day of the assessment, the FIBAA assessment team met with student and alumni representatives from the three study programs. This meeting was to gather information on the involvement of students and alumni in the development of the three study programs. This included how they feel while continuing their studies in their respective study programs.

Then on the third day, the FIBAA assessor team met with representatives of administrative staff both at university level and at FIB. The International Office (IO) itself was represented by Muhammad Ridwan, M.A (Secretary). He revealed that when the meeting with the assessor started, the first question immediately pointed to the internationalization program related to preparing students for international exposure at UNHAS. Mr Ridwan explained comprehensively the role of IO, for example providing pre-departure training sessions for selected students in study abroad programs funded by the government through the Indonesian International Students Mobility Awards (IISMA) program. He also explained that every event such as a Public Lecture, Guest Lecture which presents foreign speakers such as the Prime Minister, Ambassadors, foreign researchers who came to UNHAS, the IO mobilized students to take part in the event.

He also explained that the presence of international students at UNHAS benefits local students through the Geography Series (G-Series) as the IO's monthly event where international students introduce their country and culture in front of local students so as to create mutually beneficial understanding. Likewise, local students could practice their foreign languages, especially English as the language of instruction. Mr Ridwan ended his explanation by saying that IO is also currently holding an online Friday Outbound Clinic (FOC) which aims to equip students, lecturers and staff with outbound program information as well as tips when implementing the outbound, including cross-cultural understanding and DOs and DON'Ts. you need to pay attention when you are in another country.

In the closing session, FIBAA suggested several strategies for the future development of these three study programs. One recommendation was to implement benchmarking to examine similar programs. This will help the three study programs refine their vision and mission, as well as highlight the unique aspects that set them apart from other programs.
