The Faculty of Marine and Fisheries Sciences (FIKP), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), held the 11th National and The 7th International Symposium on Marine and Fisheries on "Exploring the Main Problems and Effective Solutions in the Marine and Fisheries Sector toward the Achievement of SDG #14 (Life Below Water)". The event was officially opened by the Rector of UNHAS, Prof. Dr. Ir. Jamaluddin Jompa, M.Sc., known as Prof. JJ, at a ceremony held in the Ballroom of the UNHAS Hotel and Convention, Tamalanrea Campus, Makassar, on Sunday, June 30th, 2024. On this occasion, Prof. JJ welcomed the speakers and participants; "Thank you and high appreciation to FIKP UNHAS for presenting an academic forum featuring speakers from various countries," he said.

Furthermore, Prof. JJ explained the important role of academics, practitioners and government to overcome the problems in marine and fisheries. He hoped that through this symposium the participants could identify the main problems in the marine and fisheries sector and find effective solutions to support the achievement of SDG #14. This event should not only be a place to exchange information and knowledge, but also a platform to build strong working networks between various parties involved. "The hope is that the results of this symposium will be immediately implemented to create healthy seas and sustainable fisheries," said Prof. JJ. THE FACULTY OF PUBLIC HEALTH HOLDS SEMINAR SERIES PRESENTING INBOUND STUDENT FROM STANFORD UNIVERSITY, UNITED STATES OF AMERICA



The Faculty of Public Health (FKM), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) conducted a seminar series on Monday, July 1st 2024 in the Nur Nasry Noor room, Fl. 2 FKM UNHAS. The seminar was attended by approximately 44 FKM UNHAS undergraduate students. This seminar series is an FKM program that brings speakers from abroad. This time FKM UNHAS presented Morgan Tarpenning, an undergraduate student majoring in Global Health, Stanford University, United States of America (USA). This seminar was moderated by the Director of CEPHS (Center for Epidemiology and Population Health Studies) FKM UNHAS, Ansariadi, Ph.D., with the theme "Geospatial Survey of Trash for Estimating Dengue Risk: Kenya and Makassar". This seminar was also opened by the Head of the Epidemiology Department, FKM UNHAS, Indra Dwinata, MPH.

Morgan was in Makassar for 3 weeks as part of data collection series activities for cohort research conducted by the FKM UNHAS. This international research collaboration is chaired by Ansariadi, Ph.D together with Joelle Ivy-Rosser Ph.D from Stanford University. The research, which will last for three years, aims to evaluate the relationship between behavioral, environmental and biological factors on maternal and child health, especially in Tallo District, Makassar. Morgan explained that the activities carried out were in the form of mapping environmental conditions, especially waste which could become a breeding ground for the *Aedes aegypti* mosquito in Tallo District and compare it with the results of the same activity in Kenya, Africa.





She continued that the two locations were chosen because of the large number of dengue fever incidents, open rubbish in the living environment, and rainfall which often allows *Aedes* mosquitoes to breed.

The first project was carried out in Kenya, Africa. The methods used to identify waste were by walking on foot and the use of drones. Results from the study show that drones can identify more trash than walking; 94% of items were correctly identified as trash by drones, with the rest being used tires or piles of rocks.

The second project was then carried out in Makassar which was a collaboration between UNHAS and Stanford University. There are differences in trash locations with Kenya because there is a lot of rubbish under houses and sewers which are difficult for drones to pass through which is also a difficulty in this project. After using the walking method for eight days and with assistance from local communities, 115 waste disposal areas were found to have a high risk of dengue fever.

By carrying out this project, Morgan hopes that in the future the data can be used to help areas at risk and provide support to the community with more supporting resources. Seminar participants then respond to the material that has been presented by proposing ideas and posing questions which were then answered by the resource person.



THE FACULTY OF MARINE SCIENCES AND FISHERIES MASTER'S STUDENT PARTICIPATES IN EARLY CAREER OCEAN PROFESSIONAL (ECOP) IN KOREA



Rara Adesuara Sari, a Master's student in the Marine Science program at the Faculty of Marine Science and Fisheries (FIKP), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), participated in the Early Career Ocean Professional (ECOP) program in Korea. This event was part of a cooperation between the governments of Korea and Indonesia through an Official Development Assistance (ODA) Project titled 'Establishing Integrated Ocean Fisheries Technology Training Center and Enhancing Capacity Building in Indonesia (ODA KIOTEC)'. The aim of this activity was to enhance human resource capacity in the maritime field and is one of the Korea Ocean ODA projects (funded by the Korean government) initiated by the Coordinating Ministry for Maritime Affairs and Investment (Kemenko Marves) in collaboration with the Marine Technology Cooperation Research Center (MTCRC).

The Early Career Ocean Professional (ECOP) program in Korea took place from June 11 - 16, 2024. Besides students from the Master's program in Marine Science at UNHAS, the program was also attended by students from Diponegoro University (Master's in Marine Science), Gajah Mada University (Master's in Fisheries Science), Pattimura University (Master's in Marine Science), and Bandung Institute of Technology (Master's in Earth Sciences), as well as the MTCRC team.





THE FACULTY OF NURSING, DEPARTMENT OF PHYSIOTHERAPY HOLDS INTERNATIONAL SYMPOSIUM THE ROLE OF PHYSIOTHERAPY IN CARDIOVASCULAR AND RENAL REHABILITATION



The Department of Physiotherapy, Faculty of Nursing (FKep), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), together with the School of Rehabilitation Sciences, Seirei Christopher University, held an International Symposium with the theme "The Role of Physiotherapy in Cardiovascular and Renal Rehabilitation" in the hall of the UNHAS *Lembaga Penelitian dan Pengabdian Masyarakat* (LPPM) or Institute of Research and Community Services on Saturday 13 July 2024. The event was attended by the President of Seirei Christopher University, the President Director (Board Chairman) of Kaikoukai Healthcare Corporation, the UNHAS Vice Dean for Research, Innovation, and Partnerships, and the Vice Dean for Academic and Student Affairs, who represented the UNHAS Rector in opening the symposium.

The speakers at the International Symposium included Prof. Shinichi Arizono, RPT, Ph.D. (Department Chair, School of Rehabilitation Sciences, Seirei Christopher University), Assoc. Prof. Hiroki Yabe, RPT, Ph.D. (Associate Professor, Seirei Christopher University) and Prof. Dr. H. Djohan Aras, S.Ft., Physio, M.Pd., M.Kes. (Physio Sakti Clinic Practitioner and Physiotherapy Lecturer at UNHAS).

In the first session, Prof. Djohan discussed the significant role of physiotherapy in treating various disorders of the human body using visceral manipulation techniques. In the second session, Prof. Arizono addressed the role of physiotherapy in cardiopulmonary care and ICU settings in Japan. He highlighted the importance of physiotherapy in providing exercise to cardiopulmonary patients experiencing hypoxia. Additionally, Prof. Arizono explained the health insurance mechanisms related to physiotherapy sessions in Japan, emphasizing their impact on increasing the efficiency of patient interventions.

Regarding the role of physiotherapy in chronic kidney disease and dialysis, Assoc. Prof. Yabe stated, "The field of kidney rehabilitation is still unexplored globally. I am confident that further clinical research can be generated through collaboration and joint research between Hasanuddin University, Seirei Christopher University, and Kaikoukai."

INTERNATIONAL OFFICE HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY VISITS SEOUL NATIONAL UNIVERSITY TO DISCUSS COLLABORATION OPPORTUNITIES



On Monday June 24th 2024, the International Office (IO) of Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) conducted a visit to the Office of International Affairs (OIA) at Seoul National University (SNU), South Korea. The delegation from UNHAS was represented by Saaduddin, M.Sc., a Task Force member in the IO UNHAS Division of International Students and Visa. He was warmly received by Ms. Sunju Park, Director of International Education Partnership/Agreement, Ms. Moonkyung Baik, Manager of Scholarships for Exchange Students (In/Outbound), and Ms. Jinsol Maeng, Manager of Scholarships for International Students.

During this meeting, several key topics were discussed, including the initiation of cooperation between UNHAS and SNU, student exchanges, and scholarships. The meeting began with an introduction to UNHAS by Saaduddin. In his presentation, he highlighted that UNHAS is one of the top 10 universities in Indonesia with a vision and mission related to the maritime continent. He added that UNHAS, located in Makassar, is strategically positioned near the new capital city on Kalimantan Island, the Spermonde Archipelago, the Wallacea region, and the Maros-Pangkep Geopark, renowned for its karst landscape. Concluding his presentation, he emphasized that UNHAS is currently striving to enhance its international reputation through its internationalization programs. A key effort in this regard is increasing collaborations with the top 200 universities globally, with SNU being a prime target, ranked #31 in the QS World University Rankings 2025.

The meeting continued with a discussion on initiating cooperation between the two universities. Ms. Sunju Park explained that SNU is currently limiting the establishment of university-level Memorandums of Understanding (MoU). However, SNU allows for bottom-up collaboration, which can start at the grassroots level, such as laboratories. Each college and department, down to individual laboratories, can establish research and staff exchange collaborations. The financial and technical aspects can vary according to the policies of each party. In contrast, student exchanges requiring credit transfer necessitate a university-level MoU due to the involvement of multiple divisions, such as the academic division, inbound student office, and visa management. Ms. Moonkyung Baik added that if the student exchange does not span a full semester and does not require credit transfer, a faculty or departmental level MoU would suffice. Following this, Ms. Jinsol Maeng mentioned that SNU currently has an open application for the Graduate Scholarship for Foreign Students (GSFS) Program for Spring 2025. She suggested that UNHAS students might be interested in this opportunity. Additionally, she noted that SNU offers various other scholarships, such as the SNU President Fellowship (SPF) for Ph.D. programs. The brief meeting with the OIA SNU holds the promise of paving the way for future collaborations between UNHAS and SNU.





GEOPHYSICS DEPARTMENT LECTURER CONDUCTS BENCHMARKING RESEARCH COLLABORATION AT KOREA UNIVERSITY'S COASTAL HYDRODYNAMIC LABORATORY



From june 24th - 28th 2024, a faculty member from the Department of Geophysics, Faculty of Mathematics and Natural Sciences (FMIPA), Saaduddin, M.Sc., embarked, on a Benchmarking Research Collaboration at the Coastal Hydrodynamic Laboratory, part of the School of Civil, Environmental, and Architectural Engineering at Korea University. The collaboration was led by Prof. Sangyoung Son, Ph.D., the head of the laboratory, whose research primarily focuses on coastal modeling, including tsunami modeling.

This collaborative effort involved not only Prof. Sangyoung Son but also all the students he supervises, spanning undergraduate, master's, and doctoral levels. The activities carried out during this period included group discussions, laboratory visits, individual consultations, and an internal seminar. The visit aimed to outline potential future research collaborations, which include: coupled modeling of tsunamis, wave-current interaction models, prediction of morphological processes associated with tsunami-induced currents, tsunami-induced maritime hazards, and storm surge inundation models. Additionally, discussions were held on other potential academic activities that could be conducted jointly, such as guest lectures and joint workshops.

Regarding the formalization of these collaborations through documents such as MoUs or MoAs, intensive communication with Korea University's Office of International Affairs (OIA) is necessary, as this division handles international collaborations and partnerships. This visit marked a significant step in strengthening research ties and fostering academic exchange between the two institutions, promising a fruitful collaboration in the realm of coastal and tsunami modeling.



HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY SIGNS THE MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH THE GRIFFITH UNIVERSITY, AUSTRALIA



Griffith University (GU) in Australia and Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) expanded their collaboration in the sectors of academia and research. A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed on Tuesday 9th July 2024, in the UNHAS Rector's meeting room in Makassar. The signing of this Memorandum of Understanding by the two institutions marked a significant turning point in their efforts to broaden their international collaboration network and to increase the breadth of their academic and research collaboration. This meeting was attended by Prof. Dr. Eng. Adi Maulana, S.T., M.Phil (Vice Rector for Partnership, Innovation, Entrepreneurship and Business), Ansariadi, Ph.D (Director of Partnership), and Khaeruddin, Ph.D (International Office Task Force) from UNHAS. Meanwhile, the representatives from GU were Lucinda Chappell (Regional Marketing Director Southeast Asia & Pacific and Dony Vernianto (In Country Manager Indonesia).

Prof. Dr. Eng Adi Maulana stated that this cooperation enhances academic cooperation and raises the standard of instruction, helping colleagues address regional and international challenges in the domains of research and education. "This collaboration not only aims at improving the quality and relevance of research, but also to open new opportunities for student and lecturer exchanges," he said.

UNHAS intends to fortify global networks and make a major contribution to the advancement of science and technology through this partnership. Prof. Adi further emphasized the significance of this partnership in terms of giving instructors and students chances to broaden their global experience. He stated, "It is hoped that they can broaden their academic horizons and increase cross-cultural understanding with this exchange."

He claimed that in addition to the direct benefits to individuals, this also has the potential to provide new discoveries and technologies that could significantly advance society. The range of collaboration specified in this MoU encompasses several educational and scientific endeavors, such as student exchanges and cooperative research to enhance the caliber and pertinence of research. Joining online, Prof. Carolyn Evans, Vice Chancellor and President of Griffith University, emphasized the value of international cooperation in advancing academic growth and scientific research to foster the discovery of scientific discoveries that could have a major positive influence on science as a whole.

Shanghai Ocean University (ShOU) conducted its 4th Shanghai Summer School RCEP Marine Culture International Program on 5-27 June 2024. Hasanuddin University delegated three students (two undergraduate students from the Faculty of Marine Science and Fisheries and a postgraduate student from the Faculty of Cultural Sciences). They were Ahmad Aufaasikki, Nurfauzani Sangaji, and Kumara Tungga Dewa.

This year's summer school brought together 34 students from nine countries, offering them an immersive experience in cutting-edge marine engineering topics. The program featured engaging outdoor excursions that significantly enhanced the participants' understanding of marine engineering. Students underwent simulated crew training aboard the Wu Song training vessel and engaged in hands-on marine biology activities. At the Chongming Island research base for marine studies, they gained an in-depth understanding of aquaculture processes. Additionally, a visit to the China Maritime Museum offered profound insights into the development of China's maritime culture.

The program also included a rich array of cultural activities aimed at deepening the students' appreciation of traditional Chinese culture. These activities included calligraphy, traditional Chinese painting, gu zheng (a traditional Chinese musical instrument) lessons, and dragon boat racing.

Moreover, they also forged connections with peers from around the world and learned the importance of cross-cultural communication through collaborative projects. The representatives of Indonesia also had a chance to present the country, in a series of information ranging from the geography, the demography, to the cultural diversity of Indonesia.





HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY WELCOMES THE VISIT OF THE UNITED STATES CONSUL GENERAL SURABAYA INDONESIA



Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) received a delegation from the United States of America (USA) Consulate General in Surabaya, Indonesia on Wednesday, July 24, 2024 in the Rector's Meeting Room, 8th Floor, Rectorate Building. Prof. Dr. Ir. Jamaluddin Jompa, M.Sc. (Rector) was accompanied by Prof. Dr. Phil. The IO was represented by Khaeruddin, Ph.D (IO Task Force). FIKP lecturers also joining the event included Inayah Yasir, Ph.D and Yayu La Nafie, Ph.D. The IO staff member was present to introduce UNHAS and an overview of the IO program to the participants of this summer program.

This summer program was designed to be full of fun and adventurous as well as challenging. The participants took a diving class conducted by OpWal and the two FIKP lecturers conducted snorkeling classes for surveying seagrass. In addition, the adventurous parts of the event included travel from one island to another. The participants had to cross the ocean to reach another island by riding a small boat. This could be challenging at times due to the waves. The event certainly enabled the participants to understand more about the Wallacea region as well as getting to know UNHAS and the IO.





THE FACULTY OF MARINE SCIENCES AND FISHERIES, HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY RESEARCHERS JOIN GLOBAL EXPEDITION ON OCEANXPLORER



An extraordinary collaboration between the National Research and Innovation Agency (BRIN) of Indonesia, the Coordinating Ministry for Maritime Affairs and Investment (Kemenkomarves), and the renowned research vessel from the United States, OceanXplorer, was conducted from May to July 2024. This activity involved two lecturers from the Faculty of Marine Science and Fisheries (FIKP) of Hasanuddin University, in a research expedition aimed at exploring the Indian Ocean. The research team consisted of members from various countries, creating a collaborative environment rich in knowledge and expertise.

Dr. Widyastuti Umar and Prof. Nita Rukminasari participated in the expedition by joining different legs aboard the OceanXplorer. Dr. Widyastuti Umar joined Leg 2, which sailed from Aceh to Padang for a full month. Meanwhile, Prof. Nita Rukminasari contributed during Leg 3, a two-week expedition from Padang to Jakarta. Their primary research focus was on environmental DNA (eDNA) to investigate biodiversity from the surface to depths of over 5000 meters in the Indian Ocean waters.

During the expedition, water samples were analyzed using the Next Generation Sequencing Method – Oxford Nanopore Technologies, with equipment available onboard. The research findings provide crucial information for understanding the complex ecosystems thriving in the Indian Ocean. The collaboration between Indonesian and international researchers ensures a comprehensive approach to marine biodiversity research, promising valuable insights into previously unexplored marine areas.

The research results will be compiled and published in reputable scientific journals, marking Indonesia's significant contribution to global marine science. This effort demonstrates the commitment of Indonesia, particularly in Hasanuddin University, to advancing marine research and conservation efforts by leveraging cutting-edge technology and international partnerships for the benefit of global marine ecosystems.





THE FACULTY OF CULTURAL SCIENCES, HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY LECTURER PARTICIPATES IN DOCTORAL EXAMINATION ON JAPANESE COMIC ONOMATOPOEIA



Fithyani Anwar, S.S., M.A., Ph.D, - a lecturer in the Japanese Department, Faculty of Cultural Sciences (FIB), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) – was invited to become an examiner in an open examination of a doctoral dissertation at the University of Tsukuba, Japan on Tuesday 23 July 2024. The dissertation was entitled "Onomatopoeia in Japanese Comics: a Translation from Japanese Language to Bahasa Indonesia" (マンガにおけるオノマトペー日本語からインドネシア語への翻訳をめぐって). It was written by Idrus, S.S., M.Hum., an Indonesian student at the University of Tsukuba, Japan and a lecturer at Andalas University, Indonesia. The online dissertation examination was attended by 3 lecturers from Japan: Prof. Hiraishi Noriko, Prof. Ono Masaki, and Eguchi Maki, Ph.D. They teach in the Program of International Doctor and Advanced Japanese Studies at the University of Tsukuba. Fithyani Anwar is an alumna of a doctoral program in the same university.

Research on Japanese comics, especially related to onomatopoeia and its history which has not been conducted frequently in Indonesia. The Japanese language is known for its richness of onomatopoeia and this can be clearly identified in the works of Japanese comics creators. The occurrence of onomatopoeia in Japanese comics is unique. Furthermore, they make the nuances of the story easier to be understood by the readers. On the other hand, Bahasa Indonesia does not have as many onomatopoeias as the Japanese language. Therefore, it is very interesting to study the translation strategies used by Indonesian translators, especially by referring to language and cultural backgrounds.

Activity in foreign universities like this is very important for increasing the key performance indicators (KPI) of a university, especially KPI number 3 regarding the number of lecturers involved in teaching, research, and community service programs abroad. Lecturers of UNHAS can initiate this type of activity, or other activities like joint-research and joint-teaching, in cooperation with colleagues from outside Indonesia. This can improve the KPI of Universitas Hasanuddin in the future.





FACULTY OF NURSING, HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY STUDENTS ENGAGE IN GLOBAL EXCHANGE AT KANAZAWA UNIVERSITY



Two professional nursing students from the Faculty of Nursing (FKep), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), successfully participated in the Global Basic and Clinical Practice Exchange Program at Kanazawa University, Japan, from 14-29 July 2024. This program also included students from Taipei Medical University, Taiwan. The purpose of the exchange was to study the Japanese medical system, hospitals, community nursing practices, and culture, and compare them with the health systems in Indonesia and Taiwan.

The program began with an introductory meeting with Japanese students, followed by visits to several notable sites in Kanazawa City, including the 21st Century Museum of Contemporary Art, Oyama Jinja Shrine, and Omicho Market. A welcoming party was also held to greet the visiting students. During the exchange, the students observed various departments at Kanazawa University Hospital, including the psychiatric ward, dialysis and chemotherapy ward, ICU, perioperative room, maternal ward, cardiovascular ward, and pediatric ward. They also visited Saisekai Kanazawa Hospital, where they explored the convalescent rehabilitation ward, Ishikawa Prefectural Rehabilitation Center, and a simulation of a barrier-free house for the elderly and disabled. Additionally, they visited a store that sells welfare tools and equipment.

The students also engaged with community nursing for cancer patients at Genchan House, a certified NPO Corporation, and the gathering house "Haneume," supported by the Ishikawa Government. Genchan House offers a place where cancer patients, their families, and friends can consult, relax, and participate in various positive activities. Haneume includes Kurumi Cafe, a space where medical professionals and parents collaborate to support children with cancer. The cafe hosts numerous programs, such as board games for children, leaflet creation about social resources for parents, Christmas events, and International Childhood Cancer Light Up Day. Through this program, the students hope that their observations and experiences will broaden their perspectives and contribute to improving the quality of the Indonesian health system in the future.
