

STRENGTHENING INDONESIA-JAPAN ACADEMIC COLLABORATION: UNHAS DELEGATION AT OKAYAMA UNIVERSITY'S STRATEGIC MEETING



From 2024 to 2029, Indonesia has been designated as a priority by Japan's Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science, and Technology (MEXT) for increasing the enrollment of international students from ASEAN. This initiative is supported through government scholarships, nongovernment funding, and university-specific programs, with Okayama University (OU) playing a key role in this effort.

As part of this initiative, the ASEAN Regional Office visited Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) in February to conduct a study-in-Japan outreach program, which attracted hundreds of UNHAS students. Based on the evaluation of this event, the ASEAN Regional Office recognized UNHAS as a strategic partner with significant potential for future impact.


UNHAS and OU have maintained a long-standing partnership, particularly in health sciences faculties. In light of this collaboration, the ASEAN Regional Office extended an invitation to UNHAS to participate in the *Strategic Collaboration Meeting of the Global Network Project to Promote Study in Japan*, held at OU from 17 to 19 March 2025. The event was fully funded by the ASEAN Regional Office, the project's coordinating body for ASEAN.

The UNHAS delegation included Vice Rector for Academic and Student Affairs, Prof. Ruslin; Dean of the Faculty of Medicine, Prof. Haerani; Dean of the Faculty of Dentistry, Dr. Irfan Sugianto; Dean of the Faculty of Public Health, Prof. Sukri; and Dean of the Faculty of Nursing, Prof. Ariyanti Saleh. During the visit, the UNHAS delegation met with OU President, Prof. Yasutomo Nasu, and Vice President for International Affairs and Alumni, Prof. Takayoshi Suzuki. The discussions, facilitated by Indonesia Area Coordinator of the ASEAN Regional Office, Kaori Yajima, focused on expanding collaboration, particularly through the *Exchange Program Okayama (EPOK)* and opportunities for UNHAS staff to pursue further studies at OU.





HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY STUDENTS SHINE AT MSSS 2025 IN MALAYSIA



A group of 20 final-year undergraduate students from Faculty of Mathematics and Science (FMIPA), Universitas Hasanuddin (UNHAS) successfully participated in the 3rd Mathematical Sciences and Statistics Seminar (MSSS 2025), held at Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM) from 24 to 25 February 2025. The event, themed "Driving the Future: The Role of Mathematics and Statistics in Digital and Al-Enabled Technologies," was conducted in a hybrid format, with UNHAS participants joining via an online platform.

The UNHAS delegation consisted of 13 students from the Department of Mathematics and 7 students from the Department of Statistics. They joined participants from UPM and Universitas Padjadjaran (UNPAD) to present their final-year research findings in various areas of mathematical and statistical sciences. In this event, one of the UNHAS mathematics students was awarded as the Best Presenter.

The event was a result of collaborative efforts between UPM, UNHAS, and UNPAD, strengthening academic ties and promoting knowledge exchange among students and faculty members. The Dean of FMIPA UNHAS, Dr. Eng. Amiruddin, M.Si., also delivered a welcoming speech during the seminar, emphasizing the importance of mathematics and statistics in the era of digital transformation and artificial intelligence.

MSSS 2025, which featured both physical and virtual presentations, aimed to foster innovation, critical thinking, and interdisciplinary collaboration among young researchers. Participants engaged in keynote lectures, parallel presentation sessions, and discussions on how mathematics and statistics drive advancements in AI, machine learning, and other digital technologies.

The successful participation of UNHAS students in MSSS 2025 marks a significant step in encouraging future collaborations between the three universities and enhancing the role of mathematics and statistics in shaping the future of technology.





INBOUND PROGRAM FROM NIIGATA UNIVERSITY OF HEALTH AND WELFARE TO THE FACULTY OF NURSING, UNHAS



The Faculty of Nursing (FKep) Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) recently hosted an inbound program in collaboration with Niigata University of Health and Welfare (NUHW) from 23 February to 4 March 2025. The program welcomed two faculty members, Associate Professor Fusayo Kobayashi, PhD, and Assistant Professor Kanako Shimbo, along with eight inbound students from NUHW.

The event commenced with an opening ceremony, marking the official start of the program. Dr. Ariyanti Saleh, S.Kp., M.Si., (Dean of FKep), delivered the opening remarks. "It is a great pleasure to host the NUHW delegation at UNHAS as part of our ongoing partnership. We hope this exchange provides valuable learning experiences and knowledge for the students involved," stated Dr. Ariyanti Saleh.

Following the ceremony, the group visited the Rappokalling Public Health Center, where they gained insights into public health activities in Makassar, including the Posyandu (Integrated Health Post) program.

On the following day, NUHW students participated in two nursing classes—pediatric and maternity nursing—engaging in discussions with UNHAS students. Additionally, two students attended an emergency care session to learn practical emergency skills.

The program continued with a general lecture delivered by Dr. Kobayashi, Dr. Shimbo, and Dr. Erfina Malik. The topics included "Lifestyle-Related Diseases in Japan: Specific Health Examination and Specific Health Guidance" by Dr. Kobayashi, "Maternal and Child Health and Midwifery Education in Japan" by Dr. Shimbo, and "Adolescent Mother Care: Experiences in Indonesia" by Dr. Erfina. These sessions further enriched the students' understanding of global healthcare perspectives.

The participants also visited the Griya Afiat Health Clinic, where they observed wound care practices explained by Dr. Saldy Yusuf, a leading expert in wound care in South Sulawesi.

Beyond academic enrichment, the program provided opportunities for cultural exchange. Participants were introduced to traditional South Sulawesi dances, which became one of the highlights of the program. Dr. Kobayashi remarked, "This year's program has been particularly memorable. We are excited to learn about South Sulawesi's rich culture, fostering cross-cultural understanding."

The program concluded with a presentation session, where both NUHW and UNHAS nursing students shared their experiences and key takeaways. The closing ceremony was led by Dr. Erfina Malik, Vice Dean for Planning, Human Resources, and Alumni at FKep, UNHAS, who delivered the closing remarks and celebrated the success of the event.

This international collaboration highlights the significance of global exchange in nursing education, providing students with opportunities to broaden their academic knowledge while embracing cultural diversity. The program also strengthened the partnership between NUHW and UNHAS, fostering potential future collaborations and educational initiatives.







OPTIMIZING UNHAS'S REPUTATION: KEY DISCUSSIONS ON THE WCU PROGRAM



The Secretary of Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), Prof. Ir. Sumbangan Baja, M.Phil., Ph.D., led a strategic meeting on the World Class University (WCU) Program at UNHAS. The meeting, held on Thursday, 27 February 2025, at Meeting Room A, 4th Floor of the Rectorate Building, brought together key university stakeholders. Prof. Rohani Ambo Rappe, (Director of UNHAS Enhancement Reputation), joined Prof. Sumbangan, alongside representatives from the UNHAS International Office (IO) and the Quality Assurance and Enhancement Reputation (GPM-PR) teams from all faculties.

In his opening remarks, Prof. Sumbangan highlighted that UNHAS's Strategic Plans are nearing completion. He emphasized the critical role of the GPM-PR team in supporting the university's internationalization efforts. To enhance coordination, he proposed organizing a meeting between the GPM-PR team and the Task Force for Internationalization from each faculty or school, facilitated by the IO. This initiative aims to streamline efforts in improving UNHAS's global reputation and rankings.

A significant discussion point was the organizational structure of the GPM-PR team at the faculty level. It was noted that the current structure lacks a direct coordination line with other Vice Deans, limiting their ability to access crucial data for supporting the WCU program, particularly in providing ranking-related data. Prof. Rohani further addressed the ongoing challenges in collecting and submitting faculty data for various ranking organizations, stressing the need for a more efficient system.


Representing the IO, Muhammad Ridwan, M.A. (IO Secretary), and Saaduddin, Ph.D. (IO Task Force), presented an overview of the upcoming International Academic Consortium for Sustainable Cities (IACSC) annual conference. UNHAS, through the IO, is set to host the event in July 2025, marking a significant milestone in its international engagement efforts.

Before concluding the meeting, Prof. Sumbangan underscored the necessity of establishing a centralized data system managed by the UNHAS Secretariat. This system would enable seamless data access for all relevant parties, ensuring better coordination and efficiency. He also called for a review of the university's organizational structure to optimize the placement of the GPM-PR team and improve their operational effectiveness in supporting UNHAS's internationalization agenda.





FRIDAY OUTBOUND CLINIC RESUMES WITH EXPERT INSIGHTS ON STUDYING IN AUSTRALIA



The International Office (IO) of Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) has officially resumed its Friday Outbound Clinic (FOC), providing students and alumni with valuable guidance on studying abroad. 



Moderated by Muhammad Ridwan, M.A., the IO Secretary, the session saw full participation from UNHAS international students. The discussion covered key aspects of health coverage, addressing students' concerns and clarifying procedures for medical assistance. The event also highlighted UNHAS's commitment to student welfare, ensuring that international students feel supported during their stay.

Following the session, in the spirit of Ramadan, the IO hosted an iftar gathering for international students. Several esteemed guests, including representatives from the Directorate of Asset Utilization, the Directorate of Academic and Student Affairs, Task Force for Internalization members, Indonesian International Student Mobility Awards (IISMA) alumni, and IO Student Volunteers, also joined the event. The gathering fostered a sense of community among students and officials, concluding with a group photo session to commemorate the occasion.

PROF. HIRAISHI NORIKO'S THIRD VISIT TO UNHAS: A PUBLIC LECTURE ON JAPANESE ONOMATOPOEIA



The Department of Japanese Literature at Faculty of Cultural Sciences (FIB) Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) once again hosted a public lecture featuring Prof. Hiraishi Noriko from the University of Tsukuba, Japan on Tuesday, 11 March 2025 at Mattulada Hall, FIB. She is a lecturer and researcher specializing in Comparative Literature. Currently, she is conducting research on comics and the consumption of Japanese culture among young people in Asia.

On this occasion, the lecture focused on onomatopoeia in comics worldwide. The session, themed "Japanese Onomatopoeia and Global Manga," explored Japanese onomatopoeia in literature and language, its translation, and the challenges of adapting it in comics across different cultures. The lecture was met with great enthusiasm from students who filled the Mattulada Hall at the Faculty of Cultural Sciences. Students actively engaged in the discussion, asking various questions in both Japanese and English.

This marks Prof. Hiraishi's third visit to UNHAS, following her previous visits in 2016 and 2017. She is also scheduled to return later this year as a speaker at the 7th International Conference on Japanese Studies and Language Education (ICJSLE), where the Department of Japanese Literature at UNHAS, in collaboration with the Association of Japanese Language Education Studies (ASPBJI) for South and West Sulawesi, serves as the organizing committee.

The Department of Japanese Literature at UNHAS remains committed to organizing public lectures and webinars featuring international speakers, particularly from Japan. These initiatives not only provide valuable learning opportunities for students but also contribute to the university's efforts in enhancing its Key Performance Indicators (IKU) for inbound foreign lecturers.





ADVANCING NATURAL PHARMACEUTICALS: FACULTY OF PHARMACY HOSTS AMINO UP GUEST LECTURE



The Faculty of Pharmacy at Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) hosted a guest lecture on "Innovations in Natural Product-Based Pharmaceuticals: Challenges and Opportunities" on Monday, 10 March 2025, from 09:00 to 11:00 WITA. The lecture featured Ms. Koto Sekino, Director of the Business Development Division at Amino Up Co., Ltd., as the keynote speaker.

Ms. Koto Sekino introduced various groundbreaking innovations from Amino Up, a Sapporo-based company specializing in the development of standardized natural ingredient-based pharmaceuticals. She highlighted the company's approach to integrating preclinical and clinical trials to ensure the efficacy and safety of its products. Additionally, she shared research findings that support the effectiveness of Amino Up's nutraceutical and natural product formulations.

One of the key innovations discussed was Oligonol, an extract from lychee fruit recognized for its exceptionally high polyphenol content and powerful antioxidant properties. Supported by numerous scientific studies, Oligonol has emerged as a leading nutraceutical innovation.

Beyond introducing superior products, Ms. Koto Sekino also addressed the challenges in developing natural ingredient-based pharmaceuticals, including issues related to standardization, efficacy, and regulatory compliance. She emphasized the vast potential for research and collaboration between academia and the pharmaceutical industry to develop natural-based medications with minimal side effects.


UNHAS has established a partnership with Amino Up Co., Ltd., making this guest lecture a significant opportunity for researchers and students to expand their knowledge and explore potential collaborations in natural pharmaceutical development.

The event received an enthusiastic response from participants, particularly lecturers and students interested in natural pharmaceutical research. It is hoped that this initiative will lead to further innovations and strengthen partnerships between UNHAS and global pharmaceutical companies like Amino Up.







INTERNATIONAL OFFICE LAUNCHES "HOST FAMILY: EXPERIENCING RAMADHAN LIKE HOME" PROGRAM



The International Office (IO) of Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) has successfully launched the Host Family Program: Experiencing Ramadhan Like Home, providing international students with an immersive cultural experience during the holy month of Ramadhan. Held from 21 - 23 March 2025, the program allowed participants to stay with local families in Bantimurung and Tompobulu, Maros Regency, offering them a firsthand experience of Ramadhan traditions in South Sulawesi.

To ensure a well-organized and enriching experience, IO held a preparatory meeting via Zoom on 18 March 2025, led by Andi Masyitha Irwan, Ph.D. (Head of IO), and attended by Muhammad Ridwan, M.A. (IO Secretary), Saaduddin, M.Sc. (Task Force & Project Manager), and IO staff members. The meeting covered key logistical aspects, including transportation arrangements utilizing UNHAS services and pairing international students with local student volunteers from IO UNHAS.

The selection of Bantimurung and Tompobulu as host locations followed an official audience with the Regent of Maros, Dr. H. Andi Syafril Chaidir Syam, S.IP, M.H., on 10 March 2025. The Regent welcomed the initiative, recognizing its potential to foster cultural exchange and promote Maros as a destination for international engagement.

The program followed a structured timeline, beginning with participant registration from 10 to 17 March, followed by the selection process on 18 March. The official announcement was made through IO UNHAS Instagram on 19 March, and a pre-departure briefing took place on 20 March to introduce students to local customs and their host families. On 21 March, the participants departed for Maros, where they spent three days immersing themselves in the local culture before returning to UNHAS on 23 March with valuable experiences and insights.

This inaugural Host Family program featured four international students: Kumar Apurvakant Gautam from India (Faculty of Public Health), Muhammad Furqan from Pakistan (Faculty of Dentistry), Tashfeen Amir from Pakistan (Faculty of Medicine), and Said Sadallah Said from Tanzania (Faculty of Mathematics and Natural Sciences). They were paired with local IO student volunteers, Muh. Naufal Fahri Salim and Muh. Adam Rezky, who helped them adapt to their new surroundings and facilitated cultural exchanges.



The participants shared memorable experiences and reflections on the program. Said Sadallah Said expressed his appreciation for the opportunity to learn about palm sugar production and explore the natural beauty of Bonto Somba village. He emphasized that the hospitality of his host family and the warmth of the local community made his stay truly special.

Muhammad Furqan suggested that future programs include more cultural workshops, such as traditional cooking, weaving, or palm sugar making, to enhance participants' engagement with the local community.



Tashfeen Amir recalled his favorite moment of the program, which was attending a Musabaqah Tilawatil Quran (MTQ) event. He was unexpectedly invited on stage to speak in front of 300 people, making it an unforgettable experience. He also enjoyed watching a kids' fashion show and Quran recitation competitions.

Kumar Apurvakant Gautam discussed the challenges of adjusting to the Ramadhan routine, particularly waking up early for Suhoor. However, sharing these moments with his friends and host family made it much easier and more enjoyable. He also highlighted how simple Bahasa Indonesia and non-verbal communication helped him overcome language barriers.



The Host Family Program successfully fostered cross-cultural understanding and provided international students with an authentic Ramadhan experience. With overwhelmingly positive feedback from both participants and host families, IO UNHAS hopes to continue and expand this initiative in the future, strengthening the university's commitment to internationalization and cultural exchange.





PREDICTING MOSQUITO-BORNE DISEASES THROUGH CLIMATE PATTERNS: A GUEST LECTURE BY PROF. NOBORU MINAKAWA



Makassar, 18 March 2025 – The Department of Parasitology and the Doctoral Program of the Faculty of Medicine (FK), in collaboration with the Master's Program in Biomedical Sciences at the Graduate School, organized a guest lecture featuring Prof. Noboru Minakawa from the Department of Vector Ecology and Environment, Institute of Tropical Medicine, Nagasaki University, Japan. The lecture was titled "Predicting Mosquito-Borne Diseases Based on Climate."

The session was moderated by Dr. Isra Wahid, Ph.D., and was attended by distinguished professors, including Prof. Dr. Syafruddin, Ph.D., and Prof. Dr. Irfan Idris, M.Kes, as well as master's students from the Graduate School's Biomedical Sciences Program and doctoral students from FK at Hasanuddin University (UNHAS).

During his lecture, Prof. Minakawa elaborated on mosquito-borne diseases such as dengue fever, malaria, and the Zika virus, which remain a growing global health threat. He emphasized the crucial role of environmental factors, particularly climate change, in influencing the transmission patterns of these diseases. Temperature, humidity, and rainfall directly affect mosquito populations and the life cycles of the pathogens they carry.

Prof. Minakawa, who has conducted extensive research on mosquito-borne diseases in various countries, including Africa, explained how environmental factors and climate change impact mosquito populations and disease transmission patterns. Through data-driven analysis and scientific approaches, he demonstrated that climate variations can serve as indicators for predicting vector-borne disease outbreaks.

The lecture provided in-depth insights into how climate-based predictions can enhance disease prevention and control strategies. It is hoped that this session has enriched participants' understanding of vector ecology, climate change, and mitigation efforts in addressing global public health challenges.





STRENGTHENING ACADEMIC COLLABORATION: A VISIT TO FKM UNHAS

SEIREI CHRISTOPHER UNIVERSITY AND UNHAS FOSTER ACADEMIC AND RESEARCH PARTNERSHIPS IN HEALTHCARE



From 18 to 20 March 2025, the Faculty of Nursing (FKep) at Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) had the honor of welcoming a distinguished delegation from Seirei Christopher University (SCU). The visit, led by Prof. Kazuhiro Kimpara and Dr. Hiroki Yabe, RPT., aimed to discuss and further develop future collaborative programs between the two institutions.

The visit began with a welcoming event for the delegation, which was officially opened by the Vice Dean for Academics and Students Affairs, Syahrul Said, S.Kep., Ns., M.Kes.,Ph.D. The event then continued with the discussions, held on 18 March 2025, focused on three key initiatives designed to enhance academic and cultural exchange. The first initiative was an inbound student exchange program, where students from SCU will have the opportunity to visit UNHAS to gain hands-on experience in the Physiotherapy Study Program and attend relevant classes. This program aims to provide SCU students with valuable practical experience and broaden their understanding of international healthcare practices. Secondly, in October 2025, UNHAS will host two visiting lecturers from SCU. These lectures will deliver general lectures for students in the Physiotherapy Study Program at UNHAS. The third program discussed was an event organized as part of the 20th anniversary celebration of SCU. UNHAS faculty members will participate in the event, delivering topics around nursing education and partnership.

On 19 March 2025, the delegation from SCU, along with a lecturer from UNHAS, presented a general lecture session for students and faculty. The lecture featured two distinguished speakers: Prof. Kazuhiro Kimpara and Dr. Rijal, S.Ft. Physio, M.Kes., M.MSc., Ph.D. Prof. Kimpara delivered a lecture titled "Understanding the Basics of Pain and Pathophysiology of Chronic Pain," which offered valuable insights into the complexities of pain management, particularly in the context of chronic pain. Dr. Rijal presented his research on "The Impact of Stabilization on Deep Scapular Muscle Morphologies and Scapular Position in Individuals with Rounded Shoulder Posture," The general lecture sparked stimulating discussions and providing significant insights into physiotherapy and musculoskeletal health.

On 20 March 2025, the delegation from SCU visited a physiotherapy clinic in Makassar, owned by faculty members of the Physiotherapy Study Program at FKep UNHAS. The clinics visited were Physio Center Clinic and Physio Sakti Clinic. Prof. Kimpara had the opportunity to observe physiotherapy services firsthand and share knowledge with the physiotherapists at these clinics through a simple practice simulation. Following this, the delegation proceeded to the faculty for the closing event. Prof. Kimpara and Dr. Hiroki Yabe, expressed their positive impressions and deep gratitude for their visit to the Physiotherapy Study Program which will be beneficial for the upcoming collaboration between SCU and UNHAS. Before departing, Prof. Kimpara took the time to conduct a manual therapy practice simulation with the physiotherapy faculty members of UNHAS.

The visit marked another important milestone in the ongoing collaboration between SCU and UNHAS, with the hope that both institutions continue to work together to advance healthcare education and research.







FKM UNHAS HOSTS GUEST LECTURE ON ANTIBODY RESEARCH AND GLOBAL HEALTH




The Faculty of Public Health (FKM) at Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) held a guest lecture titled "Antibody Characterization Methods for Investigating Infectious Disease Transmission: A Global Health Perspective" on Thursday (27/2). The event, which took place in the Nur Nasry Noor Room, 2nd Floor, FKM UNHAS, was attended by approximately 40 Master's (S2) and Doctoral (S3) program students.

This lecture featured Dr. Whitney C. Weber, a postdoctoral researcher from the Department of Microbiology, School of Medicine, Stanford University, United States. The session was moderated by Ansariadi, Ph.D., Director of the Center for Epidemiology and Population Health Studies (CEPHS), FKM Unhas. In his remarks, Ansariadi expressed gratitude for the opportunity to host an expert in the field of antibody research. "We are fortunate to have Dr. Whitney with us. Hopefully, this lecture will enhance our understanding of infectious disease management," he said. Dr. Whitney's visit to Makassar is part of a three-week data collection effort for a cohort study led by Ansariadi, Ph.D., in collaboration with Joelle Ivy-Rosser, Ph.D., from Stanford University. This research aims to analyze the impact of behavioral, environmental, and biological factors on maternal and child health in Tallo District, Makassar, over the next three years.

During her presentation, Dr. Whitney highlighted that infectious diseases remain a major global health issue, particularly in low-income countries. She explained that human mobility through global travel and trade, rapid urbanization, and pathogen adaptation to new hosts contribute to the spread of these diseases. "In Indonesia, tuberculosis, caused by bacteria, and malaria, caused by parasites, remain significant public health challenges. However, these diseases can be prevented through vaccination and further research," she stated. Dr. Whitney also introduced the critical role of antibodies in the immune system, specifically those found in B cells in the bone marrow. Additionally, she explained the Enzyme-Linked Immunosorbent Assay (ELISA) method, a laboratory technique used to assess the prevalence of pathogens in a population through serum and plasma samples. This research is expected to contribute to reducing infectious disease risks at the population level, fostering communication with local governments, and opening avenues for multidisciplinary collaboration. The guest lecture concluded with an interactive discussion session, where participants engaged in a dynamic exchange of questions and ideas, which Dr. Whitney addressed directly.

One of the most rewarding aspects of being an IO volunteer is early exposure to internationalization activities, which has broadened my understanding of global engagement. Events like international seminars, networking sessions, and the Scholarship Clinic have provided insights into the steps needed to pursue studies abroad. This early awareness helps me prepare for future opportunities, ensuring I am ready when the right moment comes.

Joining the IO has been one of my best decisions. The experience, knowledge, and connections I have gained are invaluable. My fellow volunteers inspire me, the staff members possess remarkable skills, and the friendships I've built with international students make this journey extraordinary.
