






INTERNATIONAL WEBINAR ON INNOVATIVE PHYSIOTHERAPY TECHNIQUES: ENHANCING FALL PREVENTION AND REHABILITATION FOR OLDER ADULTS WITH NEUROLOGICAL DISORDERS



The Physiotherapy Study Program, Faculty of Nursing (FKep), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) recently held a webinar on "Innovative Physiotherapy Techniques for Fall Prevention and Rehabilitation in Older People with Neurological Disorders." The webinar took place on August 6th 2024 at 12:30-16:30 Central Indonesia Time and featured three speakers who are faculty members, scientists, and clinical physiotherapists from different countries and time zones, namely: A/Prof Michele Callisaya, BAppSci (Physio), PhD from Monash University (Australia), Prof Dr. Djohan Aras, S.Ft, Physio, M.Kes from UNHAS (Indonesia), and Dr. Rosie Morris BSc, MSc, PhD from Newcastle University (UK). The webinar was attended not only by students but also by physiotherapy clinicians and academic members in the healthcare field, with an estimated 280 participants. The aim of this webinar was to update the knowledge of students, clinicians, faculty and academic community members on the science and skills of physiotherapy and rehabilitation in the current work and educational environment, especially in the fields of geriatrics, neurology, and exercise therapy.

This event was moderated by one of the Physiotherapy lecturers, Yusfina, S.Ft, Physio, M.Kes. At the end of each session, the Head of the Physiotherapy Study Program and the secretary of the Physiotherapy Study Program presented each speaker with a certificate as a token of appreciation, which was warmly and enthusiastically received by the speakers. At the end of the event, several participants left messages and impressions in the comment section regarding this webinar. They were very impressed with the presentations of the three speakers, which were truly scientific and highly beneficial for them in the future. Some of the participants also greatly appreciated the organizers who successfully held the webinar by bringing together three scientists in the field of physiotherapy from three different countries and even different time zones. They hope that activities like this can be held more frequently by the Physiotherapy Study Program at UNHAS.

UNHAS PARTNERS WITH CHINESE UNIVERSITIES FOR MARINE RANCHING AND ARTIFICIAL REEF PROJECT



China-Indonesia Collaboration: Marine Ranching Demonstration Project. Technical Cooperation and Exchange on Marine Ecological Pasture in the Coastal Areas of China and Indonesia was held on Thursday August 15th 2024. The event was conducted in a hybrid format across three locations: Hasanuddin University (Meeting Room of the Faculty of Marine Sciences and Fisheries (FIKP), Guangdong Ocean University, and Shanghai Ocean University. Present at the event were Vice-Rector IV of Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), Prof. Adi Maulana, Dean of the Faculty of Marine Sciences and Fisheries, Prof. Safruddin, Vice Dean II of FIKP, Prof. Ahmad Faizal, Vice Dean III of FIKP, Prof. Abdul Haris, and Prof. Andi Niartiningsih, along with faculty members and students in Marine Sciences at FIKP UNHAS.

The event began with a welcoming speech from the Vice-Rector IV of UNHAS. In his remarks, Prof. Adi Maulana expressed his gratitude to Shanghai Ocean University (SHOU) and Guangdong Ocean University (GOU) for their cooperation in the field of marine and fisheries technology. The established collaboration is expected to have a significant positive impact, not only in terms of university partnerships but also on a broader scale between the two countries, Indonesia and China. SHOU and GOU are currently focusing on marine biodiversity conservation activities and have selected UNHAS as a partner in the implementation of this project. The conservation project involves the creation of artificial reefs and sea ranching, which will be placed on several islands in the Spermonde Archipelago, Makassar Strait. At the end of his speech, Prof. Adi also expressed his gratitude to both partner universities for involving UNHAS in the commemoration of National Ecology Day in China.

The event continued with remarks from the Dean of FIKP, UNHAS. Prof. Safruddin stated that, since the signing of the MoU between GOU, SHOU, and UNHAS, many benefits have been gained by both UNHAS and its partners. Several FIKP UNHAS alumni have received scholarships to pursue master's degrees at SHOU, participated in Summer School programs, and engaged in research collaborations. The event also featured a discussion session that began with a presentation on the design of Artificial Reefs and Sea Ranching by Dr. Syafyudin Yusuf, a Marine Science lecturer specializing in coral reef research. Dr. Syafyudin Yusuf presented several types of artificial reefs that have been widely used to improve marine ecosystem conditions.

During the 30-minute discussion, several participants raised questions regarding the effectiveness of the design and materials used in constructing the artificial reefs. Other questions related to the safety of the materials, ensuring they do not adversely affect the sea due to pollution. The discussion concluded with a consensus that all designs and materials used in the Artificial Reefs and Sea Ranching construction must undergo monitoring and evaluation to ensure their effectiveness and safety. The event ended with a visit to the FIKP UNHAS garden to view examples of the artificial reef designs on display.





DEPARTMENT OF INDONESIAN LITERATURES HOSTS CHINESE INBOUND STUDENTS FOR BIPA PROGRAM IN CULTURAL EXCHANGE INITIATIVE



On Friday, August 16th, 2024, Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) warmly welcomed 13 inbound students from Hafei University of Technology, China, in a ceremony held at the Senate Room of the Faculty of Cultural Sciences (FIB). The students are set to participate in a semester-long *Bahasa Indonesia untuk Penutur Asing* (BIPA) or Indonesian Language for Non-Native Speakers program, hosted by the Department of Indonesian Literature. This program is part of a broader initiative to promote cultural exchange and strengthen academic ties between Indonesia and China.

The Welcome Ceremony was attended by key officials from both the International Office and the Faculty of Cultural Sciences. These short lectures provided valuable new knowledge for the participants. 


Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) proudly participated in the 15th International Academic Consortium for Sustainable Cities (IACSC) Conference, hosted by the University of the Philippines (UP) Manila, in collaboration with UP Diliman and UP Los Baños. The conference, held from 19th-23rd August 2024, showcased a series of impactful activities, including the Sustainable Urban Development Program (SUDP) and the International Urban Planning Workshop (IUPW).

A highlight of the conference was the IACSC Symposium, held on 23rd August 2024 at the SEDA Manila Bay hotel. The symposium featured esteemed plenary speaker Prof. Sukri Plutturi (Dean of the Faculty of Public Health, UNHAS), who presented in an engaging session alongside two other prominent speakers from UP and the Department of Health of the Government of the Philippines. Muhammad Ridwan, M.A. (International Office Secretary) concluded the conference with a keynote address announcing that UNHAS would host the 16th IACSC Conference in Makassar, Indonesia. His invitation to all IACSC members to experience the vibrant culture and dynamic campus life in Makassar was met with enthusiasm.

The SUDP and IUPW were tailored for students from IACSC member institutions, with the SUDP held at UP Los Baños and observed by Khaeruddin, Ph.D., (International Office Task Force member). The IUPW, hosted at UP Diliman, included participation from two students from the Urban City Planning Study Program of the Faculty of Engineering at UNHAS. These students were guided by three faculty members—Dr. Eng. Ihsan, S.T., M.T., Isfa Sastrawati, S.T., M.T. and team—as they presented their reflections and insights on the workshops.

The conference not only provided valuable learning experiences but also highlighted the active role and commitment of UNHAS to advancing sustainable urban development and planning on an international stage. FUTURE INTERNET ENGINEERS FROM ASIA-PACIFIC GATHER AT HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY FOR ASIA PACIFIC INTERNET ENGINEERING CAMP



The fourth Asia Pacific Internet Engineering (APIE) Camp batch officially began at the Laboratory of Ubiquitous Computing and Networking (Ubicon Lab), Department of Informatics, Faculty of Engineering (FT), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) in Gowa, South Sulawesi, from 12th-16th August 2024. The camp was designed to enhance the technical skills of future internet engineers, preparing them to contribute effectively to the development and expansion of internet infrastructure within the region. Participants will engage in hands-on sessions led by experts from the Asia Pacific Network Information Centre (APNIC), Amazon Web Services (AWS), Keio University, and UNHAS.

The purpose of their visit was to observe and learn about management of the outpatient clinic for post-stroke patients at HCTM Primer Clinic & Long-term Stroke Unit . The UNHAS team was warmly welcomed by a group of health workers managing post-stroke patients, led by Professor Dr. Noor Azah Abd Aziz. In the HCTN Primer Clinic and Long-term Stroke Unit, the UNHAS team learnt intensively about various programs provided for post-stroke patients and their families. In addition, the flow of post-stroke management and roles of each health profession were also discussed.

The relationship between the Faculty of Medicine UKM and FKep UNHAS started when Professor Dr. Noor Azah Abd Aziz from UKM and Dr. Andi Masyitha were both Doctoral program supervisors of Mr. Yudi Hardianto, a young physiotherapy lecturer working at the Department of Physiotherapy, FKep UNHAS, who is currently studying at Monash University, Australia. Mr Yudi Hardianto's dissertation is focused on the development of community rehabilitation programs for post-stroke patients. The model is successfully implemented in Malaysia where HCTM Primer Clinic & Long-term Stroke Unit is the pioneer.

Before ending the visit, some multinational research plans related to post-stroke management, a follow-up training program provided by UKM in November, and community service extension for post-stroke patients managed by UNHAS were also discussed.





FACULTY OF MARINE SCIENCES AND FISHERIES, HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY AND WAGENINGEN UNIVERSITY COLLABORATE IN PUBLIC LECTURE ON SUSTAINABLE FOOD PRODUCTION



The Faculty of Marine Science and Fisheries (FIKP) at Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) held a public lecture featuring two researchers from Wageningen University, namely Pepijn van Oort and Ingrid Gever. The lecture took place in Room KP 311-312, 3rd floor of FIKP UNHAS, from 9:00 AM to 12:00 PM Central Indonesia Time. This event provided a rare opportunity for FIKP UNHAS students and academic staff to gain direct insights from international experts on crucial issues in sustainable food production from aquaculture systems.

The topics discussed in this lecture included the Wageningen Project "Sustainable Food Production from Aquatic Systems". This session covered how Wageningen applies scientific approaches to enhance food production through sustainable aquatic systems. Another topic was Effects of Seaweed Seedling Starting Weight, Longline Tubenet, and Cages on Seaweed Growth in South West Sulawesi - An important study examining various factors that influence seaweed growth, particularly in the South West Sulawesi region. The last topic was Multi-Stakeholder Collaboration for Food, Agriculture, and Nature. This segment explored the importance of cross-sector collaboration in efforts to improve sustainability in food, agriculture, and nature.

This public lecture was part of FIKP UNHAS's efforts to broaden the knowledge and perspectives of its students, as well as to strengthen international collaboration in research and education in the field of marine science and fisheries. The event is expected to pave the way for further cooperation between UNHAS and Wageningen University in future research and development initiatives.





ENHANCING INTERNATIONAL NURSING COLLABORATION: PROFESSOR MAKOTO OE'S VISITS TO HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY



The Master of Nursing Study Program, Faculty of Nursing (FKep) Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) recently hosted an inbound visit from Professor Makoto Oe, Ph.D., RN, from the Institute of Medical, Pharmaceutical, and Health Sciences, Kanazawa University. The visit, which took place from 13th-16th August 2024, aimed to enhance collaboration on research and publication, particularly in the prevention and care management of diabetic foot wounds.

On the first day, Professor Makoto Oe, Ph.D., RN was warmly welcomed by the Dean of the Faculty of Nursing, UNHAS, Prof. Dr. Ariyanti Saleh, M.Si. and the Head of the Master of Nursing Study Program, Saldy Yusuf, Ph.D. In her opening remarks, the Dean emphasized the significance of fostering research and publication partnerships to elevate the reputation of both institutions. Professor Makoto Oe, Ph.D., RN also delivered a guest lecture (as Visiting Lecturer) to the new students of the Master of Nursing Study Program, batch 2024, at the IPTEKS building. During her lecture, Professor Oe highlighted the critical role of nurses in Japan in addressing clinical challenges through research innovation. She provided an example of how Japan successfully reduced the prevalence of decubitus ulcers to below 3%, supported by the implementation of an incentive system for Japanese nurses. Additionally, she discussed innovative approaches, such as integrating Biology and Engineering into Bioengineering Nursing, to address nursing challenges, including the design and implementation of vibration tools in the management of decubitus prevention.

The second day of the visit included tours of Dr. Wahidin Sudirohusodo Hospital, UNHAS Teaching Hospital, the Griya Afiat Independent Wound Care Practice, and Cendrawasih Health Center. These visits were conducted to gather preliminary information on diabetes mellitus management strategies, issues related to acute and chronic wounds, and the prevention and care of diabetic foot ulcers. Furthermore, the UNHAS Master of Nursing Study Program organized a mini-symposium, providing lecturers and students with the opportunity to present research with potential for collaboration with the Institute of Medical, Pharmaceutical, and Health Sciences, Kanazawa University. Professor Makoto Oe, Ph.D., RN served as an expert panelist, offering valuable insights during the symposium.





THE SOCIETY FOR THE ADVANCEMENT OF BREEDING RESEARCH IN ASIA AND OCEANIA APPOINTS HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY'S FACULTY OF AGRICULTURE MEMBER TO KEY LEADERSHIP POSITION



Dr. Muhammad Fuad Anshori from the Faculty of Agriculture (Faperta), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) was honored by being appointed to the board of the Society for the Advancement of Breeding Research in Asia and Oceania (SABRAO) for the 2024-2028 term. With over 10 plant breeding articles published in the SABRAO Journal, Dr. Anshori was recognized for his contributions and was appointed as the Second General Secretary of the organization. His published work was considered highly competent, particularly in encouraging the next generation to pursue careers in breeding research.

The newly elected Chairman of SABRAO is Prof. Chen Xin from the Institute of Industrial Crops at the Jiangsu Academy of Agricultural Sciences in China. SABRAO, a professional organization dedicated to the scientific and practical advancement of plant, animal, and fish breeding and genetics in Asia and Oceania, has played a crucial role in the field's development since its founding in 1968. The organization was established during a period of food security concerns and has been instrumental in the research efforts that contributed to the Green Revolution. With 56 years of experience, SABRAO hosts a congress every four years to discuss the progress in breeding across the region and to restructure its board.

This year, in collaboration with the Crop Science Society of the Philippines, SABRAO held its 15th International Congress on Crop Science and Breeding from 12-15 August 2024, at the Crimson Hotel, Alabang, Philippines. The congress, themed "Emerging Paradigms in Crop Science and Breeding: Cultivating Sustainable Solutions and Partnerships for a Resilient Future," saw the participation of Dr. Muhammad Fuad Anshori and Prof. Yunus Musa. Both presented well-received papers: "A Comprehensive Multivariate Approach for GxE Interaction Analysis in Early Maturing Rice Varieties" by Dr. Anshori and "Evaluation of Cultivation Technology Package and Corn Variety Based on Agronomy and Leaf Green Pigment Characters" by Prof. Musa. These papers have been submitted to the Frontiers in Plant Science (Q1) and Open Agriculture (Q2) journals, respectively, significantly contributing to breeding research. The Faperta UNHAS) aspires to become a leader in the field of breeding, particularly in Eastern Indonesia, and to remain active in international breeding research initiatives.





FACULTY OF MEDICINE, HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY HOSTS DISTINGUISHED NEUROLOGY EXPERTS FOR A SPECIAL GUEST LECTURE



On August 21st, 2024, the Department of Neurology, Faculty of Medicine (FK) at Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) held a distinguished guest lecture event at the Auditorium Prof. A. Amiruddin. The event, conducted in a hybrid format, was attended by 500 participants.

This special lecture featured three prominent neurology experts from various international institutions. Dr. Masafumi Ihara, MD, PhD, FACP, FAHA, Head of the Neurology Division at the National Cerebral and Cardiovascular Center (NCVC), Japan, presented on "Current Updates of Genetic Stroke," discussing the latest developments in genetic stroke research. The second speaker, Dr. Tomotaka Tanaka, MD, PhD, also from NCVC, Japan, and Head of the Neurology Division, delivered a talk on "Post-Stroke Epilepsy - Burden of Stroke Survivors," exploring the challenges faced by stroke survivors who develop post-stroke epilepsy. The third speaker, Dr. Sonu Bhaskar, MD, PhD, PD, FANA, a renowned physician-scientist, director, and neurologist, who serves on the Board of Directors at the Global Health Neurology Lab and NSW Brain Clot Bank, presented on "Global Impact of Neurological Disorders on Health," examining the worldwide impact of neurological disorders on public health.

The event was hosted by Dr. Raissa Alfaathir Heri, Sp.N as the MC, and Dr. Gita Vita Soraya, Ph.D as Moderator. The opening remarks were delivered by Dr. dr. 

ENHANCING INFECTION MANAGEMENT: HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL'S INSIGHTFUL VISIT TO SAMSUNG MEDICAL CENTER, SOUTH KOREA



On August 22nd 2024, a delegation from Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) Hospital visited the Samsung Medical Center (SMC) in Seoul, South Korea and participated in a workshop conducted specifically for this delegation. The workshop focused on the integration of teaching hospitals in infection patient care. This workshop represented a valuable opportunity for UNHAS Hospital to learn various best practices and the latest innovations in infection management implemented at SMC, which is known as one of the leading hospitals in this field. This workshop was funded by the EURO Grant project. It was awarded by the European Union due to UNHAS Hospital's success in managing the *Kreditanstalt für Wiederaufbau* (KfW) Loan from Germany. This project is managed by the Project Implementation Unit (PIU) of UNHAS Hospital, led by the President Director of UNHAS Hospital, Prof. Dr. Andi Muhammad Ichsan, Ph.D., Sp. M (K), with the Project Implementing Agency (PIA) from UNHAS and the Project Executing Agency (PEA) from the Ministry of Education and Culture.

The delegation from UNHAS Hospital comprised several experienced and competent healthcare professionals, namely Dr. Irwandy, S.KM., M.Kes., M.Sc.PH, The Director of Finance, Marketing and General affairs; Dr. Abdul Azis, Sp.U., Subsp.Onk, who serves as the Director of Medical Services and Medical support, and is also a medical specialist in urology and oncology; Dr. Rosyidah Arafat, S. Kep, Ns., M. Kep, Sp. Keb. MB who serves as the Director of Nursing and Non-Medical Support; Dr. dr. Risna Halim Mubin, SpPD, KPTI, a medical specialist in internal Diseases specifically Infectious Diseases; and Dr. Nur Arifah, S.KM., MA, who serves as the UNHAS Hospital Human Resources Manager. Several unit heads also took part in the workshop.

The delegation was welcomed by Ms Ye Young Kim, the Head of the International Relations Department. The workshop began with a general overview of the Samsung Medical Center, delivered by Ms Ye Young Kim herself. This was followed by Professor Jiwoon Kim, Deputy Director of the Office of Education & Human Resources Department (HRD) who provided insights on SMC's S-Track program, organizational culture, and leadership training. Professor Sun-Young Cho, Chief of the Infection Control Office, also gave a presentation on the SMC's infection control system and response strategies.

After the presentations, the delegation toured various facilities, including the Diagnostic Haematology Laboratory, Molecular Genetics Laboratory, Surgical Skill Training Room, and the Robotic Logistics Centre. The workshop covered mechanisms and procedures for infection prevention, which are vital for reducing the risk of infection transmission within the hospital environment. There were also discussions on the supporting equipment used in infection patient care, including the latest technology and medical tools specifically designed to enhance the effectiveness of infection prevention and treatment.

SMC is known for its exemplary infection control programs. These include infection control team training, aimed at enhancing the skills and knowledge of medical staff in preventing and managing infections. Furthermore, they have a clinical simulation center that allows medical professionals to practice in scenarios that closely mimic real-life conditions, thus improving their readiness and response to infection cases. The educational content development program at Samsung Hospital also serves to update the knowledge and skills of medical staff regarding the latest practices in infection patient care.

During this visit, the delegation from UNHAS Hospital not only gained insights into the practices and programs implemented at SMC, but also received valuable general information about how SMC operates. This included the organizational strategies employed to achieve hospital goals, the organizational culture that supports staff performance and engagement, and the innovative programs available at the hospital. This information was crucial for providing a clearer picture of how SMC manages and enhances the quality of infection patient care.

It is expected that UNHAS Hospital will be able to implement programs similar to those at SMC, by adopting best practices and innovations that have been proven effective at the Samsung Medical Center. The implementation of these programs will contribute to enhanced patient safety, reduced infection risks, and to an overall improvement in medical service quality at the UNHAS Hospital.






MALAYSIA'S DIGITAL GOVERNANCE TRANSFORMATION HIGHLIGHTED IN HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY PUBLIC LECTURE



The Department of Administrative Sciences, Faculty of Social and Political Sciences (FISIP) Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) kicked off the 2024/2025 academic year with a public lecture, held through Zoom on Wednesday 28th August 2024 from 9-11am Makassar time, focusing on the digitalization of governance, and highlighting Malaysia's experience. Organized by the *Laboratorium Riset Kebijakan dan Manajemen Publik* (LRKMP) or Public Policy and Management Research Laboratory, the event featured Dr. Nur Ajrun Khalid from Universiti Sains Malaysia (USM) as the keynote speaker. During the lecture, Dr. Ajrun detailed Malaysia's significant strides in digital government transformation, including the establishment of the Malaysian Administrative Modernisation and Management Planning Unit (MAMPU), which spearheads digitization efforts across various sectors. He also discussed Malaysia's strategic use of advanced technologies like Artificial Intelligence (AI), Blockchain, and robotics to enhance public service efficiency and responsiveness.

In his presentation, Dr. Ajrun noted that Malaysia ranked 42nd globally in digitalization and open government according to the United Nations in 2020. Despite this achievement, he acknowledged the challenges Malaysia faces, such as uneven digital literacy, limited internet access in remote areas, and cybersecurity concerns. The lecture was followed by an engaging Q&A session, where participants, including students and researchers from UNHAS and other universities, explored comparisons between Malaysia and Indonesia's digital governance and discussed the potential opportunities and challenges both countries face in implementing new technologies.

Prof. Dr. Alwi (Chair of the Department of Administrative Sciences) emphasized the importance of such lectures in offering students a global perspective, crucial for understanding public governance in the digital era. He highlighted that inviting international experts is a routine practice to inspire students, especially those returning from semester breaks or just beginning their studies at UNHAS. Dr. Muhammad Tang Abdullah (Secretary of the Department) expressed hopes that the event would open doors for collaborative research with international partners, contributing significantly to the development of public administration sciences.
