On Saturday 2 November 2024, a comprehensive training session focused on the Duolingo English Test was held at the Gedung Ipteks, Universitas Hasanuddin (UNHAS). The event was organized in preparation for the International Indonesian Student Mobility Awards (IISMA) 2025. The event attracted over a hundred enthusiastic participants eager to enhance their English proficiency skills and was led by International office (IO) task force member Khaeruddin Ph.D accompanied by IO staff: Risti Juliani, Kumara Tungga Dewa S.S., Erizal Zhafran Muyazzar Edison, S.I.Kom, Afifah Fayyadah, S.I.Kom, and Nasrah, M.Hum.

The training session ran from 9 AM to 11 AM and covered various aspects of the Duolingo English Test, including listening, speaking, reading, and selection exercises. Participants engaged in interactive activities designed to familiarize them with the test format and improve their language abilities. Attendees benefited from practical tips and strategies, helping them understand how to approach different sections of the test effectively. The session emphasized the importance of mastering the language for academic success, especially for those planning to study abroad.

Feedback from participants was overwhelmingly positive, with many expressing gratitude for the opportunity to gain insights into the test and improve their English skills. STRENGTHENING ENGLISH PROFICIENCY: IO UNHAS CONDUCTS 7TH DUOLINGO CLASS



The International Office (IO) of Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) held the 7th Preparation Class for the Duolingo English Test (DET). This event aimed at supporting applicants for the Indonesian International Student Mobility Awards (IISMA). The session took place on Saturday, November 23, 2024, from 9 AM to 12 PM at the IPTEKS Building, Tamalanrea Campus. Facilitated by Saaduddin, M.Sc. (IO Task Force member) and Kumara Tungga Dewa, S.S. (IO Mobility staff) led the participants through a series of Duolingo test exercises to enhance their readiness for the program.

Moreover, three ongoing IISMA awardees shared their experiences related to the DET and attracted approximately 80 participants who joined this session. This number reflected a slight decline in attendance compared to previous meetings. Despite this, the session successfully maintained its focus on equipping participants with essential skills for the DET, highlighting the IO's dedication to supporting student mobility opportunities.





BUILDING FUTURE OCEAN STEWARDS: UNHAS AND CHINA'S PARTNERSHIP IN MARINE ECO-RANCHING TRAINING



Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), through the Faculty of Marine Science and Fisheries (FIKP), held a Talent Cultivation & Technical Personnel Training Course on Sino-Indonesian Technical Cooperation on Offshore Marine Eco-Ranching in the FIKP Conference Room on Tuesday 29 October 2024. This event was organized in collaboration with two Chinese universities: Shanghai Ocean University and Guangdong Ocean University. "China is an exceptional partner in the maritime field. We hope that through this training, we can learn about the technologies and innovations developed there," said the Dean of FIKP UNHAS, Prof. Safruddin, during the opening ceremony.

The fisheries oceanography expert expressed hope that the hybrid-format training, attended by participants from various national and international institutions, would have a significant impact on the sustainability of Indonesia's marine ecosystems. "China's extensive experience and deep knowledge in various aspects of marine science offer invaluable lessons for Indonesia," said Safruddin, who is also a former Secretary of the Fisheries Department at UNHAS.

One of the event organizers, Widyastuti, noted that this training was a collaborative effort between UNHAS FIKP, Shanghai Ocean University and Guangdong Ocean University. "Participants come from various backgrounds, including academia, environmental advocates, and government agencies," said the UNHAS Marine Science lecturer. According to Widyastuti, the training aims to enhance technical and practical capacities in the management and development of marine eco-ranching based on artificial reef technology, as well as to strengthen Indonesia-China relations in marine conservation and the blue economy.

The training also included scientific discussions featuring several marine experts from both Chinese universities. Prof. Zhou Zhang from Shanghai Ocean University introduced the basic concept of artificial reefs, describing them as man-made structures designed to substitute for damaged natural reefs. He emphasized that artificial reefs provide not only ecological benefits but also economic advantages for coastal communities. These structures support sustainable fishing activities and reduce pressure on natural coral reefs.

Meanwhile, Prof. Zhaoyang Jiang from Shandong University delved into the design and installation methods of artificial reefs. He explained the various materials used, such as concrete, iron, stone, and wood, each tailored to meet specific local ecological needs. Prof. Jiang also shared insights into the rapid development of artificial reef technology in China, which has evolved from traditional materials like bamboo to eco-friendly structures that withstand ocean pressures.



Shike Gao from Shanghai Ocean University presented survey findings on the ecological impact of artificial reef installations. He noted that every structure placed in the ocean must be evaluated for its ecological, economic, and social impacts. Routine surveys of reef areas include measurements of water quality, sediment, and fishery productivity to determine how artificial reefs can enhance biodiversity and support the well-being of coastal communities.

Prof. Liqiang Zhao from Guangdong Ocean University highlighted the vital role of shellfish as one of the marine species that greatly supports the blue economy. Shellfish act as natural filter feeders that clean the ecosystem and hold high economic value in tourism and the food industry.

"Indonesia has vast potential to develop sustainable shellfish farming as part of coastal economic development," said Prof. Zhao. Jie Zhou was the final speaker, discussing coral reef monitoring and restoration methods. According to Zhou, it is essential to conserve coral reefs threatened by bleaching due to climate change. He explained that reef monitoring can be conducted using various modern techniques, such as eDNA, acoustic technology, and robotics. The use of artificial reefs can also aid coral reef restoration by providing new habitats for marine species. "Coral reefs are not only rich in food and tourism potential, but they also serve as natural coastal protectors that must be preserved," said Zhou.

The organizers were delighted to see the participants' enthusiasm and interest in artificial reef technology as a solution for maintaining sustainable marine ecosystems. UNHAS hopes this training becomes a tangible step in the management and preservation of marine resources through innovative technology, making Indonesia more prepared to face future marine challenges.





EMPOWERING INDONESIAN HEALTH PROFESSIONALS: EATS INDONESIA AND UNHAS REVIEW NCD PREVENTION STRATEGIES



EATS Indonesia (Education and Training of Health Care Personnel for Sustainable Early Prevention of Non-Communicable Disease in Indonesia) aims to equip Indonesian healthcare professionals with essential knowledge and skills for the early prevention of non-communicable diseases. EATS Indonesia is a collaborative project coordinated by LMU Hospital Munich and funded by the Else Kroner Fresenius Foundation (EKFS), based in Bad Homburg, Germany. The consortium partners of EATS Indonesia include University of Indonesia (UI), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), the Indonesian Pediatric Society (IDAI), the Indonesian Obstetrics and Gynecology Association (POGI), and the Indonesian Midwives Association (IBI). EATS Indonesia is supported by Indonesia's Ministry of Health. The project runs for three years, starting in July 2022 and concluding in June 2025.

On Monday 28 October 2024, EATS visited the Faculty of Medicine (FK), UNHAS to discuss the progress of the ongoing program, review strategies, discuss challenges, and plan for future initiatives. The event was attended by Vice Dean for Publications, Community Service, and International Affairs, Prof. Dr. dr. Rina Masadah, M.Phil., Sp.PA(K), DFM. Also in attendance were Prof. Dr. med. Dres. h.c. Berthold Koletzko from LMU Children's Hospital Munich, who serves as the accountable person in charge of the EATS program, and Prof. Dr. dr. Aryono Hendarto, Sp.A(K), MPH, EATS Indonesia coordinator, along with the project team from UI.

The EATS UNHAS team was represented by Dr. dr. Aidah Juliaty Alimuddin, Sp.A(K), Dr. dr. Conny Tanjung, Sp.A(K), and Dr. dr. Bahrul Fikri, M.Kes, Sp.A(K), Ph.D. Prof. Rina Masadah stated that this project is one of the key research and community service collaborations at FK UNHAS, significantly enhancing UNHAS' reputation at the international level.



UNHAS-YALA RAJABHAT UNIVERSITY PARTNERSHIP PAVES WAY FOR JOINT LEGAL RESEARCH AND EXCHANGE PROGRAMS



On Monday 21 October 2024, five lecturers from the Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) Faculty of Law (FH) were formally welcomed by Asst. Prof. Nichaphat Rawichart, Dean of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences at Yala Rajabhat University, along with Dr. Shewala Badklang, Deputy Dean for Academic and Student Affairs, and Ms. Chonthicha Suratnasanya, Deputy Dean for Administration and Quality Assurance. This meeting was an expert exchange between the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences at Yala Rajabhat University (Thailand) and the Faculty of Law at Hasanuddin University (Indonesia).

The Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences at Yala Rajabhat University offers 16 academic programs, one of which is the Law Program. The five attending lecturers from UNHAS Faculty of Law included Dr. Birkah Latif, S.H., M.H., LL.M. (Head of the Department of International Law), Dr. Andi Tenri Famauri Rifai, S.H., M.H. (Head of the Department of Society and Development Law), Dr. Andi Syahwiah A. Sapiddin, S.H., M.H. (Head of the Department of Procedural Law), Rastiawaty, S.H., M.H. (Secretary of the Department of Society and Development Law), and Dr. Kadarudin, S.H., M.H. (Secretary of the Department of International Law).

The expert meeting covered developments in the legal systems of each country. It concluded with the signing of an Agreement Letter of Intent (LoI) for collaborative initiatives in 2025, including an International Conference, an Outbound Lecturer LoI, and a Thematic Research Group (TRG) LoI. The documents were signed by Asst. Prof. Nichaphat Rawichart (Dean) and Ms. Chonthicha Suratnasanya (Vice Dean). Additionally, Yala University extended a special invitation to Dr. Andi Tenri Famauri Rifai, S.H., M.H., Dr. Andi Syahwiah A. Sapiddin, S.H., M.H., and Rastiawaty, S.H., M.H. to participate in an inbound exchange in the Law Program at the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences next semester and to work on joint publications in the current semester.

During the event, the Dean of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences at Yala Rajabhat University expressed an interest in visiting Makassar for a Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) signing, with plans to bring faculty and students to the UNHAS Faculty of Law as part of a reciprocal exchange. This outbound activity is fully funded by UNHAS under the Faculty's Key Performance Indicators (KPI) Funding Scheme. The initiative supports the university's ranking indicators in the QS World University Rankings/Asian University Rankings, which include metrics on outbound exchange proportions and potential academic peers.

Prof. Dr. Hamzah Halim, S.H., M.H., M.A.P., Dean of the Faculty of Law, UNHAS, expressed appreciation for the outbound activity as a step toward fulfilling the Faculty of Law's KPIs. He also encouraged all faculty members of the UNHAS Faculty of Law to pursue overseas exchanges and to establish new partnerships for the faculty.





FKM UNHAS INITIATES COLLABORATION WITH GSPH SNU TO STRENGTHEN INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION IN PUBLIC HEALTH



On 22 October 2024, the Faculty of Public Health (FKM), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) took a significant step in fostering international collaboration by engaging in a discussion with the Graduate School of Public Health at Seoul National University (GSPH SNU). The event, held at the GSPH SNU campus, aimed to explore potential partnerships between the two institutions in the field of public health.

Dr. Wahiduddin, Vice Dean for Academic Affairs and Student Affairs led the delegation. Dr. Hasnawati Amqam as the Head of Bachelor Program of Public Health and Dr. Abdul Salam as The Head of Bachelor Program of Nutrition joined the delegation, as well lecturers Dian Sidik Arsyad, MKM, Dr. Syamsuar M, Ulfah Najamuddin, PhD, Dr, Balqis Nazaruddin, Adelia Undang Sari, MARS, Suci Rahmadani, M.Kes, and A. Muflihah M.Kes. The GSPH SNU warmly welcomed the visiting group, including the Dean, Lee Tae Jin, PhD, Associate Dean of Student Affairs Yi Seung-Muk, PhD, and Hwang Seungsik, MD., PhD, the Associate Dean of Academic Affairs.

The discussion began with a session where each delegation introduced its institution. Dr. Wahiduddin highlighted the academic programs, research activities, and achievements of FKM UNHAS, emphasizing the faculty's role in advancing public health education in Indonesia. Dr. Wahiduddin expressed optimism about the prospects of the collaboration, hoping that it would soon materialize and yield tangible benefits for both institutions, particularly in enhancing academic and research capacity in public health. "This collaboration is crucial, not only for strengthening international networks but also for sharing experiences and knowledge in improving public health, both in Indonesia and South Korea," he noted.

GSPH SNU responded positively to FKM UNHAS's initiative, affirming its commitment to supporting various forms of cooperation in the future. They expressed their hope that this initial discussion would pave the way for developing joint programs and projects that could significantly benefit both communities.

The discussion concluded with an agreement to develop a follow-up action plan to implement the proposed collaborations. Both parties committed to maintaining open communication to ensure the successful realization of each planned program. This meeting marked a promising beginning for strengthening academic cooperation between FKM UNHAS and GSPH SNU. Through this partnership, both institutions aim to contribute to the advancement of knowledge and efforts to improve public health at regional and global levels.



She underscored the importance of integrating preventive measures and effective care strategies into academic and clinical practices to enhance health outcomes. The event further strengthened the collaboration between UNHAS and UKM in advancing healthcare education and research.



The Faculty of Nursing (FKep), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) successfully hosted the Collaborative Health Sciences Exchange Program for Southeast Asia (CHEP-SEA) from 11 to 15 November 2024. This program provided a platform for knowledge sharing and collaboration among health science students and professionals from four Southeast Asian universities: UNHAS (Indonesia), Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia, Christian University of Thailand, and Hai Duong Medical Technical University (Vietnam). CHEP-SEA served as a vital medium to develop cross-cultural competencies and strengthen international networks in the health sciences field.

The program was officially opened on 11 November 2024 by the Rector of UNHAS, Prof. Dr. Ir. Jamaluddin Jompa, M.Sc. In his opening remarks, Prof. Jamaluddin Jompa praised FKep UNHAS' initiative and highlighted the significance of such programs in fostering interprofessional collaboration and advancing international partnerships. Cultural exchange was also a significant component of the program, providing international participants with opportunities to experience and learn about Indonesian culture.

CHEP-SEA 2024 concluded on 15 November 2024 with a formal closing ceremony, during which participants and contributors were presented with certificates and souvenirs. The program is expected to have a lasting impact by broadening participants' knowledge in health sciences and fostering stronger cross-cultural relationships, paving the way for sustainable collaboration in the future.

CORAL REEF MANAGEMENT: A GLOBAL PERSPECTIVE SHARED AT HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY



The Vocational Faculty of Hasanuddin University held an insightful guest lecture titled "Objectives and Principles for Successful Coral Reef Management and Conservation" on 26 November 2024. The session featured Prof. Laurence McCook, Ph.D., an internationally acclaimed marine ecologist known for his extensive work in marine conservation and ecosystem management.

Prof. McCook holds distinguished roles as an Adjunct Professorial Research Fellow at James Cook University in Townsville, Australia; a Visiting Professor at Hasanuddin University, Makassar, Indonesia; and a Scientific Advisor at Seneca Impact Advisors in Hong Kong SAR, China. A former Pew Fellow in Marine Conservation, he has also served as Director of Oceans Conservation at WWF-Hong Kong and a President's International Visiting Professorial Fellow at the Chinese Academy of Sciences' South China Sea Institute of Oceanology.

During the two-hour session held at the UNHAS Selayar Vocational Campus, Prof. McCook shared a wealth of knowledge on sustainable coral reef management. He presented five key objectives and 12 guiding principles essential for successful coral reef conservation, advocating for a holistic approach that integrates ecological, social, and economic dimensions.

"Effective conservation requires not only rigorous scientific research but also collaboration with local communities and the implementation of supportive policies. This approach is particularly vital for Eastern Indonesia, a region celebrated for its unparalleled marine biodiversity," Prof. McCook remarked.

The lecture was attended by students from the Applied Bachelor's Programs in Coastal and Marine Cultivation and Tourism Destination Management. Edison, S.AP., MInterSustTourMgt., a lecturer from the Tourism Destination program, moderated the event, fostering dynamic discussions throughout the session.

The interactive Q&A segment allowed participants to delve deeper into critical topics, including the impacts of climate change, sustainable marine resource management, and the preservation of coastal ecosystems.

This event not only expanded students' knowledge of marine conservation but also highlighted opportunities for international collaboration between Hasanuddin University and James Cook University. It underscored the importance of joint research and capacity building in advancing sustainable marine management and eco-tourism initiatives in Indonesia.





EXPANDING HORIZONS: CHINA MEDICAL UNIVERSITY AND HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY'S DENTAL COLLABORATION



The international academic exchange and collaboration between the Faculty of Dentistry at China Medical University (CMU) and the Faculty of Dentistry (FKG) at Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) in Indonesia have yielded outstanding results. On 26 November, Dean Fu Lizhi met Irfan Sugianto from UNHAS, together, they signed the second five-year academic exchange agreement, pledging to deepen their cooperation further. Both parties committed to promoting faculty training and student exchanges to infuse more vitality into dental education and research.

Since the initial five-year agreement was signed, UNHAS has selected high-achieving lecturers to pursue doctoral studies at CMU. To date, one lecturer has successfully completed their doctorate. Cheng, who returned to China, has become a vital link for academic exchange between the two institutions and Taiwan. Five other lecturers are currently pursuing doctoral research at China Medical University, reflecting the remarkable outcomes of this collaborative plan.

To further expand academic exchange, in 2025 the FKG plans to send five undergraduate students to CMU for a one-month study program. This initiative will allow students to gain advanced knowledge and practical experience in dentistry, enhancing their professional skills and international perspective.

The FKG shares the educational philosophy of CMU's Faculty of Dentistry, particularly in cultivating professionalism, critical thinking, communication, coordination, lifelong learning, and other core competencies in students. UNHAS fully agrees with these values and hopes to integrate them into its educational goals and curriculum design.

Dean Fu Lizhi of the School of Dentistry at CMU remarked that the signing of the second cooperation agreement not only solidifies the partnership between the two schools but also strengthens the international ties of higher education in dentistry across Asia. In the future, both faculties aim to deepen academic collaboration, nurture dental professionals with strong skills and international vision, and contribute to the development of dentistry in the Asia-Pacific region.





THE DIGITAL PARADIGM SHIFT: FROM HUMAN-CENTERED TO HYBRID LEGAL FRAMEWORKS



On Monday 12 November 2024 the Doctoral Promotion Room of the Faculty of Law (FH), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) was filled with enthusiastic lecturers and students attending a Studium Generale titled "The Digital Paradigm Shift: From Human-Centered to Hybrid Legal Frameworks." The session was delivered by a renowned academic, Prof. Dr. Stefan Koos, who provided deep insights into the paradigm shifts in law brought about by advancements in digital technology.

In his lecture, Prof. Koos covered six main topics, beginning with the critical importance of data control in today's digital era. According to him, data has become a valuable commodity and a determinant factor in various aspects of modern life. He emphasized that effective and secure data management is now an inseparable component of dynamic legal frameworks.

Next, Prof. Koos addressed the dominance of Large Language Model (LLM) development by advanced countries. He highlighted that this monopoly exacerbates technological disparities between developed and developing nations, urging the latter to consider developing language models tailored to their local needs.

A pivotal aspect discussed was the application of the "Safety by Design" concept as a primary approach to tackling increasingly complex digital threats. This approach, according to Prof. Koos, is crucial for creating comprehensive protection against cyberattacks and misuse, ensuring the security of both personal and public data.

Prof. Koos also highlighted the behavior of Artificial Intelligence (AI), which lacks emotions and feelings, making it difficult to control. While AI offers significant benefits in various sectors, it also poses major challenges for humans, particularly in controlling and predicting its actions in sensitive situations.

Another key issue in his presentation was the concept of responsibility in the context of Al. Prof. Koos explained that with the growing use of Al, responsibility, traditionally held by individuals, is shifting to organizations. This shift necessitates a legal framework capable of adapting to the changing roles and responsibilities within the digital context.

Concluding his presentation, Prof. Koos discussed the emergence of hybrid cultures that blend digital and classical cultural aspects. He elaborated that the digital era not only transforms legal systems but also fosters new forms of social and cultural interaction. This hybrid culture, he stated, will usher humanity into an era where digital and traditional interactions integrate seamlessly.

Through his comprehensive presentation, Prof. Dr. Stefan Koos provided the audience with profound insights into the transformations faced by legal frameworks in the digital era. The FH UNHAS hopes this event inspires students and lecturers to deepen their understanding of the challenges and opportunities in the technological era, particularly in the legal field.





STRENGTHENING ACADEMIC TIES: FKM UNHAS DELEGATION VISITS UPM TO ADVANCE PUBLIC HEALTH COLLABORATION



From 18 to 24 November 2024 the Faculty of Public Health (FKM) at Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) embarked on an academic visit to the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences, Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM). The delegation comprised three faculty members—Dr. Hasnawati Amqam, Dr. Erniwati Ibrahim, and Adelia Undang Sari, MARS—as well as 10 students from the International Undergraduate Program in Public Health.

This visit marked a significant milestone in the ongoing staff exchange program between the two institutions, which commenced in September 2024. Earlier in the program, a faculty member from UPM visited FKM UNHAS to teach in the international undergraduate and master's public health classes. This event provided healthcare professionals with updated insights into gerontological nursing, addressing issues such as dementia care, nursing adjustments for older adults, and health coaching to enhance self-care among the elderly.

Expert speakers included Dr. Sakul Changmai, Ph.D., RN (Christian University of Thailand): "Dementia Care in Thailand", Trisna Paul, MN, RN (Wahidin Sudirohusodo Hospital, Indonesia): "Nursing Adjustments for Hospitalized Older People", Prof. Kashiko Fujii (Tokyo Kasei University): "Nursing Education in Japan and Indonesia", and Dr. Andi Masyitha Irwan, Ph.D., RN (FKep UNHAS): "Health Coaching Intervention to Improve Self-Care for Community-Dwelling Older People with Hypertension." Moderated by Andriani, S.Kep., Ns., M.Kes., the course encouraged cross-cultural dialogue among participants from Indonesia, Thailand, and Japan.

HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY ADVANCES GLOBAL RESEARCH COLLABORATION WITH NAGOYA CITY UNIVERSITY AND KOBE UNIVERSITY



The Faculty of Marine Science and Fisheries at Hasanuddin University has taken a significant step in fostering international collaboration through a research visit to Nagoya City University in Japan. The month-long program, held from 3 to 29 November 2024, focused on enhancing research capabilities and strengthening conservation efforts for Indonesia's endemic fish species. This initiative marks a pivotal moment in advancing the university's role in global scientific discourse.

Leading the delegation were two researchers, Prof. Andi Iqbal Burhanuddin, Ph.D., and Prof. Dr. Ir. Rahmadi Tambaru, M.Si., who collaborated with the Laboratory of Molecular Evolution, Animal Phylogenetics, and Biodiversity Analysis at Nagoya City University. The delegation was hosted by Prof. Yoshinori Kumazawa, an eminent expert in molecular evolutionary science. Their discussions revolved around leveraging molecular and computational technologies to address the challenges of conserving Indonesia's unique aquatic biodiversity, particularly the endemic species inhabiting Sulawesi's waters.

The collaboration aims to achieve multiple objectives, including the development of innovative technologies for species conservation, the publication of joint research in internationally renowned scientific journals, and capacity building for Indonesian researchers. By transferring advanced knowledge and technology, the program is set to empower local scientists in fish taxonomy and biodiversity management, enhancing Indonesia's conservation capabilities on a global scale.

Moreover, the visit underscored the importance of contributing to global conservation initiatives. The integration of cutting-edge molecular analysis and computational tools is expected to generate critical insights that support sustainable management and policy-making for aquatic ecosystems worldwide.

The delegation also participated in a symposium on food safety and security hosted by Kobe University's postgraduate program, further broadening the scope of their academic engagement. This collaborative visit not only highlights Hasanuddin University's commitment to advancing scientific research but also paves the way for future partnerships in fisheries and marine sciences.

As the visit concludes, the outcomes are expected to significantly bolster the conservation of Indonesia's aquatic biodiversity and contribute to the global scientific community's efforts in addressing pressing ecological challenges.
