CELEBRATING CULTURES: THE 2ND INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS FESTIVAL UNITES DIVERSITY



The 2nd International Students Festival (ISF) on "Uniting Global Culture in One Celebration," was held as part of the 68th anniversary of Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) on Sunday, September 15, 2024. This event started from 8:30 AM to 3:00 PM Makassar time. Organized by the International Office (IO) of UNHAS, the event aimed to celebrate cultural diversity and foster international collaboration among students. This year's ISF attracted more than 800 spectators, including members of the UNHAS academic community, local residents, and the parents of local students, all united in a vibrant showcase of global traditions.

The festival commenced with a series of opening remarks delivered by key representatives. Dr. Andi Masyitha Irwan (Head of IO) commonly called Mrs. Citha, welcomed everyone to the event, emphasizing the importance of international student integration and cultural exchange. Dr. Mardi Adi Armin (Vice Dean for Academic and Student Affairs at the Faculty of Cultural Sciences (FIB), also spoke on behalf of the 68th UNHAS) Anniversary committee), reflecting on the university's commitment to internationalization. Ali Amer Ellayan, a representative of the International Students Association (ISA), expressed his appreciation for the platform given to showcase their cultures. Finally, Prof. Sumbangan Baja, M.Phil., UNHAS Secretary, officially opened the festival, setting a celebratory tone for the day.

One of the highlights of the festival was the diverse range of booths representing the home countries of international students. Alongside these booths were international corners representing Japan, Mandarin, German, Australian (Aussie *Banget*), French (Warung Perancis), and Korean cultures. The Education USA and International Office also set up booths to provide information and guidance on international study opportunities.

The culinary aspect of the ISF added a rich layer of cultural experience. Each booth offered traditional foods and drinks, giving spectators a taste of the international students' diverse culinary traditions. Visitors enjoyed delicacies ranging from Middle Eastern dishes to African beverages, creating a vibrant atmosphere that allowed everyone to appreciate the rich tapestry of cultures represented at the university. In addition to the booths, the ISF featured stage performances that enlivened the event. The Japanese Consulate in Makassar participated, with the Consul himself performing two Japanese songs, drawing the attention of many spectators. EMPOWERING GLOBAL MOBILITY: IISMA PROGRAM TAKES CENTER STAGE AT HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY



The International Office (IO), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) conducted a series of info sessions for the 2025 Indonesian International Students Mobility Award (IISMA) from Monday to Thursday, September 9-12, 2024. The sessions targeted students from the 2022 to 2024 batches, focusing on their preparation to apply for IISMA. The IO Dream Team, including the Head, Secretary, Task Forces, and staff, delivered the presentations, and IISMA alumni participated to share their experiences and best practices whenever their schedules permitted.

The info sessions kicked off on Monday with presentations at the Faculty of Mathematics and Natural Sciences (MIPA) and the Faculty of Social and Political Sciences (FISIP). On Tuesday, the sessions continued at the Faculty of Cultural Sciences (FIB), Faculty of Marine Sciences and Fisheries (FIKP), Faculty of Agriculture (Faperta), Faculty of Animal Sciences (Fapet), and Faculty of Law (FH). On Wednesday, the team visited the Faculty of Dentistry (FKG), Faculty of Medicine, Faculty of Forestry, and Faculty of Nursing. Finally, the series wrapped up on Thursday at the Faculty of Pharmacy (Farmasi), Faculty of Vocational Studies (Vokasi), Faculty of Public Health (FKM), Faculty of Economics and Business (FEB), and Faculty of Engineering (FT).

During each session, the IO team elaborated the IISMA program, while IISMA alumni shared their inspiring experiences, offering students valuable insights into the program. This helped motivate students from the 2022, 2023, and 2024 batches to consider applying in the future. Although the 2024 batch is not yet eligible to apply, they were encouraged to attend so they could prepare themselves for future participation in IISMA when the registration period opens for them.

Each session concluded with a Question & Answer (Q&A), where students had the opportunity to ask detailed questions about the program, followed by a photo session and expressions of gratitude from the IO to the host faculties.







FOSTERING GLOBAL COLLABORATION: FACULTY OF NURSING, JOINS INTERNATIONAL HEALTH AND WELFARE EXCHANGE IN JAPAN



The Faculty of Nursing (FKep), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), successfully participated in an International exchange program titled "Enhancing the Attractiveness of Niigata Prefecture through Human Resource Development in Health, Medical Care, and Welfare". The event was organized by Niigata University of Health and Welfare (NUHW), Japan, from Monday, February 2, 2024, to Friday, February 6, 2024.

The faculty was represented by three students and one lecturer, who engaged in knowledge exchange with participants from other institutions, including the University of Santo Tomas (UST), Philippines, and Hai Duong Medical Technical University (HMTU), Vietnam. Throughout the program, participants attended lectures covering topics such as "Japan's Medical Insurance System and Long-Term Care Insurance System," "Rehabilitation and Nutrition," "New Technologies for Movement Analysis," "Types and Supply of Prosthetics Orthotics and Assistive Devices," and "Understanding Dementia" as well as "Prevention of Anterior Cruciate Ligament Injury of the Knee with Biomechanics."


In addition to classroom learning, participants toured health facilities, including Niigata Rehabilitation Hospital and the Nursing Care Facility "Sakurai no Sato." They were also introduced to aspects of Japanese culture such as language, calligraphy, food, and visits to historical sites. As part of the cultural exchange, the participants from each country presented about their respective cultures to local elementary school students.

On the final day, each country delivered presentations reflecting the new knowledge and experiences they gained during their time in Japan. The program concluded with a formal certificate handover by the Rector of NUHW, Masatoyo Nishizawa, MD, Ph.D., to all participants.





STRENGTHENING INTERNATIONAL COLLABORATION: HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY'S NURSING FACULTY VISITS KANAZAWA UNIVERSITY



On September 3 and 4, 2024, two distinguished members of the Faculty of Nursing (FKep), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), Dr. Andi Masyitha Irwan and Dr. Syahrul, visited the Graduate School of Health Sciences at Kanazawa University, Japan. This visit aimed to enhance the academic partnership between the two institutions, focusing on student exchange programs and collaborative research.

During the meeting on September 3, Dr. Irwan engaged in discussions with Prof. Mayumi Kato and Dr. Miho Shogeji to evaluate the success of the 2024 student exchange program between Hasanuddin University and Kanazawa University. From July 14 to 29, 2024, two undergraduate nursing students from UNHAS participated in this exchange program, which was funded by the Japan Student Services Organization (JASSO) and Hasanuddin University. The program provided students with academic lectures, clinical exposure, and cultural immersion activities, and it included nursing students from both Kanazawa University and Taiwan Medical University. As part of a reciprocal exchange, a student from Kanazawa University is scheduled to visit Hasanuddin University in early March 2025 for a similar training experience.

The meeting also addressed the planning for the upcoming 2025 exchange program, with a particular focus on improving the overall structure of the collaboration. In addition to the student exchange program, the discussion covered potential visiting lectures and initial research collaborations between the institutions. On the following day, the UNHAS team met with two prominent professors from Kanazawa University: Prof. Makoto Oe, an expert in Chronic Care and Wound Management Nursing, and Prof. Akiko Tsuda, a specialist in Pediatric Nursing. Both professors are set to deliver guest lectures to undergraduate and postgraduate nursing students at Hasanuddin University, further enriching the academic experience for the students. This courtesy visit has deepened the academic ties between Hasanuddin University and Kanazawa University, fostering opportunities for continued cooperation in nursing education and research.





UNHAS WELCOMES NEW KNB SCHOLARSHIP AWARDEES FROM DIVERSE COUNTRIES



The International Office (IO), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) recently welcomed eight awardees of the *Kemitraan Negara Berkembang* (KNB) or Partnership of Developing Countries scholarship program, who arrived in Makassar over three different flights. This prestigious Indonesian government scholarship is aimed at students from developing countries, offering opportunities for them to pursue higher education in Indonesia. The awardees hailed from countries including Pakistan, Botswana, Yemen, India, and Madagascar, reflecting the diverse international community at UNHAS.

The first group of arrivals consisted of three students from Pakistan and one from Botswana, followed by a second group from Yemen and India. The final arrival was a student from Madagascar. Of the eight awardees, two will pursue undergraduate programs, one student is enrolled in doctoral program, and the remaining five are set to embark on master's studies. Upon arrival, they were warmly greeted by the IO staff, accompanied by dedicated student volunteers who assisted in picking them up from the airport and ensuring a smooth transition to their new dormitory accommodations.

As part of their initial orientation, the IO conducted a short post-arrival briefing, aimed at helping the new students adjust during their first week in Makassar. This session covered essential matters, such as setting up local bank accounts and practical tips for navigating daily life in a new environment. To ensure their smooth integration, the KNB awardees will participate in the *Bahasa Indonesia untuk Penutur Asing* (BIPA) or Indonesian Language Program for Non-Native Speakers by UNHAS Language Services, which will equip them with the necessary language skills to thrive in their academic and social life at UNHAS.

The arrival of these new KNB scholars is a testament to UNHAS's ongoing commitment to fostering international collaboration and academic excellence, as the university continues to provide opportunities for students from around the world to engage in high-quality education in Indonesia.






DISTINGUISHED FACULTY OF NURSING MEMBER DELIVERS LECTURE ON INDONESIAN HEALTHCARE AT SEIREI CHRISTOPHER UNIVERSITY, JAPAN



On September 6, 2024, Dr. Andi Masyitha Irwan, a member of the Faculty of Nursing (FKep) at Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), delivered an online public lecture to students of the International Healthcare and Welfare Program at Seirei Christopher University (SCU), Japan. This lecture followed a visit by the President of Seirei Christopher University, Prof. Shohei Ohgi, and his team to UNHAS, during which a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed with UNHAS Rector, Prof. Jamaluddin, and a series of lectures were given to UNHAS nursing students.

The lecture, titled *Cultural Awareness and the Health System in Indonesia*, was organized by the International Education and Scholar Services of SCU and lasted for approximately 45 minutes. Dr. Irwan provided insights into Indonesia's healthcare system, emphasizing the importance of cultural awareness in delivering health services. Following the lecture, Dr. Irwan engaged in a lively Q&A session, fielding questions from faculty members and students, particularly about the differences in healthcare and welfare systems between Japan and Indonesia.

This exchange of lectures between the two universities is part of a broader effort to foster mutual understanding of diverse healthcare systems, enabling students from both institutions to gain a deeper appreciation of global health service variations.





UNLOCKING OPPORTUNITIES: SUMITOMO FOUNDATION GRANT INFO SESSION AT HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY

The event attracted around 100 participants from various regions across Indonesia, demonstrating a strong interest in the grant opportunities and fostering a connection between Indonesian researchers and the Sumitomo Foundation.

GUEST LECTURE ON DENTAL PHOTOGRAPHY FOR RESIDENT SPECIALISTS AT HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY



On Friday, September 20, 2024, the Faculty of Dentistry (FKG) at Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) hosted a guest lecture on dental photography for resident specialists. This special session was aimed at training dental residents in the effective documentation, archiving, and management of clinical cases. The workshop also focused on utilizing photography for clinical research, highlighting its importance in the broader scope of clinical management. This marks the first time an official dental photography workshop has been held at FKG UNHAS, reflecting the faculty's commitment to enhancing clinical skills.

The workshop took place at the *Aula drg. Hj. Halimah Dg. Sikati* in the UNHAS Dental and Oral Hospital (RSGMP). It featured Dr. Mohd. Zulkifli Bin Kassim from Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM) as the guest speaker. Dr. Zulkifli, a renowned expert in dental photography, provided comprehensive training on the technical and practical aspects of using photography in dentistry. He demonstrated how precise documentation can support clinical management and improve the accuracy of case tracking over time.

Throughout the lecture, participants were introduced to advanced techniques in dental photography, from capturing clear images of dental conditions to organizing them efficiently for research and clinical purposes. Dr. Zulkifli emphasized the significance of high-quality photographic documentation, not only for resident specialists' clinical records but also for enhancing research presentations and contributing to the field of dentistry.

The guest lecture proved to be an invaluable opportunity for the resident specialists, equipping them with the skills necessary to manage clinical cases more effectively. As dental photography becomes an integral part of modern dentistry, this workshop paves the way for improved patient care and more robust clinical research.





TURNING WASTE INTO VALUE: HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY AND UNIVERSITI PUTRA MALAYSIA TRAIN HOUSEWIVES TO RECYCLE USED COOKING OIL INTO SOAP



As part of a community service initiative, the Public Health Undergraduate Study Program at the Faculty of Public Health (FKM), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), in collaboration with lecturers from the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences, Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM), conducted a training session on converting used cooking oil into soap. The event took place on Wednesday, September 11, 2024, in RW 06 Kampung Kera-Kera, Tamalanrea Indah Village, Tamalanrea District, and was attended by 20 local housewives.

The primary aim of this initiative was to educate the community on how to recycle waste cooking oil, preventing it from being carelessly discarded and causing environmental harm. Additionally, converting the used oil into soap can serve household purposes, such as washing clothes and dishes, ultimately helping families reduce expenses.

Dr. Saliza, a lecturer from UPM involved in the training, shared that this community empowerment initiative has already been successfully implemented in Malaysia. "In Malaysia, we have empowered communities to produce soap from waste cooking oil, which they then commercialize to generate income. I hope the people of Kampung Kera-Kera can adopt this practice as well or, at the very least, use it to meet their household needs," said Dr. Saliza. She further explained that 200 grams of used cooking oil can be transformed into five to six small bars of soap. This effort is a starting point for empowering the community to turn waste into valuable products.

Dr. Hasnawati Amqam, (Head of the Public Health Undergraduate Study Program) and an Environmental Health lecturer, emphasized the importance of the training for both the environment and public health. "We aim to educate the community on waste management to prevent environmental and health risks. This is also part of our commitment to maintaining sustainable environmental health," Dr. Hasnawati stated.

Furthermore, this initiative aligns with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), particularly SDG 12 (Responsible Consumption and Production) and SDG 1 (No Poverty). By reducing hazardous waste and creating useful household products, the activity promotes environmental awareness and offers economic opportunities to the local community.

In addition to fostering environmental responsibility, the training offers an opportunity for participants to generate extra income by producing and selling soap made from waste cooking oil. This can help improve the economic well-being of local residents.

Both UNHAS and UPM hope this collaborative initiative will serve as a foundation for creating a community that is both environmentally conscious and economically empowered.





FACULTY OF MEDICINE HOSTS GUEST LECTURE ON DATA ANALYSIS FOR QUALITATIVE AND MIXED-METHOD RESEARCH WITH DR.GERBEN MOERMAN



On Tuesday, September 17, 2024, the Department of Medical Education (DPK) and the Master's Program in Medical and Health Professions Education (S2 IPKK) of the Faculty of Medicine, Hasanuddin University (FK UNHAS), hosted a guest lecture titled "Data Analysis for Qualitative and Mixed-method Research" in the Faculty Senate Room. The event featured Dr. G.A. (Gerben) Moerman, a Senior Lecturer in Social Research Methodology from the Faculty of Social and Behavioural Sciences, University of Amsterdam.




NAVIGATING GLOBAL EDUCATION: INSIGHTS FROM THE FRIDAY OUTBOUND CLINIC



SMART CONTRACTS AND E-COMMERCE: EXPLORING LEGAL FRAMEWORKS IN INDONESIA AND MALAYSIA



On Friday, September 20, 2024, at 09:00 WITA, the Faculty of Law (FH), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) held a guest lecture titled *"Formation of Smart Contracts: A Special Focus on Online Shopping."* The event, attended by 105 participants via Zoom, featured Prof. Dr. Zuhairah Ariff Binti Abd. Ghadas from University Sultan Zainal Abidin, Malaysia, as the guest speaker.


In his opening remarks, the Vice Dean for Academic and Student Affairs of the Faculty of Law, Prof. Dr. Maskun, SH, LLM, emphasized the significance of this event as part of ongoing cooperation efforts. He highlighted its role in contributing to the university's academic and partnership Key Performance Indicators (IKU). The Dean of the Faculty of Law, Prof. Dr. Hamzah Halim, S.H, M.H, M.A.P., officially opened the event. He expressed his appreciation for the collaboration with University Sultan Zainal Abidin and voiced his hopes for future joint activities. Prof. Hamzah also stressed the importance of comparing legal frameworks for smart contracts between Indonesia and Malaysia, particularly in the context of online shopping, which is evolving into a necessity of modern commerce.

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The event was organized by the Department of Civil Law at the Faculty of Law, with Dr. Aulia Rifai, S.H, M.H., Amaliyah, S.H, M.H., and Fadilla Jamilla, S.H., LLM, serving as the coordinators. The session was moderated by Achmad Fachri Faqi, S.H, LLM, a lecturer from the department.

During the lecture, Prof. Zuhairah Ariff provided an overview of contract formation under Malaysian law, the growth of online shopping, and the development of smart contracts. She explored whether smart contracts fulfill the requirements of a valid agreement under Malaysian law. She underscored the four key elements necessary for any contract—including smart contracts—namely proposal, acceptance, consideration, and intention to create legal relations. The discussion was particularly relevant given the increasing role of e-commerce and the need to balance technological advancements with legal compliance.

This guest lecture offered participants, particularly students, valuable insights into the comparative legal aspects of smart contracts between Malaysia and Indonesia. It also reaffirmed the Faculty of Law's commitment to expanding knowledge, fostering academic collaborations, and building international networks





GEOGRAPHY SERIES: A DEEP DIVE INTO CHINA AT HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY

He explained that the event allows international students to showcase their home countries through presentations, while providing local students the opportunity to practice their foreign language skills in languages such as Arabic, German, Japanese, and others. He underscored that this exchange enriches the cultural understanding of both inbound and local students.

The two presenters, Mark (Li Zexi) and Qilla (Guo Xutong), captivated the audience by taking them on a virtual journey through China's beauty, showcasing landmarks, rivers, and iconic buildings. Throughout the session, they engaged the participants with questions, offering gifts to those who answered correctly. The interaction made the event lively and informative, as several students were invited to the stage to receive their prizes. Moderated by Husna, who kept the energy high with an engaging activity, the event concluded with a photo session and the distribution of snack boxes provided by the IO. The success of the G-Series highlights its ongoing role in fostering cross-cultural exchange and linguistic skills among students at UNHAS.



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HUMAN DIGNITY IN THE JURISPRUDENCE OF THE INDONESIAN CONSTITUTIONAL COURT: INSIGHTS FROM PROF. NADIRSYAH HOSEN



The Faculty of Law (FH) Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) held a public lecture titled "Human Dignity in The Jurisprudence of the Indonesian Constitutional Court" on Friday, September 20, 2024. The event featured Prof. Dr. H. Nadirsyah Hosen, LL.M., M.A. (Hons), Ph.D., an Indonesian academic teaching at the University of Melbourne, Australia, who also serves as an Adjunct Professor at FH UNHAS. The lecture was moderated by Dr. Andi Syahwiah A. Sapiddin, S.H., M.H., (Head of the Procedural Law Department), and was attended by around 120 students enrolled in Constitutional Law courses, taking place in the Prof. Dr. Mr. Andi Zainal Abidin Farid, S.H. Doctoral Promotion Room. The event was fully supported by Prof. Dr. Hamzah Halim, S.H., M.H., M.A.P.,(Dean of the Faculty of Law), who encourages each department within the Faculty of Law to organize academic events to meet the *Indikator Kinerja Utama* (IKU) or Key Performance Indicators.

Prof. Nadirsyah presented his research findings on the Constitutional Court's decisions concerning the issue of respect for human dignity. The substance of the lecture was drawn from Prof. Nadirsyah's research, published in the book *Human Dignity in Asia: Dialogue between Law and Culture*, published by Cambridge University Press in 2022. In his lecture, Prof. Nadirsyah elaborated on the history of Indonesia's Constitution, particularly the post-amendment 1945 Constitution (UUD NRI 1945), which has undergone significant changes and now provides comprehensive guarantees for human rights. He highlighted the tension between the provisions on non-derogable rights in Article 28H and the limitations set forth in Article 28J of the *Undang-Undang Dasar Negara Republik Indonesia* (UUD NRI) 1945 or the 1945 Constitution of the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia.

Prof. Nadirsyah further examined the meaning of the term 'dignity' as found in the constitutional text and discussed how the Constitutional Court justices have interpreted this term. Based on his research findings, Prof. Nadirsyah concluded that the Constitutional Court tends to favor a collective interpretation of human rights over an individualistic one, particularly in regard to economic, social, and cultural rights. He noted that this approach is influenced by a rejection of Western liberalism. Nevertheless, this paradigm is considered essential for maintaining a balance between citizens' rights and responsibilities, as well as between the rights and duties of the state.

This public lecture provided FH UNHAS students with a valuable opportunity to deepen their understanding of contemporary human rights discourse and the role of the Constitutional Court in safeguarding human dignity. Through this event, FH UNHAS demonstrated its commitment to broadening students' perspectives by bringing in renowned scholars and practitioners whose expertise and authority are widely recognized.





FACULTY OF PUBLIC HEALTH, HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY AND UNIVERSITI PUTRA MALAYSIA FORGE NEW INTERNATIONAL COLLABORATION FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT AND ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE



The Faculty of Public Health (FKM), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) has strengthened its international cooperation with Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM) through a collaboration meeting held on Thursday, September 12, 2024.
