<p><b>Study and examination requirements and forms of examination</b></p>	<p><b>Study and examination requirements:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Students must be present 15 minutes before the activity begins, if students are late, they are required to report to the supervisor.</li> <li>- The presence of students during management Nursing Practice must be 100%</li> <li>- Students are not allowed to leave practice site except with the permission of the supervisor</li> <li>- All the assignments and log book must be collected maximum of 1 week after the nursing management practice takes place.
