UNHAS-KANAZAWA SUMMER PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS GEODIVERSITY, BIODIVERSITY, AND CULTURAL HERITAGE



Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), through the International Office (IO), is currently hosting the UNHAS-Kanazawa University (UNHAS KU) Summer Program from 31 August to 13 September 2025. The program carries the theme *Integrating Geodiversity, Biodiversity, and Cultural Heritage* and takes place across several regions in South Sulawesi, including Makassar, Maros, Bantaeng, and Bulukumba.

The opening ceremony was held on Monday, 1 September 2025, at the 3rd Floor of the Institute of Research and Community Services (LP2M), UNHAS. It was officially opened by Prof. Jamaluddin Jompa (Rector of UNHAS) and attended by Prof. Sumbangan Baja (UNHAS Secretary), Prof. Suharman Hamzah (LP2M Secretary), facilitators, and the IO Squad Team. The facilitators involved are experts in geodiversity, biodiversity, and cultural heritage, providing students with comprehensive academic and cultural perspectives.

The first part of the program consisted of six-day classroom sessions at UNHAS Tamalanrea Campus, complemented by field trips to Leang-Leang and Rammang-Rammang in Maros Regency. Participants also experienced a Phinisi boat dinner cruise around Makassar Strait, allowing them to enjoy the cultural and maritime heritage of South Sulawesi. The program involved 8 participants from Kanazawa University and 12 from UNHAS, encouraging meaningful cross-cultural interactions.

Following the classroom and field activities in Makassar and Maros, the group continued their journey to Bantaeng Regency. Here, students joined a homestay program with local families, providing them with the opportunity to learn about intercultural values and daily life in South Sulawesi. Activities included school and public health facility visits, as well as observations of seaweed and seagrass cultivation—important aspects of local livelihoods.

The program will conclude in Bulukumba Regency, where participants will join the closing ceremony before returning home. Prior to their departure, they will enjoy the renowned white sandy beaches of Bira, a fitting finale to their immersive academic and cultural journey.



As a pilot project between UNHAS and Kanazawa University, the Summer Program is expected to continue and expand in the coming years. With positive impressions and valuable experiences, KU students are likely to encourage more of their peers to take part in future programs in Indonesia, particularly in Makassar, strengthening academic cooperation and cultural understanding between the two universities.





INBOUND STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM CONNECTS ERASMUS UNIVERSITY ROTTERDAM AND HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY



The Faculty of Medicine (FK), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), has introduced an inbound student program in collaboration with the Faculty of Medicine, Erasmus University Rotterdam, the Netherlands. The program welcomes three Erasmus students for six weeks of academic and clinical activities. They will attend classes at FK UNHAS and rotate through several departments, including Internal Medicine, Pulmonology, Obstetrics and Gynecology, Dermatology, Pediatrics, and Ophthalmology, with a focus on infectious and tropical diseases. Clinical exposure is also provided through affiliated hospitals and *Pusat Kesehatan Masyarakat (Puskesmas)* or Community Health Centers.

As part of their immersion in Indonesia's healthcare system, the students are assigned to *puskesmas* to study primary healthcare services and observe community-based practices. They also visit Bulukumba Local Hospital, a partner of FK UNHAS, to learn about regional health services and tropical diseases specific to the area. These experiences provide a balanced perspective on both frontline and regional healthcare, allowing them to observe examinations, treatments, and health management in different settings.

The program is supervised by Dr. Erlangga from Erasmus University Rotterdam, who stressed its value in expanding students' medical knowledge and global outlook. Prof. Dr. Rina Masadah, Sp.PA(K), M.Phil, DFM, Vice Dean for Publication, Community Engagement, and International Affairs at FK UNHAS, underlined that such initiatives strengthen international collaboration and elevate UNHAS' global reputation. This partnership is expected to enhance academic ties between the two institutions while enriching cross-cultural experiences for all participants.

HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY AND KYUSHU UNIVERSITY EXPLORE FUTURE RESEARCH COLLABORATION



Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), through the Faculty of Mathematics and Natural Sciences (FMIPA), welcomed a delegation from Kyushu University, Japan, to explore potential academic and research collaborations. The meeting was held on Thursday, 18 September 2025 and took place at the Senate Meeting Room, Science Building, UNHAS, and marked an important step toward strengthening international research partnerships.

The session was opened by Dr. Khaeruddin, M.Sc., Vice Dean for Academic Affairs and Student Affairs, who also served as moderator. A welcome address was delivered by Dr. Muh. Alimuddin Hamzah, M.Eng., Vice Dean for Partnership, Research, Innovation, and Alumni, on behalf of the Dean of FMIPA. Faculty leaders including Dr. Firman, M.Si. (Head of the Department of Mathematics), Dr. Anna Islamiyati, M.Si. (Head of the Department of Statistics), Dr. Magdalena Litaay, M. Sc. (Head of the Department of Biology), and Prof. Dr. Syamsuddin Toaha, M.Sc. (Head of the Doctoral Program in Mathematics) also attended the discussion.

From the UNHAS research community, Prof. Arwin Lawi and Andi Risang Qinthar Latunra, S.S., M.Hum. shared their academic insights. Risang presented his recent study on emotion estimation from video and sound, using film-based datasets collected from YouTube.

The Kyushu University delegation was represented by Prof. Gerard B. Remijn, Head of the Perceptual Psychology Laboratory, Department of Acoustic Design, Faculty of Design, and Assoc. Prof. Fumihiko Yokota, Research Promotion Coordinator and Epidemiologist. Prof. Remijn also highlighted past research conducted by his Indonesian doctoral students, showcasing the depth of Kyushu University's international collaborations.

The meeting centered on opportunities for joint research in the field of sound and image characterization for emotion identification. Both universities recognized the importance of developing high-quality speech and sound datasets in the Indonesian language, given its large number of speakers and its unique linguistic features, which remain underexplored in acoustic and perception studies.

In addition to joint research, both parties discussed possibilities for joint supervision of Master's and Doctoral students, exchange programs, and collaborative publications. Prof. Remijn also extended an open invitation for UNHAS graduate students interested in pursuing doctoral studies at Kyushu University.

Looking ahead, UNHAS and Kyushu University plan to pursue collaborative funding schemes. From the Indonesian side, Prof. Arwin Lawi emphasized the potential of the Indonesian Collaborative Research or *Riset Kolaborasi Indonesia* (RKI) scheme, while Kyushu University representatives suggested exploring opportunities through JSPS (Japan Society for the Promotion of Science) and SATREPS (Science and Technology Research Partnership for Sustainable Development).




The discussion concluded with an exchange of tokens of appreciation and a group photo, reflecting the shared enthusiasm for building stronger academic and cultural ties between Indonesia and Japan.

This meeting not only strengthened UNHAS's international partnerships but also opened new opportunities for faculty and students to engage in impactful, cross-border research. Both universities expressed optimism that the collaboration will contribute to advancing science, and enriching student learning experiences.





FKG UNHAS KICKS OFF 2025/2026 WITH GLOBAL EXPERT LECTURE SERIES



The Faculty of Dentistry (FKG), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), organizes international expert lectures every semester. For the 2025/2026 academic year, the program began with a session in the Study Skills, IT, and MP block, delivered by Ananda Senel, M.A., from Oxford University Press, United Kingdom.

This inaugural lecture marks the start of a series of guest lectures featuring speakers from at least seven countries, including the UK, Taiwan, Japan, China, Malaysia, India, Australia, and Romania. A total of 11 universities are participating in this collaborative initiative, enriching the academic experience through diverse global perspectives.

The program is a mandatory component for 13 international class blocks and will run until December 2025. Through this initiative, FKG UNHAS continues to enhance its internationalization agenda, providing students with broader academic insights and cross-cultural learning opportunities.

FKM UNHAS SUPPORTS STUDENTS AND LECTURERS TO PARTICIPATE IN IB OHSEM 2025 IN SABAH



MALAYSIA – The Faculty of Public Health (FKM), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) has once again demonstrated its commitment to supporting the capacity building of students and lecturers at the international level. This is demonstrated by the active participation of FKM UNHAS in the 3rd International Borneo One Health Summer Camp (IB OHSeM 2025) which will take place from August 31 to September 8, 2025 in Sabah, Malaysia.

In this international event, FKM UNHAS sent two representatives, namely Langkar Diyang Fauzi Rachman, a student of the Public Health Undergraduate Program, and Andi Mufliha Darwis, SKM., M.Kes., a lecturer at FKM UNHAS who also participated as an accompanying person.

Their presence received full support from the Dean of the FKM UNHAS, Prof. Sukri Palutturi, SKM., M.Kes., MScPH, Ph.D. “The participation of students and lecturers from FKM at UNHAS in international forums such as this is very important. Not only do they learn about global issues related to planetary health, but they also hone their leadership, cross-cultural communication, and international collaboration skills,” said Prof. Sukri on Wednesday (10/9).

With the theme “Planetary Health Future Leaders: Essential Leadership Skills to Tackle the Triple Planetary Health Crisis,” IB OHSeM 2025 was attended by 31 participants from six countries, namely the Philippines, Vietnam, Malaysia, Indonesia, Brunei, and Bangladesh.

During the activity, participants gained comprehensive experience ranging from wildlife conservation in Sandakan, community service in *Kampung Tinusa 2 and Kampung Cinta Mata*, to intensive discussions on climate change, biodiversity, pollution, and planetary health issues in Kota Kinabalu.

For FKM UNHAS students, this experience is a valuable opportunity to broaden their global perspective. “Learning firsthand about global health issues from an international perspective has greatly broadened my outlook. Moreover, interacting with participants from various countries has shown me that cross-disciplinary and cross-border collaboration is key to addressing future health challenges,” said Langkar.

Meanwhile, Dr. Zulkhairul Naim Bin Sidek Ahmad, Chair of the IB OHSeM 2025 Committee, emphasized that the main objective of this activity is to equip the younger generation with leadership skills to deal with dual planetary crises, ranging from climate to the environment. Through its involvement in this program, FKM UNHAS hopes to continue encouraging the emergence of young leaders who are competent, globally minded, and capable of making real contributions to sustainable development.





THE FACULTY OF ECONOMICS AND BUSINESS UNHAS WELCOMED A VISIT FROM REPRESENTATIVES OF THE BRITISH COUNCIL



The Faculty of Economics and Business (FEB), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) welcomed a visit from representatives of the British Council on Monday, 29 September 2025. The meeting aimed to gain a deeper understanding of the economic landscape of South Sulawesi and to hear directly from stakeholders most familiar with the region's developments and challenges. The representatives from the British Council emphasized their interest in learning more about current economic priorities, ongoing local initiatives, and potential areas for cooperation that could foster sustainable growth. Meanwhile, FEB UNHAS highlighted several strategic issues, ranging from strengthening key sectors such as agriculture, fisheries, and tourism, to addressing challenges related to regional disparities, the need for skilled human resources, and the importance of innovation and digital transformation in the economy.

From this exchange, a mutual understanding emerged on the importance of research collaboration as a concrete form of partnership between the British Council and FEB UNHAS. Such collaboration is expected to generate relevant studies to support policymaking and enrich perspectives on regional economic development. Both parties recognized the need for joint efforts to ensure that academic insights can translate into impactful contributions for addressing local and regional challenges.

In addition, FEB UNHAS extended an invitation to the British Council and its university partners to participate in the ICAME 2025 Conference, which will take place in November in Malaysia. This year's conference theme is highly relevant to the agenda discussed, providing an excellent platform to broaden networks and exchange ideas at both regional and global levels. The conference is expected to open new opportunities for dialogue, foster stronger institutional partnerships, and support initiatives that contribute to sustainable economic growth in South Sulawesi and beyond.



FACULTY OF VOCATIONAL OF UNHAS HOLDS INTERNATIONAL SEMINAR ON THE INNOVATIVE ROLE OF APPLIED BACHELOR OF DENTAL THERAPY



The Applied Bachelor of Dental Therapy Study Program, Faculty of Vocational Studies (FV), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), organized an international seminar themed “*Enhancing the Role of Dental Therapist in the Era of Innovation and Technology.*” The event took place at the Scientific Meeting Hall, Vocational Faculty, on Friday, September 26, 2025.

The seminar was officially opened by the Vice Dean for Academic and Student Affairs, Prof. Dr. Ida Leida. In her remarks, Prof. Ida highlighted the importance of this seminar as a platform to enhance knowledge, skills, and innovation for dental therapists by drawing on international perspectives. Prof. Ida also expressed her hope that this event would strengthen national and international collaborations among students, educators, and practitioners. The organizing committee chair, Nur Aedah AR, S.Tr.Kes., M.KG., delivered the activity report, followed by a speech from the Head of Study Program, Drg. Zilal Islamy Paramma, Sp.Ort., Subsp.DDTK(K).

In the first session, the seminar featured two international speakers: Ms. Fatimah Rahman, who presented *"The Role of Dental Therapist in Global Oral Health,"* and Ms. Jeevaretnam A/P Sockalingam, who spoke on *"The Challenge of Dental Therapist Career Abroad."* The session was moderated by Muh. Firdaus Tullah, S.Tr.Kes., M.Tr.TGM.


The second session presented national speakers: Dr. Bambang Sutomo, with the topic *"National Policy and the Strategic Role of the Collegium in Ensuring the Quality of Higher Health Education,"* and Yonan Heriyanto, with the topic *"Head of Indonesian Dental Health Institution in Higher Education."* The session was moderated by Ainun Ayu Yuniar. Through this event, the Faculty of Vocational Studies at UNHAS hopes to generate breakthroughs in strengthening the role of applied bachelor graduates in dental therapy, while also paving the way for greater contributions of dental therapists on the global stage.

The seminar, held in collaboration with the Ministry of Health, was attended by 408 online participants and 232 onsite participants, consisting of dental and oral therapy practitioners, lecturers, and students from various regions.





STRENGTHENING GLOBAL TIES: FKG UNHAS INITIATES COLLABORATION WITH KMCT DENTAL COLLEGE, INDIA



Following the UNHAS team's visit to India in early 2025, the Faculty of Dentistry (FKG), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) officially initiated an academic collaboration with Kunhitharuvai Memorial Charitable Trust (KMCT) Dental College, India. The partnership marks a new chapter in expanding international cooperation within the dental sciences. KMCT Dental College, which operates under one of the largest educational institutions in Kerala, India, shares a strong commitment to academic excellence and innovation. This shared vision forms a solid foundation for future collaboration between the two institutions.

A recent Zoom meeting held on Monday, 29 September 2025, brought together key representatives from both sides, including the Vice Dean for Academic and Student Affairs, the Vice Dean for Partnership, Research, and Innovation, the Head of the Undergraduate Study Program, and representatives from 12 study programs within FKG UNHAS. The discussion focused on concrete next steps, including organizing expert lectures from both faculties, conducting online webinars for each study program, and preparing for joint research initiatives.

EARLY MOBILIZATION AND LOCOMOTIVE SYNDROME HIGHLIGHTED IN GUEST LECTURE AT UNHAS



The Department of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, Faculty of Medicine, Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), once again held an international scientific event in the form of a guest lecture. The event featured Prof. Yukio Mikami, MD, PhD, Professor of the Department of Rehabilitation Medicine and Associate Director of Hiroshima University Hospital, as well as a member of The Japanese Association of Rehabilitation Medicine.

The guest lecture, which carried the themes *“Early Mobilization in Acute Phase Rehabilitation Setting”* and *“Locomotive Syndrome”*, took place on Tuesday, 9 September 2025, from 10:00 to 12:30 CIT at Prof. Misbahuddin Adnan Auditorium, Faculty of Medicine, UNHAS. In his presentation, Prof. Mikami emphasized the importance of early mobilization immediately after injury or post-surgery, with thorough assessment to ensure patient safety. According to him, early mobilization provides many benefits, including improving body function and quality of life—benefits that cannot be achieved if patients are left on total bed rest. He even described physical exercise as one of the “best medicines” for patients.

In addition, Prof. Mikami discussed the concept of Locomotive Syndrome (Locomo), namely the decline in mobility due to dysfunction of locomotive organs such as bones, joints, muscles, and the nervous system. Introduced in Japan in 2007, this concept emerged as a response to the growing elderly population. Prof. Mikami stressed the importance of community-based early detection and the role of physical exercise, both to prevent healthy individuals from developing Locomo and to keep Locomo patients from progressing to more severe stages that require intensive care.

This activity is also part of ongoing collaboration between the Department of Rehabilitation Medicine, Faculty of Medicine, UNHAS, and Hiroshima University, which has been established since 2024. The collaboration includes visiting lectures, resident exchange, and faculty staff exchange, aiming to strengthen academic networks and enhance the quality of education and rehabilitation medicine services in both institutions.

The event was also attended by the Vice Dean for Publication, Community Service, and International Affairs of the Faculty of Medicine, UNHAS, Prof. Dr. Rina Masadah, Sp.PA., M.Phil., DFM; Head of the Department of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, Dr. Husnul Mubarak, Sp.KFR, NM(K), FEMG; and Head of the Study Program in Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, Dr. Yose Waluyo, Sp.KFR, MS(K). Faculty staff, residents, and participants from various related fields were also present.

The activity concluded with an interactive discussion session that was met with great enthusiasm, reflecting the significance and relevance of early mobilization and locomotive syndrome, particularly in advancing medical services in Indonesia.



UPM MALAYSIA STRENGTHENS COLLABORATION WITH HASANUDDIN UNIVERSITY'S MATHEMATICS AND STATISTICS DEPARTMENTS



Faculty of Mathematics and Natural Sciences (FMIPA), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) welcomed a delegation from the Department of Mathematics and Statistics, Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM) as part of a student inbound and academic collaboration program held from 31 August to 6 September 2025.

UPM, which ranks 134th in the world according to the QS World University Rankings 2026, included both faculty leaders and students in the delegation, consisting of 22 students and 11 faculty members. They were received by the Vice-Rector for Partnerships, Innovation, Entrepreneurship, and Business, Prof. Dr. Eng. Adi Maulana, S.T., M.Phil., together with FMIPA Dean Prof. Dr. Sci. Muhammad Zakir, S.Si., M.Si., Faculty's Professor, and department heads.

The program included joint lectures, curriculum and research meetings, as well as the UNHAS-UPM Joint Symposium on Mathematics and Statistics and Their Applications. In addition, students presented research proposals, participated in cultural activities under the theme "Sembang Budaya Serumpun", and engaged in community service through a tree-planting activity at Pantai Bosowa.

In his remarks, Prof. Adi Maulana highlighted that the collaboration represented not only academic strengthening but also the establishment of long-term partnerships that expand research networks and enrich student experiences. The Dean of FMIPA, Prof. Muhammad Zakir, explained that after the initial discussions in 2024, this stage marked concrete implementation expected to produce joint research, scientific publications, and enhanced academic capacity.


From the UPM delegation, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Siti Hasana Sapar, Deputy Dean of the Faculty of Science, noted that the partnership was not limited to research collaboration but also served to build lasting connections between students and faculty of both universities. Another lecture was a presentation of UNHAS Overview by the International Office (IO) represented by Muhammad Ridwan, M.A. (IO Secretary), well known as Ridho. He explained UNHAS including its campuses and its hotwire. A part of his presentation, Mr Ridho, also described the support services for international students undergoing their study at UNHAS. He closed his presentation by thanking the host and congratulated the inbound students joining the program.

The visit concluded on 6 September 2025, with both universities reaffirming their commitment to advancing joint research, academic exchanges, and cultural ties.





FACULTY OF PUBLIC HEALTH DELEGATION TO INTERNATIONAL BORNEO ONE HEALTH SUMMER CAMP 2025 KICKS OFF ONLINE



On 23-24 August 2025, students, academics, and health professionals from various countries including Indonesia gathered online to launch the 3rd International Borneo One Health Summer Camp (IB OHSem 2025). This initiative served as a precursor to in-person meetings at Universiti Malaysia Sabah from August 31 to September 8, 2025, focusing on the theme “Planetary Health Future Leaders: Essential Leadership Skills to Tackle the Triple Planetary Health Crisis.”

With a focus on climate change, biodiversity loss, and pollution, IB OHSem 2025 aims to cultivate young leaders equipped to tackle these pressing issues. The event is designed to empower participants with essential leadership skills that will prepare them for the challenges of planetary health.

Over two days, participants in the Faculty of Public Health, Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) also engaged with insights from more than ten international experts, exploring the connections between human, animal, and environmental health within the One Health framework. Topics ranged from the impact of climate change on infectious diseases in Southeast Asia to the long-term effects of pollution on reproductive health.


Datuk Dr. Mohd. Yusof Hj. Ibrahim, Dean of the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences at the University of Malaysia Sabah, highlighted the significance of the event as a platform for nurturing ethical and interdisciplinary future leaders committed to environmental sustainability. He emphasized the importance of collaboration across borders to effectively address these global challenges.

Key sessions included Dr. Trixie Marjorie Tangit discussing the integration of ancestral wisdom with modern innovation, while Prof. Ts. Dr. Muhammad Lokman Md Isa examined the concept of One Health and the critical role of biodiversity conservation. The dangers of climate change were addressed by Dr. Siti Aisah Mokhtar, who linked climate issues to the spread of diseases like dengue and malaria.

In addition, the event introduced the concept of adaptive leadership and the innovative use of technology, such as Prosocial AI for Planetary Health, as tools for achieving sustainability. These discussions provided participants with a well-rounded understanding of the intersection between technology and health.

In his closing remarks, Prof. Sukri Palutturi, Dean of the Faculty of Public Health at UNHAS, emphasized that the lessons learned should inspire participants to be active custodians of planetary health. He expressed gratitude to all involved, acknowledging the spirit of collaboration that defined the event.

As IB OHSeM 2025 transitions to face-to-face sessions in Sabah, it lays the groundwork for future leaders who are globally competitive and dedicated to sustainability. The event's collaborative efforts reflect a united stance in addressing planetary health crises through education and action.



STRENGTHENING TIES THROUGH PUBLIC DIPLOMACY: UNHAS HOSTS CONSUL GENERAL OF KOREA



On 6 September 2025, the Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) Faculty of Cultural Sciences (FIB) held a public lecture on the theme “Public Diplomacy: Building Bridges between Two Nations” delivered by Mr. Kang Wongjoon, Consul General of the Republic of Korea. In his lecture, Mr. Kang highlighted the importance of utilizing popular public figures as a medium of diplomacy, citing examples such as Shin Tae Yong, the former head coach of Indonesia’s national football team, and Megawati, a volleyball player who has recently gained popularity in Korea.

Mr. Kang was accompanied on this visit by Mr. Le Hangsoon, Director of the Korean Foundation. Their arrival was warmly welcomed by the Dean of the Faculty of Cultural Sciences, Prof. Dr. Andi Muhammad Akhmar, along with the Vice Dean for Partnership, Research, Innovation, and Alumni Affairs, Dr. Wahyuddin, M. Hum. The event reflected the spirit of cultural exchange and the strengthening of relations between Indonesia and Korea.

Prior to the lecture, discussions were held regarding potential collaboration between Korea and the Faculty of Cultural Sciences, particularly focusing on the establishment of a Korean Language Study Program at UNHAS. At present, Korean language is offered only as an elective course in several study programs at the Faculty. The session also involved Mr. Muhammad Syahrums from the Korean Corner, who served as interpreter throughout the event.



FROM CHOPSTICKS TO YUKATA: UNHAS STUDENTS DELVE INTO JAPANESE CULTURE

This workshop is a key part of a larger initiative by the department, which is celebrating its 20th anniversary. It is one of 14 events scheduled for 2025, organized with support from the Eurasia Foundation. This international collaboration reflects UNHAS' commitment to global academic exchange and the importance of cross-cultural understanding in higher education.

The ultimate goal of such programs is to prepare students to be more than just language experts. By teaching crucial social skills, the department aims to develop them into globally competitive cultural ambassadors who can effectively bridge communication between Indonesia and Japan, where etiquette is a vital part of professional and social identity.

The Department of Chemistry, Faculty of Mathematics and Natural Sciences (FMIPA), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) successfully held the International Seminar on Natural Product Chemistry (ISNPC) 2025 with the theme "Natural Resources Biotechnology: From Local to Global for Sustainable Life." The event took place on 11–12 September 2025 at the UNHAS Hotel and Convention, Makassar. ISNPC 2025 featured scientific discussions across various topics in natural product chemistry, ranging from extraction and bioactivity testing to chemical ecology, medical chemistry, computational approaches, biomaterials, pharmacognosy, biotechnology, and industrial applications.

The seminar presented distinguished keynote speakers, including Prof. Teruna J. Siahaan, Ph.D. from the University of Kansas, USA; Dr. Tan Lik Tong from Nanyang Technological University, Singapore; Prof. Dr. Jalifah Latip from Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia, Malaysia; Prof. Dr. Nunuk Hariani Soekamto, M.S. from UNHAS; and Prof. Muhammad Aswad, M.Si., Ph.D., Apt. from UNHAS, Indonesia. This year's seminar attracted 166 participants, consisting of 102 oral presenters, 28 poster presenters, 23 virtual presenters, and 16 general participants, representing both domestic and international institutions.

As part of its program, ISNPC 2025 was also held in conjunction with the Congress of the Indonesian Natural Product Chemistry Association (HKBAI), further strengthening collaboration among researchers and practitioners. In addition, participants were welcomed with a special dinner hosted at the Makassar Mayor's Hall, providing an opportunity to promote cultural and academic exchange. 
Following the conclusion, the participants will return to Makassar, while students from Kanazawa University will directly proceed to Sultan Hasanuddin International Airport for their departure.








KAMISHIBAI AND THE JAPANESE WAR: INSIGHTS FROM INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARS AT UNHAS





THE UNIVERSITY OF QUEENSLAND GRANT PROPOSAL WORKSHOPS

Unlocking Research Funding: A Practical Workshop on Grant Writing



The University of Queensland (UQ), Australia, hosted a knowledge-sharing session titled “*Finding the Right Funding Opportunity*” on Monday, 22 September 2025, engaging representatives from universities across Southeast Asia, including Hassanuddin University (UNHAS). Some faculty members as well as the International office (IO) UNHAS staff attended this event. The IO was represented by Andi Masyitha Irwan.,Ph.D. (The Head of IO), Muhammad Ridwan, M.A. (the secretary of IO), Saaduddin.,Ph.D., Khaeruddin.,Ph.D and Haniek Khoirunnisha Baja, M.Sc (IO task forces). The session was facilitated by Maddy Devaney and Riley Moran from the UQ Research Office, who provided hands-on guidance to help institutions and researchers strategically position themselves for international research funding.

The session highlighted a variety of funding schemes, including NHMRC e-Asia Joint Research Program, Wellcome Discovery Awards, and bilateral programs such as Australia-Vietnam Strategic Technologies Centre (AVSTC), Aus4Innovation, and KONEKSI Australia-Indonesia. These programs support collaboration in areas ranging from infectious diseases and health research to sustainable energy, artificial intelligence, climate resilience, and strategic technologies.

Speakers emphasized the importance of aligning research goals with funders' missions. For instance, NHMRC e-Asia aims to promote innovation in East Asia and build a healthy Australia, while the Wellcome Trust focuses on bold, interdisciplinary projects improving human health and well-being globally. Participants were encouraged to reflect on their institutional capacity, identify gaps, and create action plans for strengthening research competitiveness. Suggestions included inviting international experts as collaborators, investing in capacity building, and setting short- and long-term goals (1, 3, and 5 years).

The UQ Research Office also shared practical tools to support researchers: Choosing the right grant: checking eligibility, feasibility, timelines, and alignment with research goals. Building synergies: leveraging shared regional challenges such as tropical climates, marine ecosystems, agricultural systems, vector-borne diseases, renewable energy, and disaster resilience, which provide fertile ground for collaboration between Queensland and Southeast Asia. Expanding opportunities: exploring not only government schemes, but also industry partnerships, foundations, NGOs, international and regional programs, and professional associations.

The session further underlined critical success factors for securing funding: being at the right career stage, finding suitable partners, and dedicating sufficient time for preparation. By applying these strategies, Southeast Asian universities can enhance their research impact and strengthen collaborations with global partners such as UQ. This initiative reflects UQ's strong commitment to building equitable partnerships with Southeast Asian institutions, ensuring researchers across the region gain access to resources and networks that enable world-class, impactful research.

DUAL SUCCESS AWAITS: 13 UNHAS STUDENTS PURSUE 2+2 JOINT DEGREE IN CHINA



On Friday, 19 September 2025, the Mandarin Language and Chinese Culture Study Program, Faculty of Cultural Sciences (FIB), Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), held a send-off ceremony for 13 students from the 2023 cohort departing for China to participate in the 2+2 joint degree program between UNHAS and Nanchang University.

The event was officially opened by Dr. Ansariadi (Director of Partnership) and attended by Dr. Februadi Bastian (Head of Subdirectorate of International Class Management), Muhammad Ridwan, M.A. (International Office Secretary), Dian Sari Unga Waru, M.A. (Head of UNHAS Mandarin Study Program), the person in charge of the Confucius Institute, the CEO of PT. NISCO Morowali, as well as lecturers from the Mandarin Language and Chinese Culture Program and the Faculty of Cultural Sciences.

The 13 students successfully passed a rigorous selection process, requiring them to achieve a minimum of *Hànyǔ Shuǐpíng Kǎoshì* (HSK) or 汉语水平考试 Level 4 proficiency in Mandarin and maintain a minimum grade of “B” across their first four semesters. Through this achievement, they earned scholarships to continue their undergraduate studies for two years at Nanchang University. Upon completing their studies, thesis, and graduation at Nanchang University, the students will return to UNHAS to complete their final graduation ceremony. Through this 2+2 program, they will receive dual undergraduate degrees—one from Nanchang University and one from UNHAS.

UNHAS HOLDS ORIENTATION FOR 138 NEW INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS FROM 22 COUNTRIES



Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), through its International Office (IO), organized the International Student Orientation (ISO) for newly admitted international students of the 2025 intake. The opening session took place at the Institute for Research and Community Service (LPPM) Auditorium of UNHAS on Thursday, 4 September 2025. The orientation was mandatory for all new international students as it provided essential information related to UNHAS' academic regulations as well as immigration requirements of the Republic of Indonesia.

For the academic year 2025/2026, UNHAS has admitted a total of 138 international students from 22 different countries. At the opening session, 48 students were in attendance, while the remaining students were still in the process of obtaining visas and completing travel administration. Representing the Rector of UNHAS, in his remarks the University Secretary, Prof. Ir. Sumbangan Baja, M.Phil., Ph.D., emphasized that the growing number of international students reflects global recognition of UNHAS' reputation. He expressed his hope that students will be able to adapt well while at the same time learning about Indonesia's cultural diversity, particularly the culture of Makassar.

The new international students are distributed across a wide range of academic fields, from science and technology, health, social humanities, to agriculture. Among the study programs chosen are Architecture, Nursing, Medicine, Information Systems, Management, Agriculture, Fisheries, and Cultural Sciences. This distribution demonstrates that UNHAS is increasingly trusted as a multidisciplinary study destination, not only in health-related programs but also in engineering, economics, and the social sciences.

The orientation featured several presentations. The Head of IO, Dr. A. Masyitha Irwan, delivered a session on support services provided by IO. The Secretary of IO, Muhammad Ridwan, explained about health insurance. Prof. Risma Illa Maulany, Director of Academic Affairs, discussed academic regulations, scholarship schemes, and the integrity pact. Dr. Abdullah Sanusi, Director of Student Affairs, presented on student unions and student affairs regulations. Meanwhile, Dr. Saaduddin, a member of IO Task Force, spoke on immigration regulations and ITAS extension procedures.

The new international students joining UNHAS in 2025 come from 22 countries. At the undergraduate level, they represent nations such as Timor Leste, Pakistan, China, Nigeria, Yemen, India, Madagascar, and Swaziland. At the master's level, students hail from Timor Leste, China, Pakistan, Iraq, Sierra Leone, Madagascar, Libya, Palestine, and Germany. International students at the doctoral level come from Timor Leste, China, Pakistan, Nigeria, Japan, Saudi Arabia, and Lebanon. In addition, non-degree students come from China and the Netherlands. Through the Developing Countries Partnership Scholarship (KNB) for Indonesian Language (BIPA), students also arrived from Bangladesh, Liberia, Somalia, Tanzania, Uganda, Pakistan, and Nigeria.

This program is expected to serve as an initial step for international students to become more familiar with the academic environment and culture of UNHAS while also expanding their international networks. UNHAS is committed to supporting these students to adapt, excel, and contribute to strengthening the image of UNHAS as a world-class university.





UNHAS INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS FESTIVAL 2025: UNITING GLOBAL CULTURE IN ONE CELEBRATION



Hasanuddin University (UNHAS), through the International Office (IO) successfully hosted the 3rd International Students Festival (ISF) on Sunday, 7 September 2025, at JK Arenatorium, Tamalanrea Campus. Harniati (Head of the Foreign Affairs Division), Haniek Khoirunnissa Baja, M.Sc. (Chair of the Committee), Khairuddin, Ph.D. (IO Task Force), and other staff members. Representatives from IDP Australia and UNSW delivered presentations on academic opportunities at UNSW, which attracted strong interest from participants eager to explore future study options abroad.

Currently, many UNHAS lecturers have pursued graduate studies at leading Australian universities such as Curtin University, the University of Newcastle, the University of Melbourne, the University of Queensland, James Cook University, and the University of Technology Sydney. However, none have yet graduated from UNSW. This session was therefore seen as a valuable opportunity for UNHAS academics to consider UNSW as their destination for further studies. The event concluded with a token exchange and a group photo session.

The FGD concluded with a pleasant gathering where participants enjoyed traditional Palembang cuisine, “Mpek-Mpek,” reflecting the spirit of collaboration and cultural appreciation that also underpins UNHAS’s international programs.

The Directorate for Reputation Enhancement of Hasanuddin University (UNHAS) recently organized a Focus Group Discussion (FGD) focusing on the identification of EQUITY programs, a scheme funded by the Indonesia Endowment Fund for Education (LPDP), that will soon be implemented. Led by the Director of Reputation Enhancement, Prof. Rohani Ambo Rappe, Ph.D., the FGD took place on Sunday, 21 September 2025, at the Innovate Room, UNHAS Hotel and Convention, Tamalanrea campus.

The discussion brought together various implementing units of EQUITY-related activities, including the Institute for Research and Community Service (LP2M), the International Office (IO), the Publication Management Center (PMC), the Directorate of Alumni Affairs and the Directorate of Reputation Enhancement team itself. Each unit shared insights and identified priority programs that could be carried out in the near future.

One of the important points addressed in the FGD was the disbursement mechanism of EQUITY funds. It was agreed that the funding, provided through LPDP, would be divided into two phases: 80% for the initial disbursement and 20% for the second. This approach is expected to support financial efficiency and ensure the effective execution of the programs.

Furthermore, the Reputation Enhancement team urged the implementing units to promptly identify programs that are ready for execution. They also emphasized the preparation of all required documents to ensure a smooth fund disbursement process. The FGD served as a key step in aligning EQUITY program implementation with the broader goal of strengthening UNHAS's institutional reputation.
